Foreign currency worth Rs 22L seized at RGIA

Hyderabad, Feb 18 (UNI) : The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) seized foreign currency worth Rs 22 lakh from a passenger at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA), Shamshabad, on Tuesday.

The passenger, identified as Amir Ahmed, was travelling from Hyderabad to Dubai when CISF officials became suspicious and conducted a thorough inspection. Upon discovery of the undeclared currency, authorities immediately confiscated it and detained Ahmed for further questioning, airport official source said. Investigations are underway to determine the source and intended use of the foreign currency. Further details are awaited.

Govt inks MoU with Brazil's GOIAS Hub to promote startups

Hyderabad, Feb 18 (UNI) : Government entered into an agreement with Brazil's GOIAS hub for the promotion of Startups.

The T-Hub (Technology Hub), an innovation intermediary and business incubator, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) here on Tuesday with GOIAS Hub to set up international startups in partnership.

After Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and IT Minister Sridhar Babu held talks with Goias Hub representatives at HICC here, T-Hub Foundation CEO Sujith and Goias State Science Technology and Innovation Secretary Jose Frederico Lyra Netto signed the agreement. As per the agreement, Telangana startups will get opportunities to work in Brazil and the Brazil startups will launch their operations in Telangana State. The state government and Brazil cooperate mutually in the fields of Artificial Intelligence (AI), IT, Agri-Tech, Healthcare, Biotech and Mining. Along with market access, the two organisations—T-Hub and Goias—will work together on key issues such as capacity building, incubation, technology sharing, and improving investment opportunities.

This agreement will strengthen ties between India and the Brazilian and help to develop the startup ecosystem.

Govt committed to strengthening cybersecurity ecosystem: CM

Hyderabad, Feb 18 : Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy reaffirmed the state government's commitment to building a robust cybersecurity ecosystem by collaborating with experts, IT firms, and law enforcement agencies.

As a chief guest, speaking at the inauguration of the two-day Cyber Security Conclave 2025, SHIELD, organized by the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) and the Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC) at HICC, Madhapur, here on Tuesday, the Chief Minister stated, "My government has set a goal to make Telangana the number one state in cyber safety in the country."

He highlighted the significance of the event in addressing digital security challenges and the future of cybersecurity. "I congratulate the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau,

Cyberabad Police, and the Society for Cyberabad Security Council for organising this important event," he said.

Citing recent research, the Chief Minister revealed that cybercriminals stole Rs 22,812 crore in India last year, posing a significant threat to the economy and citizens. He also warned against the rising menace of fake news and misinformation on social media, which can disrupt societal harmony.

Revanth Reddy emphasized the government's efforts to bolster cybersecurity, including the launch of seven new specialized cyber crime police stations in the past year. He urged citizens to utilize the 24/7 cyber helpline 1930 for reporting cyber frauds.

"Telangana is one of the few states with a fully operational Cyber Security Bureau and a dedicated cyber crime helpline to

protect citizens. We are committed to making Telangana a secure business hub," he stated.

He commended the Director General of Police and the Cyber Security Bureau team for their initiatives and called for continued collaboration between law enforcement, academia, and cybersecurity experts to enhance cyber safety in the state.

In his guest of honour, IT and Industry Minister D Sridhar Babu welcomed cybersecurity experts and officials from 14 states, highlighting the need for collaboration and sharing best practices to combat digital threats.

"As the world looks to India, and Hyderabad in particular, for technological advancements, we must proactively address cybersecurity challenges," he stated.

He lauded the efforts of

the Cyber Security Bureau in preventing cyber fraud worth Rs 350 crore, recovering Rs 185 crore, and mitigating financial losses. Recognizing the evolving nature of cyber threats, he underscored the importance of indigenous cybersecurity capabilities, reducing reliance on imported security solutions, and investing in AI-driven defenses.

The minister also referenced global cyber incidents, including the CrowdStrike attack, which disrupted essential services worldwide, underscoring the vulnerabilities in critical infrastructure. He stressed that cybersecurity is now a crucial aspect of national security, requiring a shift from traditional approaches to a proactive, technology-driven strategy.

He noted that cybercriminals increasingly target data rather than just

Mumbai, Feb 18 (UNI) : Podcaster Ranveer Allahbadia, facing multiple FIRs (first information report) for his alleged offensive remarks on the YouTube show 'India's Got Latent', will deposit his passport to Thane police station in neighbouring city, following the direction of the Supreme Court which granted him interim protection from arrest on Tuesday, a member of his legal team said here.

Apex court bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kottiswar Singh while granting bail directed Allahbadia to deposit his passport at the Thane police station, saying he shall not leave India without the court's prior nod.

It may be recalled that during an episode of India's Got Latent, hosted by comedian Samay Raina, Allahbadia made a crude joke that caught attention for being offensive.

The remark quickly triggered outrage, leading to FIRs being filed in two states — Maharashtra and Assam. While the show was intended for a limited audience, clips went viral, intensifying the backlash. As criticism mounted, Allahbadia issued a public apology, admitting that he overstepped. In response to the controversy, Samay Raina removed all videos of the show to curb further scrutiny.

He is also committed to a strong India-Qatar friendship. This visit is even more special because we have elevated our ties to a Strategic Partnership.

"Trade featured prominently in our talks. We

want to increase and diversify India-Qatar trade linkages. Our nations can also work closely in sectors like energy, technology, healthcare, food processing, pharma and green hydrogen," the PM said.

The list of outcomes included:

*Elevation of India-Qatar bilateral relationship to Strategic Partnership

*The two sides are to set up Two Joint Ministerial Commissions at the level of Foreign Ministers and Ministers of Commerce and Industry

Midnight selection of new CEC is disrespectful, discourteous: Rahul Gandhi slams govt

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) : Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday slammed the government's "midnight decision" to select Gyanesh Kumar as the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and called it "disrespectful and discourteous".

On his social media handle X, Rahul Gandhi said, "By violating the Supreme Court order and removing the Chief Justice of India from the committee, the (Narendra) Modi Government has exacerbated the concerns of hundreds of millions of voters over the integrity of our electoral process". He further said that he had

presented his "dissent note" to Prime Minister Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah during the meeting of the committee to select the next Election Commissioner. In the dissent note, Gandhi stated, "The most fundamental aspect of an independent Election Commission free from executive interference is the process of choosing the Election Commissioner and Chief Election Commissioner".

"As the LoP it is my duty to uphold the ideals of Babasaheb Ambedkar and the founding leaders of our nation and hold the government to account. It is both disrespectful and

discourteous for the PM and HM to have made a midnight decision to select the new CEC, when the very composition of the committee and the process is being challenged in the Supreme Court and is due to be heard in less than forty-eight hours," he said.

It may be mentioned that late Monday night, the government through a notification appointed Gyanesh Kumar as the 26th Chief Election Commissioner of India with effect from February 19.

Moreover, the government has also appointed Vivek Joshi, a 1989-batch Haryana-cadre IAS officer, as Election Commissioner.

