He said that to strengthen law and order, it is essential for crimes to be registered so that there should not be any delay in filing FIRs.HM Shah emphasised that efforts should be made to achieve over 90 per cent conviction rate in cases with sentences of more than 7 years and that the police, government lawyers, and judiciary should work together to ensure that the guilty are punished as swiftly as possible. "I'd love to have them back. I think it was a mistake to throw them out," Trump said in remarks to reporters inside the Oval Office of the White

House. G8, which comprised the

Group of Seven (G7) plus Russia, ceased to exist in March 2014 after the U.S.-led effort under then-President Barack Obama to kick Russia out, for the proclaimed reason of Russian annexation of Crimea that year.

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Indonesia to launch new investment agency Danantara in Feb

Jakarta, Feb. 14 (UNI) Indonesia's President Prabowo Subianto announced that the country is ready to launch its new investment management agency, Danantara, in February.

"Danantara, which will be launched on Feb. 24, will invest our nation's natural resources and assets into sustainable and high-impact projects across various sectors, including renewable energy, advanced manufacturing, downstream industries, food production, and others," the president said during a keynote speech at the World Government Summit held online in Dubai on Thursday.

The launch of Danantara, an abbreviation of Daya Anagata Nusantara, was initially scheduled for November last year but was postponed. Danantara is a strategic agency tasked with operationalizing state-owned enterprises and optimizing dividend management to support the government's economic goals.

An initial evaluation of Indonesia's newest sovereign wealth fund reveals that Danantara's Assets Under Management exceed 900 billion U.S. dollars. Meanwhile, its initial funding is projected to reach 20 billion dollars.

Role Of Prashant Kishor In Helping Trinamool Counter BJP In Bengal

Elections in Bengal just two months away, poll strategist Prashant Kishor's team is playing a key role for Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress, helping it tackle the BJP challenge. Amid speculation that it also has a say in candidate selection, the Indian Political Action Committee or IPAC says it is acting as a force multiplier for the ruling party, helping it identify chinks in its armour, plugging gaps in its strategy and draw in votes that had moved away.

The third item on the list is important, with the BJP rapidly expanding its footprint in tribal areas of the state. A portion of Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Adivasi votes in the western and northern parts of the state had shifted to the BJP in 2019, giving it a chunk of the 18 parliamentary seats it won in the state.

The IPAC's role is to ensure that Trinamool's message for these segments get amplified. Much of this is done through outreach programmes, where mid-level and district leaders can interact with the Chief Minister.

At one such programme organised by IPAC to reach out to the party's tribal and Scheduled Castes leaders, Mamata Banerjee had said: "I am appealing to my brothers from the SC/ST and Adivasi community. They (the BJP) have won a lot of your seats. They have won in Junglemahal and North Bengal. They have won so many MPs. Have they given you anything?"

The event set the tone for the messaging the Trinamool wanted to send out.

Mamata Banerjee's flagship scheme "Duarey Sarkar" has distributed over 10 lakh caste certificates for the Scheduled Castes and Tribes within a month. This initiative has to reach the ground and the IPAC comes into the picture here, Trinamool leaders say.

The IPAC is closely working with the party's SC/ST cell leaders to bring back the Scheduled Caste votes the BJP has been eyeing.

President of Trinamool's cell for the Scheduled Castes, Dr Tapas Mandal, said: "When a political representative goes to the people, he may not get the entire truth. But when an independent agency goes to the people, we will get unbiased information."

Conversation with Ms. Basmati Gagrai A Trailblazer in Empowering Tribal Communities

Ms.Basmati Gagrai, a remarkable social reformer. hails from Lamjhari, located in the Manjhari block of West Singhbhum district in the state of Jharkhand. Her roots in this region have deeply influenced her commitment to empowering tribal communities and fostering education and among awareness marginalized groups. Basmati's journey is truly inspiring. Overcoming significant challenges, including financial struggles, limited educational opportunities, and a traumatic assault at the age of 17, she demonstrated remarkable resilience and determination. Today, she is the founder of a residential school that provides holistic education to 330 children, from nursery to 7th standard. Beyond education, her efforts extend to raising

rights-based awareness among over 42,000 forestdwellers in the tribal regions of Jharkhand, empowering marginalized communities and fostering a brighter future. Ms.Gagrai's journey began humbly, with just four students under a tree during 2016. From this modest beginning, she

established a school that has since grown to impact the lives of many children now her school is registered as a public charitable trust under name Rural Development of Child education and Women empowerment (RDCEWE). Her vision, hard work, and determination transformed a small initiative into a institution, thriving empowering students with education and opportunities for a better

future. She visited our MS Engineering College in Bengaluru, and I had the conversation with her.



a school by quitting teaching job?

