Left parties stage 'dharna' condemning use of central forces against adivasis

Kakinada, Jan 13 (UNI) :Left parties, Revolutionary parties, Dalit and adivasis sangh staged a 'dharna' in front of the Collectorate here on Thursday condemning the central government's action against the adivasis.

They denounced the government for virtually declaring war against the adivasis in the name of rounding up the Naxalites.They blamed the government for implementation of the 'Operation Kagaar' for vesting the forest wealth to the capitalists.

Leaders of CPI, CPM, CPI(ML) New Democracy, IFTU, AIKMS addressed the demonstrators.

They criticized the government for treating the Naxalite movement as a law and order problem instead of considering it as a social, financial and political issue.They made it clear that Naxalites problem would not be solved unless the problems of unemployment and poverty are solved.

They demanded immediate stoppage of operation Kagaar and provide rights on forest wealth only to adivasis.

Waqf JPC report: Oppn walks out of Lok Sabha alleging dissent notes not included

New Delhi, Feb 13 (UNI) The Opposition on Thursday created a ruckus and walked out of the Lok Sabha, alleging that dissent notes have not been included in the report of the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) on the Waqf Amendment Bill, that was tabled in the house.

As soon as the JPC Chairman Jagdambika Pal tabled the panel's report on the table of the house, the Opposition members created a ruckus. Meanwhile, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said, "Some Opposition members have raised concern that their views have not been included completely in the report. I want to say on behalf of my party that taking into consideration the concerns of the Opposition, I request you to add whatever disputes there are, as per the appropriate form of parliamentary functioning."

CM sets 20 pc growth rate in Tourism sector

Vijayawada, Jan 13 : Directing the officials of the Tourism Department to take all possible measures to see to it that the tourists who are on their visit to Andhra Pradesh should feel happy, Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday told them to utilise all available resources to develop tourism in the state to attract tourists from across the globe.

Setting a target of 20 per cent growth rate in the tourism sector in 2025-26, the Chief Minister said that within six months of the TDP-led NDA coming to power MoUs have been signed with various companies regarding investments worth Rs 1,217 crore.

The Chief Minister held a review meeting at the State Secretariat here on tourism

events, cultural events, construction of hotel rooms, investments, land lease policy and homestays.

Informing the meeting that 11 tourism resorts and hotels have been revived with an investment of Rs 45 crore in these six months, Chandrababu said that Annaram temple has been selected under PRASAD scheme of the Centre, under Special Assistance to States under Capital Investment (SASCI) scheme Gandikota and Akhanda Godavari are selected while Araku and Lambasingi under Swadesh Darshan-2.0 along with Ahobilam and Nagarjuna Sagar under the Challenge-Based Destination Development scheme.

The officials told the Chief Minister that a Tourism Events Calendar is being designed for 2025-26

to attract tourists. As part of this programme, two key international events and 12 mega events are being organised as part of 37 tourism events, they informed the Chief Minister.

Chandrababu suggested that mega events and key events can be organised on university campuses while musical culture can be integrated with events.

Chandrababu is very particular that year-long programmes can be organised at the Shilparamam of

Visakhapatnam, Amaravati and Tirupati. He also told the officers to exercise on distribution of Nandi Awards.

Gandikota is famous in the country for water, rock formations and extensive greenery, he said and wanted it to be promoted further to attract tourists.

The Kadapa Dargah and the Vontimitta Ramalayam along with Somasila areas too should be developed as tourist destinations, the Chief Minister said and stated that Srisailem too should be further developed.

The traditional houses that are still existing in villages will be modernised, he said and made it clear that the quality of food being supplied at Tourism Hotels will be improved further.

As majority of the people are still not aware that zoo parks are existing in Tirupati and Visakhapatnam, these should be publicised to attract tourists, he added.

The Chief Minister directed the officials to complete the action plan for all these projects within 90 days and the tourists should feel in the next four months that AP is a Happy State.

Police arrest ex-Gannavaram MLA Vallabhaneni in Hyderabad

Hyderabad, Feb 13 (UNI) Andhra Pradesh police have arrested YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leader and former Gannavaram MLA, Vallabhaneni Vamsi, here on Thursday morning in connection with an attack on the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) office in Gannavaram (Andhra Pradesh) in 2023.

He was taken into custody from his office in Raidurg in the city, according to police sources here.

He is being shifted to Vijayawada, where he will be produced in the court after making all formalities.

Vamsi is one of the 89 persons named as accused in the TDP office attack held on Feb 20, 2023.

Vamsi had earlier applied for an anticipatory bail petition, which will come up for hearing on February 20. Vamsi has been booked under BNS sections 140(1), 308, 351(3), and Red with 3(5).

A case of SC, ST Atrocities Prevention Act has also been registered against him.

President's rule imposed in Manipur

Imphal, Feb 13 (UNI) :The Central government on Thursday imposed President's rule in troubled Manipur by keeping the northeastern state's Assembly under suspended animation, four days after N. Biren Singh resigned as chief minister.

A notification issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs said the President of India, Draupadi Murmu, has received a report from the state Governor and after considering the report and other information received, she was satisfied that a situation has arisen in which the Government of that state cannot be carried

on in accordance with the provisions of the country's Constitution.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 356 of the Constitution, and of all other powers, the President proclaimed that all functions of the Government of the State of Manipur and all powers vested in or exercisable by the Governor of that State, powers of the Legislature of the said State shall be exercisable by or under the authority of Parliament, said the notification.

"The President of India will act to such extent as she thinks fit through the Governor of the said state," it said. The operation of the provisions

of the Constitution in relation to that state was suspended and the list of the provisions was given in the order. "The Manipur Legislative Assembly will be under suspended animation," the state government said in a press note. Biren Singh on Sunday submitted his resignation letter to Manipur Governor A K Bhalla immediately after arriving from New Delhi. He had arrived at Imphal along with BJP leader Sambit Patra and some other MLAs.

Biren has in the letter expressed gratitude to the Central government for timely interventions,

developmental work and implementation of various projects for safeguarding the interest of every single Manipuri. He requested the Central government to continue with the same.

He also asked the centre to maintain the territorial integrity of Manipur which has a rich and diverse civilisational history of over thousands of years.

The Governor had then asked the CM to continue serving as the caretaker Chief Minister. Sambit Patra held talks with the BJP MLAs to chalk out a strategy to elect a new leader. However, so far there was no consensus among

the leaders. The present Assembly's tenure ends in 2027. However, Manipur is also passing through a Constitutional crisis as the state Assembly session scheduled on Feb 10 was also suspended. There cannot be a gap of six months between two Assembly sessions and the last Assembly session concluded on Aug 12, 2024.

With the imposition of President's rule in the backdrop of the conflict which began on May 3, 2023 the Governor, A K Bhalla - a former Union Home Secretary - will now be responsible for restoring normalcy and managing the affairs of the state.

JPC report on Waqf bill: Chairman has power to remove note that casts aspersion on panel: Rijiju

New Delhi, Feb 13 (UNI) Parliamentary and Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Thursday slammed the Opposition for calling the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) report on the Waqf Amendment Bill as "illegal and unconstitutional" and said that Chairman Jagdambika Pal has the authority to remove a note "that casts aspersion on the Committee". Addressing the media at the Parliament House here, Rijiju defended the Chairman of the panel and said, "It should be clear that Pal has the authority to

remove a note that casts aspersion on the Committee.