Major mishap averted as Blue Dart Cargo plane makes emergency landing at RGIA

Hyderabad, Feb 18 (UNI) : A major accident was narrowly avoided at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA), Shamshabad here on Tuesday after a Blue Dart cargo plane travelling from Chennai to Hyderabad encountered a landing gear malfunction.

The pilot, upon noticing the issue, immediately alerted airport authorities and requested permission for an emergency landing. In response, officials halted all international flights to ensure a safe landing. Displaying exceptional skill, the pilot managed to land

the aircraft safely, Airport official sources said.

There were six people on board at the time of the incident, and fortunately, all escaped unharmed. The successful emergency landing brought a sigh of relief to both airport staff and passengers.

SILF and CII announce knowledge paper on legal frameworks

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) The Society of Indian Law Firms (SILF) and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) National Committee on Legal Services successfully hosted the first-ever SILF-CII ESG & Climate Law Day on Tuesday (February 18), marking the beginning of an annual global initiative.

SC grants bail to Christian Michel in AgustaWestland case

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) The Supreme Court on Tuesday granted bail to British arms consultant, Christian James Michel, in the case registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in connection with the AgustaWestland chopper scam.

Michel had filed a Special Leave Petition challenging the Delhi High Court's September 25, 2024, order that denied him bail.

A bench, comprising Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta, granted bail on the condition that Michel must renew his passport and subsequently surrender it.

During the hearing, the matter was initially taken up in the morning but was deferred as the CBI's counsel sought additional time. When the Court expressed its inclination to grant bail, the CBI contended that Michel's plea was based on medical grounds. The Court postponed the hearing until after lunch, at which point it questioned the prolonged delay in trial proceedings.

Justice Nath asked the CBI counsel, "Why do you want him in custody after six years? You have filed a

chargesheet, and the investigation is complete."

The central agency responded that Michel was extradited to India, to which Justice Nath remarked, "What about the trial? You haven't even started the trial." Justice Mehta further stated, "It is your duty as the prosecutor. Who stopped you for the past six years?"

Michel's counsel, Advocate Aljo K Joseph, argued that the investigation was still incomplete and that the authorities continued to rely on international documents while placing the burden of delay on the accused.

The CBI requested the matter be heard on Friday to seek instructions on the status of the investigation and whether it intended to continue. However, the Court clarified that Michel would be granted bail, and the CBI could proceed with its investigation independently. Justice Mehta observed, "At this rate, you won't be able to conclude the trial even in the next 25 years."

In its order, the Court noted, "Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, particularly that the petitioner was

extradited in 2018 and has been in custody for more than six years, and that the CBI has filed three chargesheets and two supplementary chargesheets while the investigation remains ongoing, we are inclined to grant bail on conditions determined by the trial court. The CBI may request the trial court to impose necessary conditions before his release."

Michel was arrested in December 2018 following his extradition from Dubai. He is accused of acting as a middleman in alleged illegal transactions related to the VVIP chopper scam.

The CBI has alleged that the deal, signed on February eight, 2010, for the procurement of VVIP helicopters worth \$556.262 million, caused an estimated loss of \$398.21 million (approximately Rs 2,666 crore) to the Indian exchequer. The Enforcement Directorate (ED) had filed a chargesheet against Michel in June 2016, alleging that he received \$30 million (around Rs 225 crore) from AgustaWestland.

Advocates Sreeram Parakkat and M S Vishnu Shankar also represented the petitioner in the case.

Navika Sagar Parikrama II: INS Tarini reaches Port Stanley

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) : The Indian Naval Sailing Vessel (INSV) Tarini entered Port Stanley on Tuesday, completing the third and most challenging phase of Navika Sagar Parikrama II, a pioneering expedition showcasing the resilience, courage, and skill of the Indian Navy's women officers. This marks a significant milestone in the vessel's journey of circumnavigating the globe. During the phase, the vessel experienced three cyclones, while passing through Point Nemo, known as the Oceanic Pole of Inaccessibility, an Indian

Navy statement said. They also passed through the treacherous waters of Drake Passage before crossing Cape Horn.

The Navika Sagar Parikrama initiative underscores the Indian Navy's commitment to gender empowerment and maritime excellence. The expedition, crewed by two women officers, aims to promote ocean sailing, self-reliance, and India's rich maritime heritage. Their experiences serve as an inspiration for young aspirants, encouraging greater participation of women in maritime and defence sectors. INSV

Tarini embarked on its ambitious journey from Goa, navigating challenging sea conditions across the Indian, Atlantic, and Pacific Oceans. The vessel's safe arrival at Port Stanley is a demonstration of India's growing maritime reach and commitment to fostering global goodwill through Naval diplomacy.

The team is expected to interact with the local community, sharing insights about their voyage and India's Naval traditions. Following its stop in Port Stanley, INSV Tarini will continue its expedition, sailing through to Cape Town before returning to India.

Muslims condemn Waqf Board order on century-old Mumbai Minara Masjid

Mumbai, Feb 18 (UNI) : Days after the Maharashtra Board of Waqf approved the appointment of a new board of trustees to take over the management of century-old Minara Masjid, one of the most important mosques in the city, the Muslim community and political parties, including Samajwadi Party, have condemned the decision.

The iconic Minara Masjid at Mohammed Ali Road is a prominent landmark of the financial capital of the country.

The community as well as political outfits have slammed Junaid Sayed, the chief executive officer of the Waqf Board, for his unlawful and arbitrary step which can be template to involve other mosques in similar controversies.

The development comes at a time when the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024 introduced by the BJP-led NDA government at the

Centre, is still to become an Act. Samajwadi Party state president and MLA, Abu Asim Azmi, flagged the issue and is expected to raise the issue during the forthcoming budget session of the Maharashtra legislature and also move the Bombay High Court.

"It is an illegal order appointing new non-Memon community trustee in the more than a century-old Minara Masjid in Mumbai and violates the trust deed," Azmi said.

It is a complete arbitrary order as it has come without hearing the present trustees and non-Memons can't be appointed in the trust. The Minara Masjid Trust is a trust established under a scheme framed by the Bombay High Court in the year 1879. Thereafter, the Trust was transferred to the Bombay Charity Commissioner after the enactment of the Maharashtra Public Trust

Act, 1950, bearing registration number B-331. Since then, the Trust is being governed as per the Maharashtra Public Trust Act, 1950 and is in the nature of English Trust and hence the State Waqf Board does not have any jurisdiction to pass such an order. The allegation against the present trustees is that they have sold 83 properties unlawfully and illegally is totally false and frivolous. The trustees have taken consent from their 83 tenants of their chawl and are desirous of developing the said chawl after obtaining required no-objection certificate (NOC) from competent authorities.

Azmi said that he will personally visit the Minara Masjid shortly and will discuss the issue with prominent religious scholars such as Hazrat Khalid Ashraf, Hazrat Moinmiyan, Maulana Zahiruddin Khan Saheb and Saeed Noorie and decide the course of action.