Ms. Basmati shared that the condition of her village and the surrounding areas in the district was much poorer compared to others. The children in her village had no access to proper education, and basic facilities were lacking. She felt a deep sense of responsibility to address these challenges and create an opportunity for the children in her community to receive an education. This drive to improve the lives of these children, who were otherwise deprived of educational opportunities, led her to take the bold step of founding a school.

The challenges she faced during school construction?

Ms. Basmati shared that her journey was filled with both physical and emotional obstacles. The greatest challenge was the resistance she encountered from her own community. Many villagers were not supportive of her efforts, with some even trying to sabotage the construction of the school. They feared the changes she represented and believed that educating children, particularly in a way that construction began, Ms. Basmati faced acts of vandalism, such as stones being thrown at the building, damaging walls

and windows. At night, groups of men would break into the construction site and steal materials like bricks, cement, and wood, setting back her progress. Every day, she would arrive at the site to find her work undone, and her vision slowly being dismantled. Alongside the physical challenges, Ms. Basmati also had to endure personal attacks. Rumors spread about her character, fueled by jealousy and the discomfort of seeing a woman in a leadership role. Some accused her of using the school project for personal gain, while others suggested she was being manipulated by outsiders. These rumors not only isolated her from parts of her community but also put her safety at risk. Despite the adversity, Ms. Basmati refused to back down. She continued to rebuild what had been destroyed, often doing the work herself, and sought support from sympathetic NGOs and nearby towns when materials were stolen. The

the value of her efforts, and her school became a symbol of courage, resilience, and the power of education.

When asked what gives her satisfaction?

Basmati shared that her greatest fulfillment comes from using her skills in fund and resource management construct five to classrooms for her school. These classrooms were built using locally available materials like mud, clay, and an asbestos roof, reflecting her commitment to and resourcefulness sustainability. She takes great pride in leading her village with the mindset of helping people, ensuring that everyone has access to education, and fostering a community-oriented approach. Ms.Basmati is particularly passionate women's about empowerment and

supporting those who are physically or economically disadvantaged. She shared the poignant story of a physically challenged woman who had been bitten by ants and rats. Basmati stepped in to provide food and care for her, embodying her compassion and dedication to improving the lives of the most vulnerable. Meeting Basmati and

more girls enrolled in the school. This was a significant shift in the community's mindset, and Ms. Basmati's persistence in advocating for girls' education played a vital role in breaking down the barriers that had previously kept many girls from attending school.

She noted that it reminded her of Shantiniketan, a renowned place celebrated for fostering learning in a calm, artistic setting. She appreciated how the college encourages not just academic learning, but also personal growth, creativity, and emotional well-being. Ms.Basmati praised the leadership of the college, particularly Dr. Rana Pratap Reddy, the Principal, and Mr. Sudarshan Raju, the Secretary. She emphasized that their vision and commitment have made the college a nurturing space where students can explore, think freely, and develop well-rounded into individuals. Ms. Basmati particularly admired how the college supports students in achieving not only academic success but also in becoming compassionate, thoughtful, and innovative individuals who can make a meaningful impact in the world. Her visit served as a powerful reminder that education goes beyond classrooms and textbooks.

Science of Yagya - Ashwini Guruji Dhyan Ashram **Role of maritime sector**

A Yagya is a means of direct interaction with the positive forces in creation. Vedas abound with descriptions of yagyas performed the rishis and munis to energise the manifested creation. Devas and devis would come to be a part of such yagyas. Asurs and daityas would also come...to disturb them. the Creation being a balance of the two forces, positive and negative.

Asurs are known to disrupt havan and create obstruction in invocation of devic forces. Even in the times when Rishi Agastya and Vishvamitra were in the body, asurs tried to disrupt the yagyas and havan performed by these rishis. Ram and Lakshman went with Rishi Vishvamitra to

protect one such yagya. The nature of a human being is to aid the positive forces, the devas and devis, by protecting the havan for the peace and prosperity of one's home, surroundings and creation at large.

Satyug was the time when devas and devis and rishis and munis would roam about freely on earth, since the positivity was at its peak. The present times, the times of kaliyug, are

times of heightened negativity and so, subtler energies like yogis and gurus are rare to find in the body, and devas and devis can only be accessed in their subtle forms by invoking positive aspect of creation through certain yogic practices and acts of charity and service.

Sanatan Kriya details the amazing science of yagyas as given by the vedic rishis to induce positivity in the body as well as surroundings. The practice involves making oblations to fire using specific chants. Fire, having the ability of transformation can transform the physical into the subtle and the mantras have the ability to manifest the ability and power of devas in the physical world and also have the power

at Dhyan Ashram routinely conduct such yagyas for purity of homes, environment and body, the manifestations are witnessed and recorded and their effects felt by one and all. If there is smoke in a yagya or any kind of unpleasantness, it

indicates the chants are incorrect or not done by an adept. Erroneous chants can have disastrous effects and do more harm than good, therefore one must ensure yagya is performed with correct chants and purity of ingredients and thoughts.