The JPC Chairman has the power to delete a portion. It is also mentioned in the rule, and everything happened as per rule."

Objecting to the Opposition members calling the "JPC report as illegal and unconstitutional", he said, "The JPC was formed by all the parties and it is not of one party. This is not just an NDA report. This is Parliament's Joint Parliamentary Committee so calling the JPC report as illegal and unconstitutional is not correct".

Rijiju said that the JPC report has an importance and if the Opposition were speaking against this report then they were "dismissing their own report".

As far as the report is concerned there can be differences in the opinion within the JPC, the Minister added. "There are basically two opinions - one is those who are in the government, they might have separate opinion than those in the opposition. Even the opposition's views have been put in the annexure. It is wrong to say that the opposition's dissent notes

are not included in the JPC. Every view whether those considered by the majority or rejected by the majority have been included in the JPC report which was tabled in the RS today and which would be tabled in Lok Sabha," he said.

Rijiju said that the JPC report has been tabled on the floor of the House, now it will come to the government and then the report will be considered by the Cabinet. And after the consideration of the Cabinet then whatever the amended version will be, it will then be presented in the

Parliament. The Minister said that the Opposition was already opposing the Bill which is not good and appealed to all the opposition parties to let the house consider this report as the "JPC has done a great length of consideration, hearing, debate and discussion. Notably, the Upper House witnessed chaotic scenes leading to a brief adjournment of the house as Opposition members protested over the 'deletion' of dissent notes from the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) report on the Waqf Amendment Bill.

Punjab govt's bonanza to six lakh employees and pensioners

Chandigarh, Feb 13 (UNI) In a bonanza to six lakh employees and pensioners of the state government, the Punjab Cabinet on Thursday accorded consent to disburse pending arrears worth Rs 14,000 crore to them.

A decision to this effect was taken in the meeting of the Council of Ministers held here under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann

A Chief Minister's Office (CMO) spokesperson said the Cabinet gave the nod to release arrears of revised pay/ pensions and leave encashment from January 2016 to June 2022 and DA/ DR from

July 2021 to March 2024 for pensioners and employees.

The sum worth Rs 14,000 crore will be released in stages and give much-needed relief to the employees and pensioners. Three lakh employees and three lakh pensioners of the state government will be directly benefitted by this move.

In an endeavour to provide houses to the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) of the society, the Cabinet green-lighted a policy for "optimum utilisation of land reserved for EWS".

As per the new policy, scattered land pockets in various colonies will be monetised and the funds received from such sale will be utilised for the benefit of EWS.

Around 1,500 acres of land will be acquired across the state as part of the scheme.

The development authorities will be authorised to plan the scattered land pockets at their level to cater to the needs of the end user in such a way that reasonable revenue would be generated for the department by way of auctioning of these sites. The officials will also be authorised to identify and acquire separate chunks of land for making either plots or houses for the EWS so that the interest of this section of the society is taken care of by the government. The Cabinet also okayed a proposal to enhance the monthly honorarium of the rural chowkidars from the existing Rs 1250 to Rs 1500. U

Hearing in MCC violation case against Sanjay Singh

Sultanpur (UP), Jan 13 (UNI) No proceedings could be held in the model code of conduct violation case against Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh in an MP-MLA court here on Thursday. Special Public Prosecutor of Sultanpur civil court Vaibhav Pandey said that the MP's busy schedule in Rajya Sabha proceedings was cited to be the reason behind his absence. "The next hearing is scheduled for February 21," he said. He said that the case is related to a public meeting held in Hasanpur on April 13, 2021, during the three-tier Panchayat elections. "Thirteen people, including Sanjay Singh, are accused of holding a public meeting in favour of AAP's district Panchayat member candidate Salma Begum in violation of the election code of conduct and the Epidemic Act," he said.

Pandey said that all the accused are already on bail and now charges are to be framed in the case. "During hearing on Thursday, the MP's advocate informed about the absence citing his busy schedule in Rajya Sabha proceedings, after which the court has fixed the date of next hearing as February 21," he added.

Bathing in Sangam is like attaining salvation: Jyotiraditya Scindia

Prayagraj, Feb 13 (UNI) Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia took a dip in the Sangam during ongoing Maha Kumbh on Thursday and prayed for public welfare as part of this sacred tradition. Expressing his gratitude, Scindia said that immersing in the holy waters of the Sangam is akin to attaining salvation. He considered himself fortunate to be part of this divine occasion. On behalf of the state government, Industrial Development Minister Nand Gopal Gupta Nandi welcomed Scindia with a Kumbh Kalash, marking the moment with reverence.

leader on Wednesday.

"I am Balasaheb Thackeray's beloved Shiv Sainik. I have done the work as he had intended to date and will carry forward his ideology," said Salvi.

Shiv Sena sources said that Salvi's move to quit the Thackeray faction and join the Eknath Shinde's camp was a part of 'Operation Tiger'.

HC reserves order on plea of mother of accused in Salman Khan firing case

Mumbai, Feb 13 (UNI) The Bombay High Court has reserved its order on a plea filed by Rita Devi, mother of Anuj Thapan — the accused in firing outside Bollywood superstar Salman Khan's residence who had allegedly committed suicide in custody — seeking a CBI probe into his death, alleging foul play.

A division bench of Justices Revati Mohite-Dere and Neela Gokhale reserved its order after arguments of both prosecution and defence concluded on Wednesday.

During the hearing, petitioner advocate raised doubts over the magisterial inquiry report, which ruled

Thapan's death a suicide, upon which the bench directed the State to show the relevant portion of the CCTV footage to Devi's advocate.

In December last year, the court had observed that the 18-year-old's demise did not appear to be a custodial death. It also noted that police had no apparent reason to harm him, as he could have been helpful in their investigation.

Thapan was found hanging in the toilet of the Crime Branch lock-up at Crawford Market on May one, 2024. Police claimed he used a bedsheet to take the extreme step. A mandatory magisterial inquiry was

conducted, and a report was submitted to the HC.

The CID, which also investigated the case, submitted a separate report.

On April 14, 2024, two motorcycle-borne men allegedly opened fire outside Galaxy Apartments in suburban Bandra, where Khan resides with his family. The alleged shooters, Vicky Gupta and Sagar Pal, were later arrested from Gujarat. Thapan and an associate were apprehended in Punjab on April 26 for allegedly supplying firearms and ammunition for the shooting. Police claimed he had links to gangster Lawrence Bishnoi.

Shab-e-Baraat prayers disallowed at Jamia, CM calls in "very unfortunate"

Srinagar, Feb 13 (UNI) : Anjuman Auqaf, the managing body of Jamia Masjid, Thursday said that authorities have disallowed the Shab-e-Baraat (Night of Salvation) congregation at the historic mosque in old Srinagar. J&K chief Minister Omar Abdullah termed the sealing of the mosque very unfortunate, stating that this reflects a lack of confidence in the people as well as in the law and order machinery. "It is very unfortunate that the security establishment has taken the decision to seal the historic Jamia Masjid, Srinagar on one of the holiest nights in the Islamic calendar - #shabebaraat. This decision betrays a lack in confidence in the people & a lack of confidence in the law & order machinery that calm won't prevail without extreme measures. The people of Srinagar deserved better," Abdullah said in a post on X.