NGT Flags rising faecal bacteria levels in Ganga at Prayagraj during Maha Kumbh

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) : The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has expressed serious concerns over increasing faecal bacteria levels in the Ganga at Prayagraj, particularly during the Maha Kumbh Mela. The findings were highlighted in a recent report submitted by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB). The key findings submitted by the CPCB report indicate that a significant rise in faecal coliform bacteria was observed during the Maha Kumbh Mela. According to the report, the river water quality failed to meet bathing standards

concerning Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD) during tests conducted on January 12-13. The water quality also did not conform to primary bathing standards regarding faecal coliform at multiple monitoring points.

The surge in faecal contamination was directly linked to the massive influx of pilgrims, especially on auspicious bathing days.

Despite the operational status of Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), contamination levels spiked sharply during the Shahi Snans and other major rituals. The report emphasised that the

sudden and overwhelming number of devotees taking a holy dip overloaded the existing waste management infrastructure, leading to an exponential rise in bacteria levels. Inadequate sewage disposal mechanisms and improper waste handling were also cited as contributing factors to the declining water quality.

In response to the alarming pollution levels, the NGT, led by Justice Prakash Shrivastava (former Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court), has summoned officials from the Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board (UPPCB) to explain the measures taken

to control water pollution.

The tribunal had earlier directed the UPPCB to submit a detailed compliance report, but the board only provided water quality test results, which confirmed high faecal contamination. Dissatisfied with the partial response, the NGT has granted additional time for submission of a comprehensive report and mandated the presence of key UPPCB officials in the next hearing scheduled for February 19. The monitoring of water quality and sewage treatment at Prayagraj has been under strict NGT oversight since December 2024.

Ensure smooth Ramzan arrangements without any hiccups: Ponnam Prabhakar

Hyderabad, Feb 18 : Transport and Hyderabad In-charge Minister Ponnam Prabhakar asked the officials on Tuesday to ensure smooth Ramzan arrangements without any hiccups.

He held a review meeting at the Dr B R Ambedkar Secretariat, here to discuss preparations for the upcoming month of Ramzan, which begins on March 2.

The meeting focused on various arrangements for the month of Ramzan. GHMC Commissioner Ilambarti highlighted special measures being taken for cleanliness throughout the city, with dedicated sanitation teams being deployed at mosques and Eidgahs.

He assured that street lights would be repaired, temporary lights would be installed, and road repairs would be completed. Special focus is being placed on Mecca Masjid, Royal Mosque, and Miralam Eidgah, with all work being executed on a priority basis. The GHMC entomology team has also been conducting fogging to prevent mosquitoes at



night. Plastic covers are being distributed at mosques, and a control room has been set up, with special officers appointed for coordination across all departments. Water Works MD Ashok Reddy mentioned that water packets have been made available at mosques and Eidgahs, with special tankers deployed to meet the drinking water needs.

Drainage repairs along routes leading to mosques are also underway. Electricity officials announced that mobile transformers would be installed to meet the increased demand for power during the summer months, and emergency staff would be available 24/7 at mosques during Eid.

The R&B department confirmed that they were

ready to set up tents at mosques and install barricades for crowd management. Dairy officials assured that milk supplies would meet the demands of the community during Ramzan. JAD officials confirmed that instructions had been issued to Muslim employees to complete their duties by 1600 hours.

MLAs and MLCs urged police officers to manage disruptions during Ramzan and allow street vendors to operate until midnight. They emphasized the importance of smooth traffic management during the festival.

Minister Ponnam Prabhakar instructed medical officials to implement special measures to ensure health and safety, including setting up health

camps at Eidgahs and mosques.

He also directed that medical personnel be available at all times. Additionally, Civil Supply officials were instructed to ensure timely distribution of rations to Muslim residents to facilitate smooth celebrations during Ramzan. The meeting was attended by Government Advisor Shabbir Ali, GHMC Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi, Telangana Minority Welfare Special Secretary Tausif Iqbal, MLAs, MLCs, Fahim Qureshi (Vice Chairman of Minority Residential Institutions), Telangana Waqf Chairman Syed Azmatullah Hussaini, Haj Committee Chairman Syed Ghulam Afzal Biyabani, Minority Finance Corporation Chairman Obetullah Kotwal, Minority Commission Chairman Tariq Ansari, Urdu Academy Chairman Taharbin Hamdan, BC Corporation Chairman Nuthi Srikanth Goud, GHMC Commissioner Ilambarti, Hyderabad Collector Anudeep Durashetti, Water Works MD Ashok Reddy, and various other officials, according to an official statement.

Chairman of Mumbai division of the board Rajendra Ahire said that the issue came to light during a surprise visit of anti-copying flying squads of the board at the Om Sai Junior College in Nalasopara.

"Flying squads select random exam centres to pay visits.

During one such visit on Monday, flying-squad members spotted a dummy candidate appearing for Physics paper held in the morning session.

It was detected during an impromptu hall-ticket verification by the members of the flying-squad," Ahire added.

Etala urges teachers to support BJP candidate in MLC elections

Khammam, Feb 18 : BJP MP from Telangana Etala Rajender on Tuesday alleged that teachers in Telangana have suffered under both the incumbent Congress government and the BRS regime that preceded it.

Talking to mediapersons here as part of the Khammam, Nalgonda, and Warangal teacher MLC election campaign, Rajender claimed that five tranches of DA were pending and

retirement benefits of teachers have been delayed for over 15 months.

He further alleged that while the Central government allowed states to opt out of the CPS pension system, neither former Chief Minister KCR nor the incumbent Revanth Reddy took action.

Highlighting BJP's commitment, Rajender claimed that the Narendra Modi government at the Centre is supporting the middle class by providing income tax concessions and

has allocated Rs 4 lakh crore in the 2024-25 budget to tackle unemployment.

He also compared the infrastructure improvements under Modi's leadership to the pre-2014 era, emphasising the development of highways, airports and railways. Rajender called for a scientific caste census at the state level. He wondered why, despite ruling for over 45 years, Congress never appointed a Backward Class Chief Minister in Telangana.

Govt urges centre's intervention in Krishna water dispute

Hyderabad, Feb 18 : Government on Tuesday demanded immediate intervention of the central government in the Krishna Water dispute to prevent any injustice to Telangana state. Speaking at the 2nd All India State Water Ministers' Conference, 2025, organised by the Ministry of Jal Shakti at Udaipur, Telangana Irrigation Minister Capt N

Uttam Kumar Reddy urged the Centre to take steps to stop Andhra Pradesh from illegally diverting Krishna River water from the foreshore of Srisailem Dam and Nagarjuna Sagar Right Bank. Uttam also insisted on the installation of 'telemetry instruments' to monitor Krishna River water usage and called for an early resolution of the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal (KWDT-II) case to safeguard Telangana's rightful share.

The Minister urged the Centre to fully bear the cost of desilting and desedimentation of all major and minor irrigation projects in the state, in line with support provided to similar projects in other states.

He also pressed for the early completion of the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) inquiry into the Medigadda project, requesting a clear written recommendation from the Centre on the way forward.