Zhang expressed the hope that the United States will work with China, based on the principles of mutual respect, peaceful coexistence, and win-win cooperation, to strengthen exchanges and cooperation between the two countries and the two militaries and inject certainty and positive energy into the world.

4 killed, 2 under cardiac arrest in SKorea's construction site fire

Seoul, Feb. 14 (UNI): Four people were killed and two others were left in cardiac arrest after fire broke out at a construction site in South Korea's southeastern port city of Busan on Friday, multiple media outlets said.

The fire broke out at about 10:51 a.m. local time (0151 GMT) at a hotel construction site in Busan, some 325 km southeast of the capital Seoul.

Among six people going into cardiac arrest, four people were confirmed dead later.

Earlier reports said eight people were in cardiac arrest in the fire.Before the fire outbreak, 10 workers were working inside the building.

The fire was believed to have started from insulation materials loaded near a swimming pool on the first floor

Iran rejects U.S. accusations of funding and arming Yemen's Houthis

Tehran, Feb 14 (UNI): Iran's permanent mission to the United Nations (UN) in New York has rejected the U.S. accusation that Tehran is providing the Yemenbased Houthis with financial resources, arms support, and military training.

Speaking at a UN Security Council briefing on Yemen on Thursday, Dorothy Shea, acting U.S. ambassador to the UN, said, "Iran's continued and unprecedented provision of weapons components, financial support, and training and technical assistance to the Houthis over more than a decade violates the arms embargo this council imposed on the group,' calling on the Security Council members to press Iran "to stop arming, funding, and training the Houthis."

In response to Shea's remarks, Iran's UN mission submitted a letter on Thursday to UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and Fu Cong, rotating president of the UN Security Council for February, Iran's official news agency IRNA reported. In the letter, the Iranian mission denounced the U.S. accusation as "unfounded," stressing Iran's principled policy has always been based on supporting peace and stability in Yemen and a political solution to the Arab state's crisis.

Jerusalem/Gaza, Feb 14 others sent back to their (UNI) Israel confirmed Friday that it has received a list of three hostages set to be released on Saturday from Hamas captivity in the Gaza Strip.Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office initially stated that the list was

"acceptable by Israel," but spokesman for Netanyahu later backtracked, clarifying that Israel had only received the list. "This is a purely factual description and does not reflect any Israeli position on the matter," the spokesman said. The list was delivered to Israel via Qatari and Egyptian mediators.According to a statement from Al-Qassam Brigades, the military wing of Hamas, the hostages are Alexander (Sasha) Troufanov, a 29-year-old Israeli-Russian civilian; Sagui Dekel-Chen, a 36year-old Israeli-American civilian; and Yair Horn, a 46year-old Israeli.

Meanwhile, Israeli army radio reported that 369 Palestinian prisoners will be released on Saturday. Among them, 333 will be its commitment to returned to Gaza, with 10 maintaining the ceasefire.

Trump to impose retaliatory tariffs on Canada, France over digital services taxes

Washington, Feb. 14 (UNI) : As U.S. President Donald Trump signed an executive order for reciprocal tariffs on Thursday, his administration planned to impose tariffs on Canada and France over their digital services taxes on U.S. technology giants.

Trump assigned his economic team the task of creating a plan to impose retaliatory tariffs on any country that had imposed duties on U.S. exports.

In June 2024, Canada began imposing a tax to address the challenge of taxing digital giants like Google's parent company Alphabet and Amazon.com, which are able to book their profits in low-tax countries.



The host nation tied the record for the most gold medals set by Kazakhstan at the 7th Asian Winter Games in Astana-Almaty in 2011. Harbin has embraced the Winter Asiad for the second time, having hosted the third edition 29 years ago.In 2007, China also hosted the 6th edition of the Games in Changchun. The 2029 Asian Winter Games will be held in Trojena, Saudi Arabia, marking the first time the event is hosted in West Asia.

With the Mariners' highscoring record at the venue and Kerala Blasters FC's renewed run of positive form, another high-octane clash looks set to play out in Kochi.Opponents have averaged a pass completion rate of only 63.9% in the opposition half when playing against Kerala Blasters FC, the lowest such rate in ISL 2024-25. The Kochi-based team themselves have the second-best pass

completion rate in this category (71.3%), trailing only Mumbai City FC (71.8%). It shows that they have been proactive in recovering possession from the other teams.

Adrian Luna (six assists this season) is one away from equaling his own record of most assists by a Kerala Blasters player in a single ISL campaign (7 in 2021-22). Luna has created 43 goal-scoring opportunities and made 35 passes per game at 80%


CR innovations recognised with 1st and 2nd prize by IRs