Earlier, the Anjuman Auqaf said this is for the sixth consecutive year in a

row that Shab-e-Baraat congregation has been disallowed at the Jamia mosque in Srinagar.

There was no word from officials on disallowing the congregation prayers at Jamia. The Shab-e-Baraat is observed by Muslims on the intervening night of the 14th and 15th days of Sha'ban, the eighth month of the Islamic calendar. According to a tradition, though not believed by all Muslims, God determines the fate of all people for the coming year during the night of Shab-e-Baraat only. In a statement Anjuman Auqaf informed that following Asr prayers (late afternoon prayers), authorities abruptly closed the gates of Jamia Masjid Srinagar, while police personnel asked worshippers to vacate the mosque premises.

The Auqaf was further informed that the observance of Shab-e-Baraat would not be permitted at the Jama Masjid, the statement said.

Road rage incident leads to assault in Tangmarg; police initiate action

Srinagar, Feb 13 (UNI) : A road rage incident that began in Srinagar escalated into violence in Tangmarg area of Baramulla district on Thursday afternoon, when a group of miscreants attacked an XUV-300 vehicle carrying five occupants, police said.

The vehicle, bearing a Haryana registration number, was carrying three men from Haryana and two women from South Kashmir when it was intercepted and attacked by individuals trailing them from Srinagar. The incident occurred around 1:45 PM in the jurisdiction of Police Station Tangmarg. A police team rushed to the spot for rescue but was also assaulted, with one Head Constable sustaining a head injury. However, several local residents intervened to assist the police in rescuing the victims.

"Many locals in the area also rushed in to help the police in rescuing the 5 persons being assaulted. FIR in this regard has been registered in PS Tangmarg. The assailants are being identified and will be held accountable before law," a police statement said.

According to a preliminary investigation, the altercation stemmed from a road rage incident in Srinagar, leading to the attack in Tangmarg.

"When the trailing vehicles caught up with XUV-300 in Tangmarg, persons from the trailing vehicles came out and assaulted the 5 occupants," police said, adding that no illegal, immoral or unethical incident involving the occupants of the vehicles has come to light.

Police said they have taken serious note of misinformation and rumors being circulated on social media to incite unrest. "J&K Police has taken note of this and has begun profiling the individuals who are trying to spread fake discourse with the aim of disrupting peace and order. Legal action shall be taken against the individuals indulging in spreading fake news regarding the matter," the statement said.

Patna, Feb 13 (UNI) RJD supremo Lalu Prasad on Thursday claimed that Delhi assembly elections results would not affect the outcome of Bihar assembly polls, to be held this year as BJP was all set to lose the next electoral battle in the state.

Prasad told media persons here that NDA was all set to lose power in the next Bihar assembly elections to be held in October-November this year. BJP leaders were daydreaming, he remarked.

BJP has registered an impressive victory by winning 48 seats in recently held Delhi assembly elections. AAP was ousted from power as the party managed to win just 22 seats in 70 member strength of the Delhi assembly.

(Standard Post Bureau) Tanuku, Feb 13 : District Collector Chadalawada Nagarani has assured the public that there is no cause for concern, emphasizing that well-cooked chicken and eggs remain safe for consumption in areas unaffected by the bird flu outbreak. She reiterated that the culling of infected birds is being carried out using scientifically approved methods.

On Thursday, the Collector conducted a surprise inspection of poultry farms in Velpuru

village, Tanuku Mandal. She reviewed the ongoing culling process, which is being managed by Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) in poultry sheds. She questioned workers about the disposal methods being used and inquired whether they had been provided with antiviral medication.

Addressing the media, Collector Chadalawada stated that the culling of infected birds in G. Krishnanandam Poultry is being executed on a war footing under the supervision of RRT teams.

A total of 22 rapid response teams, comprising veterinary doctors, have been deployed for this operation. The infected birds are being buried in scientifically dug pits, following a structured layering process with lime, sodium chloride, and potassium permanganate to ensure proper disposal.

She noted that the poultry farm housed approximately 20,000 chickens. Following the culling process, the sheds are being thoroughly sanitized, with fire guns

being used to remove feathers before a complete disinfection procedure is undertaken. Additionally, antiviral drugs have been distributed to the RRT teams. Health check-ups for residents in nearby towns and villages have also been arranged under the directives of the District Medical and Health Officer (DM&HO).

The government is closely monitoring the situation, providing continuous guidance and implementing necessary precautionary measures. In

response to concerns raised by reporters, the Collector clarified that the state government, in consultation with the central government and scientific experts, has determined that except for the one-kilometer radius surrounding infected areas, people in other regions can safely consume well-cooked chicken and eggs. She also confirmed that there have been no reported cases of human infection and no recorded symptoms related to bird flu in the district.

The Collector reaffirmed that the district administration is taking all necessary steps to control the outbreak effectively.

During the inspection, RDO Khateeb Kausar Bhano, District Animal Husbandry Officer Dr. K. Muralikrishna, District In-Charge Medical and Health Officer Dr. B. Bhanu Nayak, Tahsildar D.V.S.S. Ashok Vama, MPDOR. Lohith Jaya Sagar, along with officials from the Animal Husbandry Department, medical experts, technical teams, and health-care staff, were present.

JPC report on Waqf bill: Chairman has power to remove note that casts aspersion on panel: Rijiju

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Objecting to the Opposition members calling the "JPC report as illegal and unconstitutional", he said, "The JPC was formed by all the parties and it is not of one party. This is not just an NDA report. This is Parliament's Joint Parliamentary Committee so calling the JPC report as illegal and unconstitutional is not correct". Rijiju said that the JPC report has an importance and if the Opposition were speaking against this report then they were "dismissing their own report".

As far as the report is concerned there can be

differences in the opinion within the JPC, the Minister added. "There are basically two opinions - one is those who are in the government, they might have separate opinion than those in the opposition. Even the opposition's views have been put in the annexure. It is wrong to say that the opposition's dissent notes are not included in the JPC. Every view whether those considered by the majority or rejected by the majority have been included in the JPC report which was tabled in the RS today and which would be tabled in Lok Sabha," he said.

Rijiju said that the JPC report has been tabled on the floor of the House, now it will come to the

government and then the report will be considered by the Cabinet. And after the consideration of the Cabinet then whatever the amended version will be, it will then be presented in the Parliament.

The Minister said that the Opposition was already opposing the Bill which is not good and appealed to all the opposition parties to let the house consider this report as the "JPC has done a great length of consideration, hearing, debate and discussion.

Notably, the Upper House witnessed chaotic scenes leading to a brief adjournment of the house as Opposition members protested over the 'deletion' of dissent notes from the Joint

Parliamentary Committee (JPC) report on the Waqf Amendment Bill.