He pointed out that the Telangana government had initiated desilting and

desedimentation efforts across major and medium irrigation projects as per the central framework and sought financial assistance from the Centre for these initiatives. Regarding the NDSA investigation into the Medigadda project, he noted that the inquiry had been pending for several months and requested the Ministry of Jal Shakti's intervention to ensure swift completion and a clear course of action for the Telangana government.

Highlighting Telangana's ambitious Musi Riverfront Development Project, which covers 55 km of the river through Hyderabad, Uttam urged the Centre to provide full financial support, similar to the assistance extended to the Ganga and Yamuna rejuvenation projects.

He stressed that the

initiative aims to restore river ecology, improve sewage management, and enhance urban infrastructure while ensuring sustainable water management for Hyderabad.

Uttam sought Rs 4,000 crore for the establishment of trunk and interceptor sewer networks along the Musi River and an additional Rs 6,000 crore to link the Godavari River with Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar reservoirs. He emphasised that this linkage would secure Hyderabad's drinking water supply while also ensuring the rejuvenation of the Musi River.

Light to moderate rain likely in Telangana

Hyderabad, Feb 18 (UNI) : Light to moderate rain or thundershowers is likely to occur at isolated places in Telangana from February 21 to 25, Meteorological Centre said on Tuesday.

In a daily weather report here, it said that haze or mist

They welcomed the holding of the first meeting of the Joint Business Council on 13 February 2025. They agreed to explore the possibility of entering into a bilateral Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement. Both sides set the target to double bilateral trade by 2030. The Indian side welcomed the decision of Qatar Investment Authority (QIA) to open an office in India.

Both sides expressed satisfaction with the progress made by the Joint Task Force on Investments during its first meeting in June 2024, where various avenues for investments in India were discussed.

The Qatar side expressed interest to explore investment opportunities in different

sectors, including infrastructure, technology, manufacturing, food security, logistics, hospitality, and other areas of mutual interest. In this regard, the Qatar side announced a commitment to invest USD 10 billion in India. The two sides welcomed convening of the Joint Business Forum inaugurated by the Ministers of Commerce and Industry of both countries on 18 February 2025.

Both sides emphasized the importance of trade exhibitions as a strategic platform for promoting commercial partnerships

The two sides welcomed the operationalization of India's Unified Payment Interface (UPI) in QNB's Points of Sales in Qatar and looked forward to implement nation-wide roll-out of UPI acceptance in Qatar. They also agreed to explore settlement of bilateral trade in respective currencies. QNB's expansion is also welcomed in India through setting up of an office in GIFT City.

The two sides shall work to further enhance bilateral energy cooperation, including through promotion of trade and mutual investments in energy infrastructure and regular meetings of the relevant stakeholders from both sides, including the Joint Task Force on Energy.

The two leaders unequivocally condemned terrorism in all its forms and manifestations including cross-border terrorism and agreed to cooperate in combating this menace through bilateral and multilateral mechanisms.

(Contd from page 1) financial assets, making cybersecurity a top priority for individuals, businesses, and governments. He highlighted that India loses approximately USD 10 trillion annually due to cybercrimes, with reported losses in India exceeding Rs 15,000 crore last year.

To address these concerns, Telangana is set to launch a new cybersecurity policy aligned with India's Digital Personal Data Protection Law and establish a Cyber Defense Center (TGDCD) in Hyderabad.

The government is also fostering partnerships with multinational companies and academic institutions to enhance cybersecurity awareness and capabilities.

The minister emphasised the role of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in cybersecurity, recognizing both its potential benefits and risks. He called for deliberations on AI-driven cyber threats, such as AI-powered malware, phishing, and automated attacks, and stressed the need for proactive AI-based security measures.

Additionally, Telangana is investing in data center infrastructure, with a target of achieving one gigawatt of data center capacity, positioning the state as a leader in digital infrastructure.

"The digital world is both an opportunity and a threat. We must ensure robust cybersecurity measures to protect our citizens and industries while fostering innovation," he added.

Indian graduates show strong aptitude for AI, ML roles

Indian graduates are demonstrating a strong aptitude for roles in the fields of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML), according to a report.

The report by talent assessment firm Mercer Mettl showed that Indian graduates had a 46.1 per cent employability rate in the fields of AI and ML -- the highest among all technical roles.

The report, encompassing data from more than 2700 campuses and over 1 million learners, reveals a complex landscape of both promising adaptability and persistent skill gaps.

It also found that 50 per cent of graduates in India possess soft skills needed for AI/GenAI collaboration, but they needed improvement in creativity (44.3 per cent employability).

Communication skills (55.1 per cent), critical thinking (54.6 per cent), and leadership skills (54.2 per cent) were found to be strong areas. With a 46 per cent employability rate, learning agility is vital for navigating the evolving tech landscape.

Further, the report showed that Tier 1 college graduates are the lead in employability (48.4 per cent), followed by Tier 2 (46.1 per cent) and Tier 3 (43.4 per cent) institutions, but the potential exists across all tiers, especially in specialised tech areas. Tier 2 college graduates were found to excel in UI/UX developer roles (58.3 per cent employability).

Delhi showed the highest employability (53.4 per cent), followed by Himachal Pradesh and Punjab (51.1 per cent). Uttarakhand and Jharkhand also performed well (50 per cent and 49.6 per cent respectively).

Notably, the report found equal employability for male and female graduates in AI and ML sectors as well as in data science, but disparities were seen in software testing.

"In 2025, the employability rate for Indian graduates stands at 42.6 per cent, reflecting a slight decline from 44.3 per cent in 2023, primarily due to evolving industry expectations.

However, there has been significant progress in employability for technical roles as colleges and students increasingly focus on developing skills that meet market demands," said Siddhartha Gupta, President of Mercer India. "On the other hand, the development of certain non-technical and soft skills presents a more complex learning curve, often requiring additional time to cultivate. This data clearly underscores these trends," he added.

The World Day or Social Justice is celebrated every year on the 20th February. It has been started by the UN to create awareness that even today, there are many people who are unable to get an equal opportunity to lead a better life. The aim of the event is to promote fairness. Fairness means equal access to the same standards or education, health care and all public services. This access must be fair ie no person should be denied access merely by reason of caste, race, religion, gender or class. Social justice refers to the equitable distribution of resources, opportunities, and privileges within a society. Every year this day is celebrated with a view to raise awareness and promote practical solutions to address the issues of poverty, exclusion, gender inequality and social injustice.

In the context of India, the Indian Railways which is one of the largest railway networks in the world weaves an intricate matrix of connectivity across the length and breadth of the country.

With its railway lines reaching out to some of the remotest parts of the country, it provides the most accessible and inexpensive method of travel to many people. This tangled web of railway lines unites all Indians into one single thread. In the vast expanse of its trains and stations, millions of Indians irrespective of caste, race, religion, gender or class meet, intermingle and bond. The Railway Protection Force (RPF) plays a pivotal role in ensuring the safety

and security of all these passengers.

The very essence of social justice lies in ensuring that all individuals have equal access to rights, resources, opportunities and protection. It encourages fairness, inclusivity and the dismantling of barriers that hinder the right to equal opportunity. Social justice is not just legal fairness, it also involves access to social goods such as health, education, employment and above all, security. Within this broad framework, the role of various institutions, including law enforcement agencies is vital in ensuring that no individual is denied equal access to these services. In this context, the role of agencies like the Railway Protection Force is crucial in maintaining not just security of railway property and passengers but also in upholding the social justice that is the basic right of every individual.

The Railway Protection Force (RPF) is an armed force of the Union entrusted with the responsibility of securing the country's vast railway network.

Beyond the enforcement of law, the RPF plays a crucial role in the broader concept of social justice by ensuring that the rights of vulnerable populations are respected, protected, and upheld within its specific sphere of influence.

The Indian railway system serves millions daily, with a significant portion being women, children, senior citizens, and individuals from marginalized communities.

The RPF stands as a shield for these vulnerable passengers, protecting them from crimes such as theft, harassment, and even violence. By ensuring their safety, RPF works towards a more equitable and just society, where all individuals can travel without fear.

The RPF has been proactive in safeguarding the rights of every passenger during travel on the railways. This includes ensuring equal treatment for people with disabilities. The RPF has been conducting relentless drives in coaches reserved for persons with disabilities and prosecuting regular passengers who encroach upon the facilities provided for them. In the year 2024, RPF, has prosecuted 95,175 such people.

Another vulnerable group of passengers traveling on Indian Railways are women passengers. By proactive deployment in coaches reserved for ladies, RPF has ensured the safety of female passengers, especially when traveling at odd hours. To make women passengers feel safer, RPF regularly prosecutes men traveling in coaches reserved for women. In the year 2024, RPF has prosecuted 1,02,130 such male passengers. RPF has launched the "Meri Saheli Initiative" with its focus on women passengers traveling alone.

There are more than 250 Meri Saheli teams who are instrumental in providing a safer environment for female passengers.

Similarly, RPF has

undertaken an initiative called Operation MatriShakti to assist pregnant women who go into labour during train journeys. In the year 2024 alone, lady RPF personnel have assisted in 174 childbirths.

RPF has launched Operation AAHT to ensure that women and children do not fall prey to human trafficking. RPF personnel actively collaborate with other law enforcement agencies to rescue trafficked individuals, especially those who are being exploited for forced labour or prostitution. In the year 2024, RPF has rescued 826 persons from the clutches of traffickers through Operation AAHT.

There are several lost or abandoned children in contact with railways who are in need of care and protection.

If such children are not rescued or rehabilitated there is a high probability that they will fall prey to drug peddlers and criminal gangs.

Through Operation Nanhe Farishtey, RPF rescues such children and ensures their rehabilitation in collaboration with Ministry of Women and Child Development. RPF has rescued 14,756 children through Operation Nanhe Farishtey in the year 2024.

RPF lady personnel also play a crucial role in rescuing adults, including women, in need of care and protection.

These individuals may be runaways, abandoned elderly, drug addicts, destitute, or needing medical assistance. RPF rescues such individuals and hands them over to NGO's for rehabilitation. In

Supreme Court slams Allahabadia for using

New Delhi, Feb 18 (UNI) : The Supreme Court on Tuesday expressed its angst with the language used by YouTuber Ranveer Allahabadi during an episode of the online show India's Got Latent, calling it "dirty" and "perverted." and barred him and his associates from airing any shows till further orders.

The top court, however, granted Allahabadi - popularly known as Beer Biceps - interim protection from arrest in connection with multiple FIRs filed in Mumbai, Guwahati, and Jaipur over the alleged obscene remarks made by him during the particular episode of the YouTube show. A division bench comprising Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh instructed Allahabadi to surrender his passport as part of the conditions of relief.

The court issued the interim order while seeking a response from the authorities on Allahabadi's petition challenging the multiple FIRs.

The court also directed that no further FIRs be registered concerning the same YouTube show. However, the relief is conditional upon Allahabadi - popularly known as Beer Biceps - cooperating with the investigation. Additionally, the bench granted him the liberty to seek police protection in case of threats.

The court ordered that Allahabadi and his associates refrain from airing any shows until further orders.

Despite granting interim relief, the apex judiciary harshly criticised Allahabadi's language, calling it "dirty" and "perverted", and said "there is something dirty in his mind".

Justice Kant confronted Allahabadi's counsel, Advocate Abhinav Chandrachud, questioning, "Are you defending this kind of language?"

In response, Chandrachud admitted that he found the remarks "disgusting" but argued that the issue at hand was whether they amounted to a criminal offence. He cited the Apoorva Arora judgment, which held that profanity alone does not constitute obscenity.

However, Justice Kant remained unconvinced, stating, "If this is not obscenity, then what is? Does the Apoorva Arora judgment give a licence to say anything?"

The bench also engaged in a discussion over the multiple FIRs lodged against Allahabadi. When Chandrachud argued that multiple FIRs for the same offence were legally untenable, citing the TT Antony case, Justice Kant countered that the nature of the complaints differed, with one FIR specifically concerning alleged derogatory remarks about Arunachal Pradesh. The court expressed serious disapproval of the YouTuber's statements, stating, "There is something very dirty in his mind, which has been vomited in this programme... He is insulting his parents. Why should courts favour him?"

2 IEDs detected & destroyed in south Kashmir

Srinagar, Feb 18 (UNI) : Security forces on Tuesday averted major tragedies by detecting and destroying two improvised explosive devices (IED) in south Kashmir, officials said.

The two IEDs were found in Pulwama and its neighboring district.

A suspicious object was found at at Kashiwa Road, Chitragam, Shopian by a joint team of Army and police.

The object later turned out to be an IED, which was destroyed by the Bomb Disposal Squad (BDS).

Army said the detection of IED averted a major terror incident.

"Chinar Warriors and @JmuKmrPolice averted a major terror incident today by recovering and destroying an IED at Kashiwa Road, Chitragam, Shopian. Indian Army remains resolute in its commitment to keep Kashmir terror-free," Army Srinagar based Chinar Corps said. Another IED was found at Nagbari, Pulwama during a search operation that was launched following a specific input. "Based on specific intelligence input, joint search operation was launched by Indian Army and @JmuKmrPolice. During the search, an IED was recovered and destroyed in-situ at Nagbari, Pulwama. Indian Army remains resolute in its commitment to keep Kashmir terror-free," Army said. Last week J&KLt Governor Manoj Sinha chaired back-to-back security review meetings in Srinagar and Jammu to devise more effective security measures to tackle the militancy in the union territory.

U.S., Russia agree to appoint negotiating teams for further consultations on Ukraine

Riyadh, Feb 18 (UNI) Talks between Russian and U.S. delegations led by Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov and U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio, respectively, concluded in the Saudi capital Riyadh on Tuesday. Yuri Ushakov, the Kremlin's foreign affairs adviser, described the Riyadh talks as "positive." He said, "It was a serious conversation on all issues," noting the two sides agreed to take into account each other's interests.

Both sides agreed to appoint high-level negotiating teams to work towards a settlement to the conflict in Ukraine "as soon as possible in a way that is enduring, sustainable, and acceptable to all sides," according to a statement by the U.S. Department of State.