Leader of the Opposition (LoP) Mallikarjun Kharge claimed that the Committee on Waqf Amendment Bill had deleted the dissent notes of MPs and included views of people from outside. He termed the move as unconstitutional, vowing to not allow the passage of such a report.

Meanwhile, similar situation was witnessed in the Lok Sabha too, when the report was tabled. The Opposition created a ruckus and walked out of the house, alleging that dissenting comments were not included in the report of the JPC presented in the house

Imposition of President's Rule admission of BJP's inability : Rahul Gandhi

Imphal, Feb 14 (IANS) Leader of Opposition (LoP) Rahul Gandhi on Thursday said that the imposition of President's Rule in Manipur is a belated admission by the BJP of their complete inability to govern in Manipur. Rahul Gandhi in a post on X, said, "Now, PM Modi can no longer deny

his direct responsibility for Manipur. Has he finally made up his mind to visit the state, and explain to the people of Manipur and India his plan to restore peace and normalcy?"

Congress General Secretary (Communications) Jairam Ramesh in a separate post

on the X said: "On the 10th of February, the Congress was bringing a no-confidence motion. They knew the chief minister had lost the confidence of his own BJP and NDA colleagues." Consequently, the Chief Minister was forced to resign on February 9, said Ramesh,

also a member of Parliament. He said that the requirement to convene the next session within six months of the previous one was violated on February 12. "And today, they've announced the President's Rule. We will consult our party colleagues and hold internal meetings to discuss

whether to demand midterm polls in Manipur. However, our immediate demand is for the Prime Minister to visit Manipur," the Rajya Sabha member said on Monday. Meanwhile, Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF), an apex body of Kuki-Zo tribals in Manipur supported the

imposition of President's rule in the trouble-torn state.

ITLF spokesman Ginza Vualzong said that the president's rule is more preferable than a change of Chief Minister. "The Kuki-Zo do not trust Meitei anymore, so a new Meitei Chief Minister is still far from comforting.

Alzheimer's cases in 8 major markets to reach 22.51 million in 2033

The prevalent cases of Alzheimer's disease (AD) in the eight major markets globally are set to register an annual growth rate (AGR) of 4.08 per cent from 15.99 million in 2023 to 22.51 million in 2033, according to a report.

China will have the highest number of total prevalent cases of AD (by DSM-IV criteria) at 10.4 million cases, whereas Spain will have the lowest number at 0.62 million cases in 2033, according to the report by GlobalData, a leading data and analytics company.

"In 2023, women were more affected than men, accounting for approximately 73 per cent of the total prevalent cases," said Antara Bhattacharya, associate project manager, epidemiology team.

Older adults in ages 75 years and above accounted for almost 79 per cent of the total prevalent cases of AD in the eight major markets in 2023, while comparatively younger adults in ages 65-74 years accounted for approximately 21 per cent of the cases.

The report estimated that in 2023, approximately 55 per cent of total prevalent cases of AD were mild, whereas only 16 per cent of total prevalent cases of AD were severe.

"Mortality remains a significant concern for individuals living with AD and their families. Efforts to prevent or delay the disease are expected to have a profound impact on long-term outcomes, as the value of treatment will largely depend on a therapy's effectiveness in reducing morbidity and extending life expectancy," said Bhattacharya.

Extensive research can improve our understanding of the crucial relationship between AD and mortality. "Moreover, the treatment for AD requires a multifaceted approach that integrates medical interventions, lifestyle modifications, ongoing support, along with clinical trials, and follow-up care," said the report.

Liver Transplants for Adults and Children

Guwahati : When someone's liver is not working well, a liver transplant may be the best option to help them recover. This type of surgery is needed when the liver can no longer do its job—helping with digestion, storing energy, and clearing out toxins. Liver transplants aren't just for adults; children sometimes need them too says Dr. Vikram Kumar, Principal Consultant, Paediatric Liver Transplantation, Gastroenterology & Hepatology, Max Hospital, Saket.

Why Do People Need a Liver Transplant?

Liver failure can happen for different reasons. In adults, it's often caused by long-term alcohol use or chronic diseases. For children, it's usually due to genetic problems or infections. When the liver isn't working well and there's no other way to treat the problem, a transplant can be a lifesaver.

A liver transplant replaces the damaged liver with a healthy one. Sometimes, the whole liver is replaced, but other times only a part of it is used. In



either case, the transplant helps restore the liver's functions and can improve the person's health.

How Does a Liver Transplant Work?

There are two main types of liver transplants: Whole Liver Transplant: This is when the entire liver is taken from a recently deceased donor and transplanted into the patient.

Living Donor Liver Transplant: In some cases, a living person donates a portion of their liver. This works because the liver is unique—it can grow back over time. So, both the donor and recipient end up

with full-sized livers after a while. A smaller liver portion from a living donor can often work just fine for children, as their bodies need less liver tissue than adults.

What is Involved in the Process?

Getting a liver transplant isn't a quick process. First, doctors check to make sure the person really needs a new liver and is healthy enough for surgery. If so, they are put on a waiting list, which can take time since there aren't always enough donors available.

When a donor's liver is found, surgery can begin.

The operation itself takes several hours. After the surgery, the patient will spend a few weeks in the hospital. During this time, they are closely monitored to make sure everything is working well with the new liver.

Recovery and Life After Surgery

Even after being discharged from the hospital, recovery continues at home. It may take several months to fully recover and adjust. Patients will also need to take medicines for the rest of their lives to prevent their body from rejecting the new liver.

For children, liver transplants often mean they can go back to enjoying activities and just being kids. Adults can also look forward to returning to their routines, although recovery can be different for each person.

Liver transplants, like any major surgery, have risks. These can include infection, bleeding, or rejection of the new liver. But many people find that a successful transplant gives them back their health and freedom.

SC denies bail to accused in 2020 Bengaluru Riots Case

New Delhi, Feb 13 (UNI) : The Supreme Court on Thursday declined to grant bail to Shabbar Khan, who has been chargesheeted under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, in connection with the riots that took place in Bengaluru on August 11, 2020.

The violence was reportedly triggered by a Facebook post allegedly containing derogatory remarks about Prophet Muhammad.

The prosecution alleged that the petitioner, along with a mob, was responsible for burning motorcycles. 198 individuals were named in the FIR, out of which 138 have been chargesheeted. Of these, 25 individuals face charges under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act 1967.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has stated that members of the Social Democratic Party of India (SDPI), the political wing of the banned Popular Front of India (PFI), were involved in the riots,

including Shabbar Khan. According to reports, these members allegedly conspired to mobilize a large crowd that attacked police personnel and vandalized police station vehicles at D.J. Halli and K.G. Halli police stations on the night of August 11.

Shabbar Khan was not initially named in the FIR filed by the state police. However, when the NIA took over the investigation, his name was included.

On January 31, a bench of Justices B.V. Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma asked the NIA that how much time it would take for the trial court to frame charges and commence trial against the accused in the 2020 Bengaluru riots case. This query arose after Senior Advocate P. Vishwanath Shetty, appearing for Shabbar Khan, highlighted that Karnataka has only one designated NIA Court.

Shetty further submitted that his client has already undergone four years and one month of incarceration without the trial court framing charges.

He pointed out that 254 witnesses are yet to be examined. Citing judgments in Sheikh Javed Iqbal @ Ashfaq Ansari @ Javed Ansari v. State of Uttar Pradesh (2024) and 2021 KA Najeeb, he argued that bail should be granted when there has been prolonged incarceration with no likelihood of an expeditious trial.

When Shetty referred to the evidence against the petitioner, Justice Nagarathna remarked, "We cannot have a mini-trial here." Opposing the bail plea, Additional Solicitor General S.V. Raju argued that the petitioner himself was responsible for the delay. However, the Court did not make any observation on that aspect.

While the Court refused to interfere with the Karnataka High Court's August 30, 2024, order denying bail to Shabbar Khan, it issued significant directions regarding the trial process. The Court took note of the fact that 254 witnesses had been listed for the trial before the Special NIA Court. It also

acknowledged submissions that the Karnataka High Court, in Shoheb Ali @ Shajid Ali vs. The State By Karnataka (2023), had recorded that 31 NIA cases were pending before the Special NIA Court, apart from 53 sessions cases and two criminal miscellaneous matters.

Considering the backlog and the slow pace of trial, the Supreme Court directed the Karnataka Government to comply with Section 11 of the National Investigation Agency Act, 2008.

The Court noted that the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) had issued a communication on October 7, 2024, seeking the Karnataka Government's and the High Court's consent for establishing an exclusive NIA Court in Bengaluru. However, the State Government had not yet acted upon a previous order from April 2, 2023, directing the establishment of Special Courts for UAPA cases in Mysore, Belagavi, and Kalaburagi divisions within six months.

Matter of removal of HC judges lies with Parliament'

New Delhi, Feb 13 (UNI) : The Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar on Thursday ruled that the matter seeking removal of Allahabad High Court judge Justice Shekhar Yadav from his post is a matter of the "Chairman's jurisdiction and in an eventuality with the Parliament and President".

Dhankhar instructed the Secretary General of the Rajya Sabha to send this

information to the Registrar General of the Supreme Court. Soon after the Question Hour, the Chairman, while mentioning the notice received from some members last December regarding the removal of the judge from the post, said, "I am seized of an undated notice for motion received on 13 December 2024, bearing 55 purported signatures of the members

of the Rajya Sabha seeking removal from office of Justice Shekhar Yadav of Allahabad High Court under Article 124(4) of the Constitution".

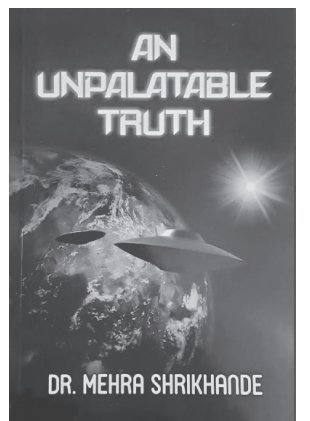
The Chairman ruled, "The jurisdiction for the stated subject matter constitutionally lies in exclusivity with the Chairman, Rajya Sabha and in an eventuality with the Parliament and Hon'ble President". While directing

the Rajya Sabha Secretary General to convey the information about this announcement made in the House to the Supreme Court, Dhankhar said, "Taking note of public domain information and inputs available, it is expedient that the Secretary General, Rajya Sabha shares this for information with the Secretary General, Supreme Court of India". 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PM likely to visit Tripura next month to launch a slew of projects and flag off Vande Bharat Express

Agartala, Feb 13 (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to visit Tripura next month to launch a slew of projects including flagging off Vande Bharat Express between Agartala and Guwahati from here.

The state government has already approached PMO seeking his availability after Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) issued a green signal for starting India's fastest train Vande Bharat connecting two important cities of Northeast daily.

The NFR has also almost completed the railway line electrification work in Tripura and South Assam to ensure super-fast train service from Tripura. Presently, premiere trains like Tejash Express to Delhi and Humsafar to Bengaluru have been operating from Agartala by Diesel engine, besides a few more express trains connecting important cities.

The proposed Vande Bharat Express is scheduled to complete a 571 km journey between Agartala and Guwahati in seven and a half hours stopping at Ambassa, Dharmanagar of Tripura, and New Karimganj, Badarpur Junction, and Hojai of Assam. The train will start at 6 AM every day and reach Guwahati at 1.30 PM and the return journey will start from Guwahati at 2 PM

and reach Agartala at 9.30 PM, sources said.

"At present trains take at least 12 hours to reach Guwahati from Agartala by diesel engine. The journey through hill sections of South Assam up to Lumding from Badarpur takes six hours to cover around 160 kilometers distance. After putting trains into electric lines the time coverage will be reduced to half, which will boost the business of Northeastern states with Tripura instead of concentrating on Guwahati," Transport officials said.

Meanwhile, Chief Minister Dr Manik Saha said that the state government has planned to inaugurate the new infrastructure installed in Tripura Sundari temple under the centrally sponsored schemes in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

"The construction works are complete. The agencies engaged in the work are giving the finishing touches to the projects. We are eager to have Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the inauguration ceremony," Dr Saha said, adding that under PM's guidance, Tripura tourism has reached a new height and many more new opportunities are coming to add tourist attractions.

Focus should be on complete wipe-out of terrorism from Jammu Division: LG Sinha

Jammu, Feb 13 (UNI) : Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday chaired a high-level meeting and reviewed the security scenario in Jammu Division.

The meeting was attended by DGP J&K and other top brass of Police, Army and Intelligence officers.

At the outset, the DGP J&K and IGP Jammu briefed the chair on the future action plan and the proposed measures to tackle the security challenges to ensure a safe and secure environment for the common citizen.

The IGP Railways gave a detailed presentation on the security architecture of railways, and the roadmap put in place to strengthen the security of stations and the tracks. The Lieutenant

Governor said that our focus should be on complete wipe-out of terrorism from Jammu Division.

"We should not even have remnant of terrorism in Jammu region. Take effective steps to wipe-out terrorism and ensure complete dismantling of the infrastructure and local support of terrorism," the Lieutenant Governor said.

The Lieutenant Governor directed the J&K Police officials to take strongest possible action against those providing logistical and financial support to terrorism.

"Make sure that acts of individuals or groups trying to create fear in the society are termed as terrorist action and they should be punished as per the law," the Lieutenant

Governor directed the police officials. The Lieutenant Governor also discussed roadmap for technology driven policing, area domination plan, inter-agency coordination, action against narco-terrorism, capacity building of police force and innovative strategies to improve cyber patrolling and monitoring capabilities. He stressed on credible intelligence gathering, sharing of real time operational intelligence and anti-terror operations based on precise inputs.

"Every perpetrator and supporter of terrorism must pay the price. We need to equip ourselves with credible intelligence and act more effectively to neutralise the terrorists and ensure the security of

citizens. We must be prepared for conventional as well as non-conventional threats," the Lieutenant Governor said. The Lieutenant Governor directed for stronger measures to protect our borders.

"We must strengthen border security against asymmetric threats due to porous border with riverines and difficult mountain range and all the security agencies must work together to provide necessary back-up support," the Lieutenant Governor observed.