Besides, they agreed to establish a consultation mechanism to address irritants to the bilateral relationship to finally normalize the operation of the two countries' respective diplomatic missions, and to lay the groundwork for "future cooperation" between the two sides, said the U.S. statement.

China welcomes Russia-US talks in Riyadh : Foreign Ministry

Beijing, Feb 18 (UNI) : Beijing welcomes all efforts to achieve peace, including the current negotiations between Russia and the United States in Riyadh, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Guo Jiakun said on Tuesday. High-level delegations from Russia and the United States started negotiations in Riyadh earlier in the day. The negotiations are taking place at one of the Saudi royal family's palaces, the Diriyah Palace. "We welcome all efforts aimed at achieving peace, including the consensus on peace talks reached by the United States and Russia," Guo told reporters. China expects that all parties concerned will be involved in Ukraine peace talks in a timely manner, the diplomat added.

Russian FM says U.S. can help resolve Ukraine conflict

Moscow, Feb. 18 (UNI) : Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said Monday that the United States could help resolve the Ukrainian conflict, citing its "central role" since the fighting began nearly three years ago.

Lavrov's remarks came ahead of his meeting with U.S. representatives, set for Tuesday in Saudi Arabia. The Kremlin said the two sides are expected to hold talks on negotiating an end to the conflict, which would pave the way for a meeting between U.S. President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Lavrov said that he does not expect the Europeans to have a seat at the negotiating table, accusing them of seeking to use a potential ceasefire to enable Ukraine to continue the conflict.

He added that Moscow rejects any discussions on territorial concessions to Ukraine during potential negotiations. The United States had previously urged both Russia and Ukraine to make concessions for peace. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Monday that Kiev will not attend the upcoming U.S.-Russia negotiations, refusing to accept any result that excludes Ukraine.

Netanyahu orders immediate implementation of law banning UNRWA

Jerusalem, Feb 18 (UNI) : Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has ordered immediate implementation of a law banning the activities of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), the prime minister's office said.

"Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has directed that the UNRWA law, which was passed by the Knesset with broad support, be enforced immediately. There are no restrictions on the implementation of the Prime Minister's directive," the office said on X on Monday.

In late October, the Israeli parliament passed bills aimed at banning UNRWA activities in Israel and the territories it controls after accusing some UNRWA staff of involvement in the October 2023 Hamas attack. The UN says Israel has not provided any evidence to substantiate its allegations.

On January 29, Israeli government spokesman David Mentzer said that UNRWA offices were to be closed within 48 hours and that all contacts with the UN aid agency would be suspended. On January 30, the law banning UNRWA activities came into force.

Chinese military warns off Philippine aircraft from territorial airspace over Huangyan Dao

Guangzhou, Feb 18 (UNI) : Naval and air forces of the Chinese People's Liberation Army Southern Theater Command on Tuesday tracked, monitored and warned off a Philippine C-208 aircraft from the territorial airspace over China's Huangyan Dao in accordance with the law and regulations, a Chinese military spokesperson said. "Without the approval of the Chinese government, the Philippine aircraft illegally intruded into Chinese airspace," according to Tian Junli, spokesperson for the theater command, who added that the Philippine side had also spread false narratives. The acts of the Philippine side severely violated China's sovereignty as well as international law and Chinese law, Tian noted. Huangyan Dao is China's inherent territory, and the Philippines' attempts to assert illegal territorial claims through military provocations and mislead international understandings through agitation and hyping will ultimately prove futile, according to the spokesperson.

Russia terminates agreement with Ukraine on navigation safety in Azov Sea

Moscow, Feb. 18 (UNI) : Russia has officially terminated an agreement with Ukraine on ensuring navigation safety in the Azov Sea and the Kerch Strait, according to an official document published Monday on the country's legal information portal.

The decision was formalized through an order signed by Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin. "In accordance with Paragraph 1 of Article 37 of the Federal Law on International Treaties of the Russian Federation, the agreement between the Government of the Russian Federation and the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine on measures to ensure the safety of navigation in the Azov Sea and the Kerch Strait, signed in Moscow on March 20, 2012, is hereby terminated," the document reads. The Russian Foreign Ministry has been instructed to notify Ukraine of the termination.

3 found dead on snow in mountains in northeast Japan

Tokyo, Feb. 18 (UNI) : Three people were confirmed dead after being found collapsed on the snow in the mountains of Fukushima City in northeast Japan on Tuesday.

According to local authorities, at around 8:30 p.m. local time on Monday, a hotel employee at Takayu Onsen in Fukushima City, reported that "three employees who went into the mountains have not returned."

The three men, hotel employees in their 50s and 60s, entered the mountains at around 2 p.m. local time on Monday to manage the hot spring source, but had not returned by nightfall.

Police and firefighters began their search on Tuesday morning, and the three men were found collapsed on the snow by noon. A doctor who accompanied them confirmed the deaths of all three at the scene, according to the fire department. There is a high concentration of hydrogen sulfide near the site, and it is possible that the three had inhaled the gas, local media reported.

The police are currently investigating the incident.

Over 30 people die after bus falls into chasm in Bolivia

Buenos Aires, Feb 18 (UNI) : Thirty-one people have died as a result of a bus falling into a chasm in the department of Potosi in southern Bolivia, Bolivian media reported.

In addition, 15 people have been injured as a result of the accident, La Razon newspaper reported on Monday.

The report added that the bus fell into a chasm 800 meters (0.5 miles) deep. Among the injured are two children, who are in serious condition.

EU wants to create new fund for military aid to Ukraine : Reports

Warsaw, Feb 18 (UNI) : The European Union wants to create a new fund for military aid to Ukraine, Polish website money.pl reported.

The creation of the fund will be discussed by ambassadors of EU member states on Tuesday, the fund may be established this year, the publication said. It is noted that the main goal of creating this fund is "to meet Ukraine's most pressing defense needs, such as artillery ammunition, air defense systems and support for the Ukrainian defense industry."

According to the publication, the fund should be filled from two

sources: contributions from member states, which will be proportional to their national income, that is, taken into account on the same principle as contributions to the EU budget, as well as profits from frozen Russian assets, estimated to be up to 900 million euros this year.

It is noted that the new initiative provides for a "flexible approach to spending funds" aimed at "respecting the status of some EU countries, for example, those that maintain neutrality in military matters."

Among the priority areas of the fund's activities are the supply of large-caliber artillery ammunition

(at least 1.5 million shells), the supply of air defense systems and long-range missiles, training and equipping the Ukrainian army. It is emphasized that participation in the initiative should be voluntary, since past experience shows that otherwise some EU states, such as Hungary, could veto it. After the start of the Russian special operation in Ukraine, the EU and the G7 countries froze almost half of Russia's foreign exchange reserves, approximately 300 billion euros. More than 200 billion euros are in the EU, mostly in the accounts of the Belgium's Euroclear, one of the world's largest

clearing and settlement systems.