The Lieutenant Governor also called for strengthening the legal framework to deal with terror propagandists and strengthening of police establishment at local level for modern and efficient policing.

Workers of "Jan Suraaj" will decide party candidates for assembly polls: Prashant

Patna, Feb 13 (UNI) Founder of "Jan Suraaj" Prashant Kishor on Thursday declared that workers and office bearers of the party would select candidates for the next Assembly elections in Bihar. Kishor said that it was a new idea being implemented by any political party in the distribution of its tickets for elections. As per practice prevalent in the country, top leaders of the party had been selecting candidates for elections and there was no role of workers in the distribution of party tickets, he pointed out. "Jan Suraaj" leader said that, unlike other parties, his party would give total freedom to its workers in the selection of candidates for elections. In the next assembly elections in Bihar, workers and office bearers of Jan Suraaj would have the responsibility to distribute tickets, he stated. There would not be any committee or a group of leaders for the distribution of tickets among candidates, he pointed out.

Kishor said that in BJP only Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah had the freedom to distribute tickets for candidates in elections. Similarly in Congress, Rahul Gandhi and Sonia Gandhi enjoyed the freedom to select candidates of their party in elections, he added. Jan Suraaj leader said that RJD supremo Lalu Prasad had full authority to distribute tickets in his party and it was known to all, the criteria being adopted by Prasad for distribution of tickets, he remarked.

Now poor and middle-class can access five star facilities for events: Yogi

Gorakhpur, Feb 13 (UNI) Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday said that programmes for the poor and economically weaker sections, as well as the middle-income group, will now have access to five-star facilities through Kalyan Mandapams.

Speaking at the inauguration and foundation stone-laying ceremony organised by the Municipal Corporation in Khorabar township, where he dedicated development projects worth Rs 103 crore, the CM said, "Today marks the inauguration of Gorakhpur's first Kalyan Mandapam and within the next few months, seven more will be completed."

Notably, he has allocated funds from his MLA fund for the construction of five of these Kalyan Mandapams. He also directed the Municipal Corporation to offer Kalyan Mandapam bookings to its employees

and sanitation workers for just Rs 11,000.

Alongside inaugurating the city's first Kalyan Mandapam, built at a cost of Rs 4.71 crore in the newly created Khorabar ward, Yogi inaugurated a gas-based animal crematorium worth Rs 4.55 crore, the drain

construction project from Mahadevpuram to Phase 2 (pumping station) in Ramgarh Tal at Rs 2.46 crore, a road project from Ekla Dam to the Animal Crematorium (Carcass Plant) at Rs 68 lakh, and the shed construction at Kanha Gaushala in Mahewa for Rs 97 lakh.

With a total of Rs 26.31 crore allocated for these completed projects, he also laid the foundation stone for additional development projects worth Rs 76.40 crore.

Highlighting the significance of Kalyan Mandapam, the CM emphasised that its inauguration marks a new

era in civic amenities. He said that while those with financial means can organise events in hotels and grand lawns, economically weaker sections often lack suitable venues.

He said, "To address this, Municipal Corporations and Development Authorities were directed to set up Kalyan Mandapams, dedicated spaces where weddings and auspicious ceremonies for the poor, lower, and middle-income groups can be held with ease."

Yogi said that the Kalyan Mandapam features a spacious auditorium, dormitory, six rooms, a kitchen and a well-maintained lawn. He described it as a permanent asset for economically weaker sections, ensuring five-star facilities for their special occasions.

Highlighting the extensive development initiatives being introduced

for Gorakhpur Municipal Corporation and other urban bodies, he said, "Among these, one of the most significant projects is the animal crematorium, which will effectively address the issue of animal body disposal and provide relief from foul odours."

He said that beautification efforts for the iconic clock tower are underway while preserving Gorakhpur's historical identity. "Simultaneously, multi-level parking is being constructed at Shaheed Bandhu Singh Park, adjacent to Ghantaghar, to ease traffic congestion. Work is also progressing rapidly on park development, road widening and drainage projects. Once the Godhhoiya Nala project is completed, the city will be free from the recurring problem of water logging," he said.

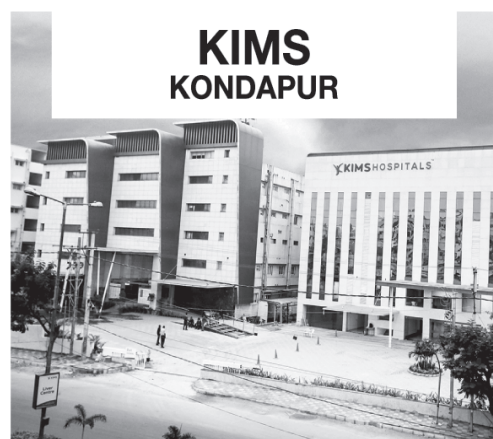
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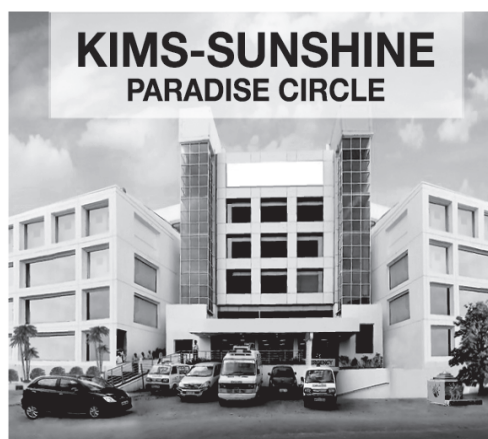
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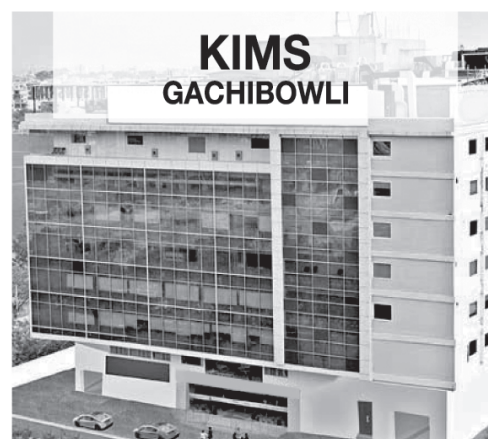
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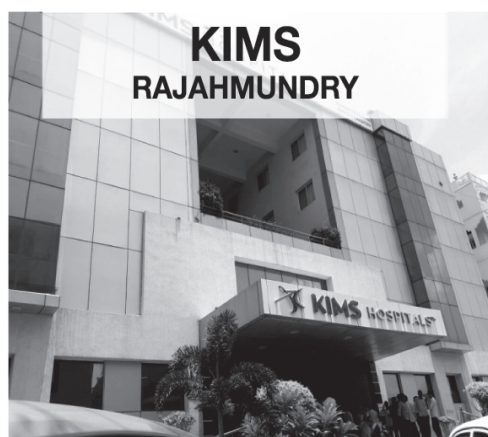
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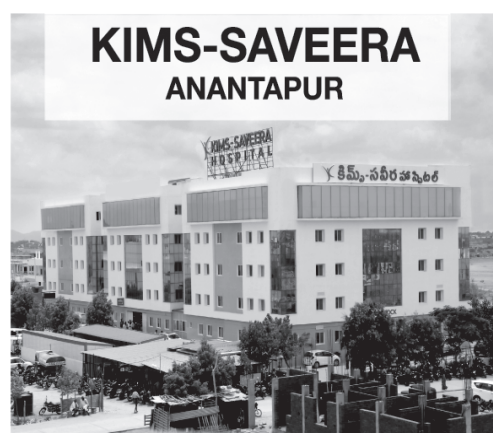
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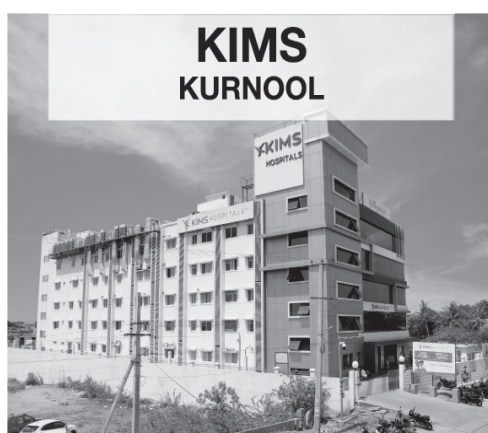
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China wins women biathlon relay gold at Winter Asiad