The Russian Foreign Ministry has repeatedly called the freezing of Russian assets in Europe theft, noting that the EU is targeting not just private funds, but also Russian state assets. Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said that Moscow would respond to the confiscation of frozen Russian assets by the West and also had the opportunity not to return the funds that Western countries kept in Russia.

Russia believes that arms supplies to Ukraine hinder the settlement, directly involving NATO countries in the conflict.

Musk unveils latest AI model Grok 3

San Francisco, Feb 18 (UNI) U.S. billionaire Elon Musk's artificial intelligence company, xAI, officially released its latest flagship AI model, Grok 3, on Monday night. Grok 3, claimed by Musk as the "smartest AI on Earth," can analyze images and respond to questions like OpenAI's GPT-4o and Google's Gemini, and serves as the core AI model powering various features on his social media platform X.

According to Musk, Grok 3 was trained at a massive data center in Memphis, Tennessee, which houses approximately 200,000 graphics processing units, and was developed with 10 times the computing power of its predecessor, Grok 2. It is a "maximally truth-seeking AI," said Musk during a live-streamed presentation.

AI claims that Grok 3 outperforms OpenAI's GPT-4o across math and science problem-solving benchmarks, such as AIME and GPQA.

Additionally, xAI has introduced two specialized models, Grok 3 Reasoning and Grok 3 mini Reasoning,

designed for complex problem-solving. These models function similarly to "reasoning" models like OpenAI's o3-mini and DeepSeek's R1.

To prevent distillation, a technique to extract knowledge from an existing model, Musk mentioned that certain aspects of Grok's reasoning process are intentionally obscured.

In addition, xAI introduced DeepSearch, a feature designed to perform comprehensive internet and X-based research to generate informative summaries. This functionality resembles OpenAI's deep research tool.

Grok will gain a "voice mode" as soon as about a week from now, Musk said. "When Grok 3 is mature and stable, which is probably within a few months, then we'll open-source Grok 2," he added.

Musk introduced Grok, a family of AI models developed by xAI, nearly two years ago, positioning it as an edgy and unfiltered model capable of addressing controversial topics that other AI systems might avoid.

Turkey informs US of readiness to host talks on Ukraine

Ankara, Feb 18 (UNI) : Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan told US Special Presidential Envoy for Russia and Ukraine Keith Kellogg and US Secretary of State Marco Rubio on the sidelines of the Munich Security Conference that Ankara was ready to host peace talks on Ukraine, the

Turkiye daily reported on Tuesday.

Fidan also met with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's chief of staff Andriy Yermak and Defense Minister Rustem Umerov. He told the Ukrainians that Turkey wanted to be part of the peace process. The top Turkish

diplomat reportedly argued that Ankara could contribute more to the talks than other actors because of its close relationship with both sides of the conflict. Russian President Vladimir Putin and US President Donald Trump spoke over the phone for nearly an hour and a half

last week. They discussed issues related to the exchange of Russian and US citizens, as well as the settlement of the conflict in Ukraine.

The call was followed up by in-person talks between senior Russian and US officials in the Saudi capital of Riyadh on Tuesday.

Sudanese govt says 433 killed in attacks by paramilitary forces

Khartoum, Feb 18 (UNI) : Sudan's government on Tuesday said that 433 civilians were killed in attacks by the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) on villages in White Nile State. "After the RSF militia realized its crushing defeat and its inability to face (fight against) the armed forces, it resorted to its usual method of revenge against unarmed civilians in villages and small towns," Sudan's Foreign Ministry said in a statement.

"In the past few days, the militia carried out a horrific massacre in the villages around the al-Gitaina area in White Nile State, with the death toll currently standing at 433, including infants," the ministry added.

It called on the international community to take a firm stance against the RSF's "crimes" against civilians,

nothing, "This massacre reaffirms that the militia's war is against the entire Sudanese people." While the RSF has not yet commented on the incidents, the Sudanese Emergency Lawyers, a non-governmental organization, reported multiple attacks over the past three days in three villages, including Al-Kadaris, Al-Khalwat, and Wad Bilal, all located near al-Gitaina, about 100 km south of Khartoum.

"These attacks have resulted in the deaths of over 200 people, including women and children, with hundreds injured and missing," the group said in a statement. Sudan has been gripped by a devastating conflict between the Sudanese Armed Forces and the RSF since mid-April 2023, which claimed more than 29,680 lives, according to the latest estimates by international organizations.

IAEA chief Grossi to start 3-day visit to Japan

Tokyo, Feb 18 (UNI) : International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Director General Rafael Grossi will travel to Japan with a working visit from February 18-20 as a guest of the Japanese Foreign Ministry.

Grossi will visit several nuclear facilities in Japan, including Tokyo Electric Power Company's (TEPCO) Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station and Interim Storage Facility in Fukushima Prefecture, as well as TEPCO's Kashiwazaki-Kariwa NPP in Niigata Prefecture.

In addition, Grossi will hold talks with Japanese Foreign Minister Iwaya Takeshi, and other Japanese government officials.

Israel confirms killing Hamas military official in Lebanon

Jerusalem, Feb. 18 (UNI) Israeli forces killed a Hamas military official in an airstrike in Lebanon, Israeli security officials said on Monday.

In a joint statement, the Israeli military and Shin Bet domestic security agency said warplanes "struck and eliminated" Mohammad Shaheen in Sidon, a coastal city in southern Lebanon.

The statement identified Shaheen as "the head of Hamas' Operations Department in Lebanon" and accused him of recently planning attacks against Israeli civilians from Lebanon under Iranian direction and funding. It also described him as a "significant source of knowledge" for rocket attacks from Lebanon.

Al Mayadeen, a Lebanon-based pro-Hezbollah broadcaster, reported that an Israeli drone strike targeted a car at the entrance to Sidon.

Video footage circulating on social media showed a vehicle on fire on a highway, with a black cloud of smoke rising from it. The strike comes a day before Israel is scheduled to complete its full withdrawal of troops from Lebanon under a ceasefire agreement that ended 14 months of fighting between Israel and Hezbollah. The Feb. 18 deadline was set after Israel and Lebanon agreed to postpone the original late-January deadline. However, Israel now insists on maintaining troops in five positions in southern Lebanon beyond the new deadline.

Iran, Sudan aim to promote bilateral

Tehran, Feb. 18 (UNI) : Iran and Sudan on Monday signed two memorandums of understanding (MoUs), aiming to enhance cooperation at both bilateral and regional levels, the official news agency IRNA reported.

The MoUs were signed by Iranian Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi and his Sudanese counterpart Ali Youssef Ahmed.

Flexible working hours make workers happy



The study found that people who become overworked are less satisfied with their lives and experience lower levels of psychological well-being.

The key factor to happiness, according to the study, was whether the hours people work reflect the hours they want to work.

The study, published in the journal Human Relations, examined the working time patterns and well-being levels of 20,000 individuals over an 18-year period.

The researchers found that more than 55 percent of workers who regularly work 50 or more hours a week would like to work less, as would around 40 percent of workers who work between 40 and 49

hours a week. "When workers are overworked - working more hours a week than they would like -- life satisfaction and psychological well-being deteriorate," said lead researcher professor Andy Charlwood.