Harbin, Feb 13 (UNI) : Meng Fanqi delivered a stunning final leg to secure victory for China in the biathlon women's 4x6km relay at the Harbin Asian Winter Games on Thursday.

China's quartet, consisting of Tang Jialin, Wen Ying, Chu Yuanmeng and Meng, had struggled in the early stages and sat

third at the final exchange.

However, Meng rose to the occasion, making up ground and securing the win in a time of one hour, 29 minutes and 6.3 seconds.

"I was under a lot of pressure in the final leg, but no matter the outcome, I just wanted to give it my all," Meng said. "Both my skiing and

shooting were beyond my usual level today, and I think luck was really on our side."

South Korea finished 21 seconds behind to take the silver, while Kazakhstan claimed the bronze. In the men's 4x7.5km relay, Japan and China were neck and neck until the final leg, where China's Gu Cang faltered

with multiple shooting errors.

Japan capitalized on the mistakes, pulling ahead to win gold in one hour, 24 minutes and 20.3 seconds.

Kazakhstan also surged past China to secure the silver in 1:25:18.7, leaving China with the bronze in 1:25:32.7

Haryana gymnasts win 7 medals in Uttarakhand National Games

Chandigarh, Feb 13 (UNI) : Haryana gymnasts bagged seven medals - two silver and five bronze - in the gymnastics competition of the 38th National Games in Uttarakhand.

Rickelton excited for Champions Trophy challenge after multi-format success

Cape Town, Feb 13 (UNI) : In a cricketing landscape where excelling across all formats has become increasingly rare, South Africa's Ryan Rickelton is determined to defy the odds.

Rickelton started the year in a spectacular fashion, scoring a mammoth 259 against Pakistan in the second Test at Newlands, which South Africa won by 10 wickets.

He quickly followed that up with stellar performances in the SA20, where he scored 336 runs at an average of 48, striking at an incredible 178.72 as he helped MI Cape Town lift the trophy for the first time, further solidifying his reputation in the shortest format.

But as South Africa prepare for the Champions Trophy, Rickelton's focus is now firmly on the ODIs, where he looks to continue his rise. In his six games in the format thus far, Rickelton has 181 runs at a strike-rate close to 90. And

the batter has taken the help of a Protea great to finetune his game.

"I've worked a lot with Hashim Amla in the last few years, and he has been a phenomenal coach for me," Rickelton revealed in an exclusive chat with the ICC. "He was a master of off-side play and he says sometimes when I get a bit excited, I look too leg-side. He's always encouraging me to open up the off-side a bit more, so he always gets excited when he sees me cover drive."

South Africa, who won the inaugural edition of the tournament in 1998, will look to add another major ICC title to their collection.

"It's just about getting back into that mindset. I don't think it'll be too challenging. The wickets in Pakistan can be quite good to bat on, and they swing under lights and get skiddy. We'll have a chat, figure that out, and get locked in," Rickelton said. A significant opportunity has opened up for Rickelton

Odisha FC eye seventh win against Hyderabad FC in ISL

Bhubaneswar, Feb 13 (UNI) : Odisha FC are set to host Hyderabad FC at the Kalinga Stadium here in the Indian Super League (ISL) match on Friday.

The Juggernauts have won each of the last four games in this fixture, and they have a chance to equal their longest victorious run against any opponent in the ISL, alongside East Bengal FC and NorthEast United FC.

Moreover, they have an impeccable record at home against Hyderabad FC, winning each of their last three ISL games against them in Bhubaneswar. Another triumph would make them only the second team after FC Goa (four wins against Odisha FC) to keep a 100% home run against a single team in ISL history (min. four games played).

Hyderabad FC have endured a struggling season, since they are at

the penultimate place in the points table with 16 points from 19 matches on the back of four wins and draws each. However, they have bagged encouraging outcomes in their last five matches, winning and drawing twice each, comprising two victories in their previous three encounters. Their recent form thus suggests that they have the potential of upsetting Odisha FC's playoff hopes, since the Sergio Lobera-coached side are currently lingering at the seventh spot with 26 points, just three off the sixth-positioned NorthEast United FC (29).

The Juggernauts will threaten Hyderabad FC with their attacking prowess, having netted 38 goals in their 20 matches, with Diego Mauricio leading the pack, courtesy of nine strikes to his name. Jerry Mawhingthanga

and Mourtada Fall have scored five and four goals respectively. Hyderabad FC, contrastingly, have kept the least clean sheets (2) in the league, conceding 38 goals thus far.

Odisha FC have also kept clean sheets in each of their last three matches against Hyderabad FC. If they manage to shutout once again, it will mark their outright most clean sheets against a single team in ISL history (previously achieved against Chennaiyin FC, Mohun Bagan Super Giant, and NorthEast United FC).

Odisha FC have trailed for only 24.6% of their total game time this season. Hyderabad FC have struggled to assert their gameplay, as they have spent 51.1% of their time on the pitch trailing, which is more than any other team in the current campaign of the competition.

South Korea bags figure skating singles golds at Winter Asiad

Harbin, Feb 13 (UNI) : South Korea's Cha Jun-hwan and Kim Chae-yeon took gold in the men's and women's singles events, respectively, at the Asian Winter Games here on Thursday.

Despite leading by nearly 10 points in the short program, Japan's Yuma Kagiyama slipped three times on Thursday, handing the gold medal to Cha, South Korea's national champion, who posted an impressive score of 281.69 points. Kazakhstan's Mikhail Shaidorov claimed the bronze. Amid cheers from the home crowd, China's Dai Dawei landed two quadruple jumps to finish fourth with 238.83 points, while his compatriot Chen Yudong ranked seventh with 203.32 points.

"I performed better than I expected. It's a comfort to have skated a relatively clean program today," said Dai. Although he missed the podium by just one spot, he expressed no regrets. "Certainly, every athlete wants to stand on the podium, but I know I still need to improve my skills."

In the women's free skating, 2024 World Figure Skating Championships bronze medallist Kim delivered a near-flawless performance to score 147.56 points. With a total of 219.44 points, she edged out Beijing Winter Olympics bronze medallist Kaori Sakamoto by 7.54 points, after Sakamoto slipped on a triple jump. Hana Yoshida of Japan took home the bronze medal. "I initially thought just skating through my program would be good enough, but now I realize - I should have won the gold," the 18-year-old Kim said. "At first, I couldn't believe it, but it's slowly sinking in." She added, "Kaori is such a strong competitor. I've always wanted to beat her, but I never expected to do it here at the Winter Asiad."

Reflecting on her performance, Kim noted, "When I finished my free skate, I told myself - finally, I did it!" Although she admitted to feeling more nervous than the day before, she was proud to have delivered a clean performance, particularly in her jump combinations.

Yuvraj Sandhu shoots a steady 68, holds on to the lead, Jamal tails

Kolkata, Feb 13 (UNI) : Yuvraj Sandhu of Chandigarh hung on to a one-shot lead courtesy his steady two-under 68 on day three often referred to as 'moving day' in golf here on Thursday.

Yuvraj (63-61-68), a winner at Tollygunge Club in the past, has a three-day total of 18-under 192 as he continued in the lead for the third consecutive day at TATA Steel PGTI Players Championship 2025.

Bangladesh's Jamal Hossain (65-62-66), fresh from a standout season on the PGTI last year, narrowed down the gap with the leader after he returned a 66 in round three. Jamal's total reads

17-under 193 as he is just one shot behind the

leader.

Rahil Gangjee (63-67-66) of Bengaluru, playing at a course where he spent most of his childhood, struck a 66 in round three to be placed third at a total of 14-under 196.

The legendary SSP Chawrasia (71) was the highest-placed among the Kolkata-based professionals as he ended the day in tied 14th at nine-under 201.

Kolkata's Anshul Mishra, the only amateur to make the cut, carded a 69 to be tied 20th at seven-under 203. Yuvraj Sandhu, the overnight leader by three shots, endured a horrid start on Thursday after he dropped bogeys on the first two holes. Yuvraj, who holds the record for the

lowest winning total at Tollygunge Club, then got his round back on track thanks to his consistent hitting and a couple of good up and downs that earned him four birdies.

The putts didn't roll in for the 27-year-old Sandhu on Thursday as he missed multiple birdie conversions from within four to eight feet.

Jamal Hossain, also a former winner at Tollygunge, came up with five birdies and a bogey on Thursday to keep himself on the leader's tail and in the hunt. Jamal missed a chip-in for birdie on the last hole by a whisker.

Last year's champion Manu Gandas (65) closed the day in tied 20th at seven-under 203.

Jash Modi, Selena emerge singles champions in TT

Dehradun, Feb 13 (UNI) : Maharashtra's Jash Modi won the men's singles champion at the 38th National Games, following in the footsteps of fellow youngster Selena Deepthi Selvakumar from Tamil Nadu on the final day of the table tennis events at the Parade Ground Indoor Hall here on Thursday.

Jash showcased remarkable composure and endurance against seasoned national champion Sathiyam in a final that went down to the wire. Despite leading 3-2, the experienced paddler turned the match around by claiming the next games. But Jash sealed a thrilling 4-3 victory by claiming the last game. The contest was a spectacle of intense rallies and clinical finishes, but in the end, it was Jash Modi.

The Maharashtra boy rose to the occasion, clinching gold for Maharashtra.

Selena's unshakable composure, even in the tensest moments, was her greatest weapon in the gold medal match against second-seed Swastika Ghosh of Maharashtra. Trailing 1-5 in the decider, she expertly shifted the pace, unsettling a nervous Swastika and turning the tide in her favour.

With three golden points in her hand, Selena saw her

opponent save two before an unforced error handed her the victory. She acknowledged her triumph with a trademark smile and a sportsmanlike handshake.

Before that, Selena had surged to a 2-0 lead, only to let Swastika claw back and take control at 3-2. Her natural affinity for backhand play initially worked against her, as she stuck to fast-paced rallies that played into Swastika's strengths.

But just when the Maharashtra paddler seemed poised to dominate the decider, Selena's cool-headed tactical shift slowed the game down, disrupting Swastika's rhythm. The strategy paid off, forcing errors from her opponent and sealing a well-earned gold for the Tamil Nadu star.

The men's semifinals produced a thrilling spectacle, with G Sathiyam and Jash Modi battling through intense, high-stakes encounters to outlast P B Abhinand of Tamil Nadu and Payas Jain of Delhi. The matches were fiercely contested, with momentum swinging wildly, especially in the second semifinal, which went down to the wire.

In the all-Tamil Nadu clash, Sathiyam started strong, claiming the opening game. However, Abhinand, undeterred by his opponent's experience, mounted a spirited fightback. The second game turned into a war of attrition, with both players pushing each other to the limit before Abhinand edged it 20-18.

As the match progressed, the two continued to trade blows, each refusing to yield. With the scores locked at 2-2, Sathiyam displayed his composure under pressure, eking out a crucial fifth-game win by the narrowest of margins.

That proved the turning point, as he stormed through the sixth game with authority, closing out the match 4-2 to book his place in the final.

Meanwhile, in Table 3, Jash and Payas engaged in an electrifying duel, captivating spectators with their relentless rallies and attacking flair. Neither player gave an inch, and at 2-2, the outcome was anyone's guess.

“They also discussed international, and regional issues of mutual interest.”

The MEA spokesperson in a post on X said the two sides had a meaningful exchange of views on deepening bilateral strategic ties and

addressing global security challenges.

“They had a meaningful exchange of views on deepening India-US strategic ties & addressing global security challenges.”

The meeting was also attended by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, NSA Ajit Doval, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and Indian Ambassador to the US Vinay Mohan Kwatra, which lasted for around 45 minutes.

The meeting comes ahead of PM Modi's meeting with US President Donald Trump on the evening on Thursday.

‘Lok Sabha registered 112 pc of productivity in first phase of Budget session’

New Delhi, Feb 13 (UNI) Lok Sabha has registered 112 percent of productivity in the first phase of the Budget session, which concluded on Thursday, despite disruption from the opposition members on various issues, Speaker Om Birla said.

The lower house of Parliament was adjourned by the Speaker till March 10.

In a statement, Birla said, “The general discussion on the budget was lasted for 16 hours and 13 minutes in which 170 members participated. With your support, our productivity in this session was about 112 percent”.

Praising members of the house, he said, today is the last day of the first phase of the Budget Session. ‘I am happy that we discussed in a good atmosphere during the session. I got your full support.”

“There was a meaningful discussion of 17 hours and 23 minutes on the motion of thanks to President's address. In this, 173 Hon'ble Members sat till late night and expressed their views” Birla further added.

The Speaker expressed hope that the house will continue to get the support of the members in the same way in future as well.

Meanwhile, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman introduced the new Income Tax bill in the house.

The new Income Tax Bill will replace the six-decade old Income Tax Act and will likely come into effect from April 1, 2026.