"Thankfully, most workers who experience overwork are able to rearrange their lives so that the hours they work and the hours they want to work come back into balance." But around one in eight workers who become overworked are in the same situation two years later, and this appears to be a significant source of worry and unhappiness.

"To help protect our well-being levels, government and employer policies need to give workers greater flexibility to choose the hours that they work," Charlwood explained.

Though I dilly-dallied for two-three years fearing societal reactions, after giving birth, I realized that there were two types of people — those who looked away, and those who welcomed us with open arms. My colleagues not only took me to the hospital, but also got me discharged and looked after us. Yes, support was less, but it wasn't non-existent."

"I think it's very important for girls to be financially independent to take such a step," Kalidasi added. City schools, too, are equally open to accepting children of single mothers. Ranu Biswas, headmistress of the primary section of Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, said, "We still haven't received any application for admission of a child of a single mother. But if I do, such children would be treated on a par with other students." Sunita Sen, principal of The BSS School, added, "We welcome children of single parents. A child is a child, whether he has one parent or both. Our only concern is quality parenthood — whether the mother can give the child proper attention."

Revealing that her four-five-year stay in Europe had brought her in contact with a lot of single mothers, sowing the seed of an idea to become one herself, Anindita said her attempts to conceive started when she was 35, but it took her two-and-a-half years to get there. "I was scared of anonymous donors. My only priority was high IQ, as that's the only thing in a man that attracts me,"



A parent's

guide to dealing with a teen

While you've lived through your kid's 'terrible twos' that involved him/her crying for hours in the night, dealing with a teenager can lead to anxious times for many parents. Start early

There's no point telling your daughter about menstruation once she gets her first period. This would only make her press the panic button. Instead, start earlier. Answer the early questions that your kid has about his/her body, the difference between boys and girls or where

do babies come from. This will also stop your kid from surfing the internet trying to find answers.

Listen to your kid

According to Dr Pavan Sonar, the most common mistake parents make is that they often judge their kids. They expect their child



to act like an adult at this age and ridicule him/her for the smallest mistake. Dr Sonar says, "Parents should listen to what their kid has to say."

Don't pressurise

"Parents set standards for their child by talking about the things they used to do when they were of their kid's age. This is likely to add additional pressure on your child. Instead, it is important that you understand today's generation and set realistic expectations," says Chheda.

Empathise

If you are unable to understand your kid's situation as a parent, put yourself in his/her shoes. Understand that your teen is going through emotional stress and accept the fact that what may not be a big deal to you could be an issue for your child.

Communicate

A free, two-way communication between parents and kid is most important. Engage in activities that involve bonding with your child, be it going for movies or dinners together. Working parents, especially, find it difficult to spend sufficient time with their kid and this may lead to lack of communication. "A friendly environment will encourage your kid to share his/her worries with you. A parent's job is to show the right path in those situations, in non-authoritarian way," says Dr Sonar.

Meanwhile, in January, the NRU outlined the national team's preparations for the Africa Cup in July, a crucial step towards qualifying for the 2027 Rugby World Cup.

One of the key warm-up matches will be the match against the South African regional side Boland on February 22 in Windhoek, followed by two matches against the Blue Bulls, a South African professional rugby union team, the first on June 17 at a coastal venue to be announced and the second on June 21 in Windhoek.

Real Madrid favorite to reach Champions League last 16

Madrid, Feb 18 (UNI) : Real Madrid entertains Manchester City in the second leg of its Champions League play-off for a place in the last 16 at the Santiago Bernabeu on Wednesday night, after the defending champion won away in the first leg. Madrid has a 3-2 lead in the first leg after two late goals a week ago saw it take advantage of some chaotic defending from its rival, who had twice led thanks to goals from Erling Haaland. Manchester City appeared to return to form at the weekend with a 4-0 win at home to Newcastle United, with recent signings Nico Gonzalez and Omar Marmoush giving some new life to Pep Guardiola's side. Marmoush scored a first-half hat-trick, while Gonzalez helped bring the balance to the City's midfield that has been missing since Rodri suffered his cruciate knee ligament injury.

Guardiola was keen to stop any over-enthusiasm after the match, saying his team had just a "one percent" chance to overturn last weekend's defeat, and he will be without injured Manuel Akanji for the game, while Jack Grealish and Nathan Ake are also doubts after being forced out of last week's defeat due to injury.

Real Madrid goes into the game after a 1-1 draw against Osasuna which has seen the club yet again complain about refereeing decisions going against it, after Jude Bellingham was sent off for allegedly swearing at the referee.

The good news for Carlo Ancelotti is that his injury crisis in defense looks to be easing, with Antonio Rudiger and David Alaba both in with a chance of taking part on Wednesday.

Aurelien Tchouameni and Raul Asencio have both performed well in defense in recent games and could continue, while in attack, Kylian Mbappe, Vinicius Jr and Rodrygo will be ready to pounce on any errors from the City midfield and attack at pace.

Last week both sides showed they are able to score goals, but in the end Manchester City's leaky defense was the decisive factor, if Nico Gonzalez can give City more stability in midfield, the visitors have a slight chance of overturning Madrid's lead, but Real Madrid is clear favorite to reach the last 16.

Spain defeat India 4-3 in FIH Hockey Pro League

Bhubaneswar, Feb 18 (UNI) : Spain secured a 4-3 victory over India in the FIH Hockey Pro League 2024/25 (Women) at the Kalinga Stadium here on Tuesday.

Baljeet Kaur (19'), Sakshi Rana (38'), and Rutaja Dadaso Pisal (45') scored for India, while Estel Petchame (25', 49'), Sofia Rogoski (21'), and Captain Lucia Jimenez (52') netted goals for Spain.

Sakshi Rana and Jyoti Singh received their maiden senior international caps in the match, with the former scoring an impressive goal on her debut.

The first quarter was tightly contested. India had an early chance when Rutaja passed the ball to Sharmila Devi from the left, but her shot narrowly missed the post. Spain attempted to play their signature free-flowing hockey but struggled against India's defensive press. In the ninth minute, India earned the first penalty corner of the evening, but the opportunity was squandered as the ball struck Sushila Chanu's foot while she was receiving it. Towards the end of the

quarter, Spain had a significant chance when Florencia Amundson unleashed a powerful shot, but Indian goalkeeper Savita made a fine save to keep the score level.

The match opened up in the second quarter, with three goals scored in a span of six minutes. In the 21st minute, Deepika drifted wide and fired a reverse hit from the left, which was perfectly deflected into the goal by an unmarked Baljeet, marking her first senior international goal.

Spain reclaimed the lead for the second time in the 52nd minute when Captain Jimenez fired a backhand shot from inside the edge of the circle, placing it perfectly into the bottom right corner.

In a desperate attempt to find an equalizer, India played without their goalkeeper for the last four minutes of the match. However, Spain held their defensive shape and secured a narrow victory.

We must come together to protect Loktak, our mother lake, and preserve it for future generations," he added.
