Shiv Sena demands Rs 1 crore compensation for SLBC tunnel victim's family

Hyderabad, Mar 10 (UNI) : Shiv Sena Telangana State President Sinkar Shivaji has strongly criticized the Rs 25 lakh compensation granted to the family of Gurpreet Singh, the operator who lost his life in the SLBC tunnel accident, calling it inadequate.

In a statement on Monday, Shivaji demanded Rs 1 crore in compensation for Gurpreet Singh's family along with a government job for one of his family members.

He also emphasised that the financial aid provided to the eight trapped personnel was insufficient and urged the government to withdraw the Rs 25 lakh cheque and instead provide a firm guarantee of Rs 1 crore along with employment support.

Shivaji further called on the central government to step in and support the families of the SLBC project workers, stressing that their sacrifices should not be forgotten.

Expressing deep sorrow over the tragic loss of eight personnel, he prayed for the safety of the remaining trapped workers and urged the government to recognize their contributions with due honour and responsibility.

Upper air cyclonic circulation lies over Equatorial Indian Ocean

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : Ahead of his two-day state visit to Mauritius to attend the 57th National Day celebrations as Chief Guest, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today voiced confidence that his visit will open a new and bright chapter in the India and Mauritius relationship.

During his two-day visit the PM will also hold talks with Mauritian Prime Minister, Navinchandra Ramgoolam, who took over the helms in November last year. In a departure statement, the PM said he is also eager to interact with the Indian community in the Indian Ocean nation.

He posted on X: "Starting tomorrow, I will be on a two day visit to



Mauritius, where I will take part in their 57th National Day celebrations. I look forward to meeting my friend and Prime Minister, Dr. Navinchandra Ramgoolam. I am also eager to be interacting with the Indian community there.

"Mauritius is a close maritime neighbour and a key Indian Ocean partner. We are connected by shared values and deep-rooted cultural ties.

"My visit will further strengthen the foundations of our friendship and build a brighter chapter in India-Mauritius ties."

A statement quoting him said: "Mauritius is a close maritime neighbour, a key partner in the Indian Ocean, and a gateway to the African Continent.

"We are connected by history, geography and culture.

"Deep mutual trust, a shared belief in the values

of democracy, and celebration of our diversity are our strengths. The close and historical people-to-people connect is a source of shared pride.

"We have made significant strides in the past ten years with people centric initiatives.

"I look forward to the opportunity to engage with the Mauritius leadership to elevate our partnership in all its facets and strengthen our enduring friendship for the progress and prosperity of our peoples, as well as for security and development in the Indian Ocean Region, as part of our Vision SAGAR.

"I am confident that this visit will build on the foundations of the past and open a new and bright chapter in the India and Mauritius relationship."

Rajya Sabha passes Railways Amendment Bill by voice vote

New Delhi, March 10 (UNI) : The Parliament on Monday cleared the Railways (Amendment) Bill 2024 with Rajya Sabha passing the bill which seeks to enhance the functioning and independence of the Railway Board.

The Upper House approved the Bill by voice vote following a discussion on it. The Lok Sabha has already passed the Bill.

Replying to the discussion on the Bill, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said that the Indian Railways has been undergoing continuous reforms with focus on infrastructure building, safety and modernisation.

"In 11 years, 34,000 kilometers of new railway tracks have been built, which is more railway tracks than a developed country like Germany and 45,000 kilometers of electrification has been done," the Minister said. Vaishnav highlighted safety as the government's top priority.

Talking about the Bill, he said, "This is a simplification bill. Instead of two laws, all the provisions are in one law. This bill has been brought with this spirit. Today the General Manager has the power to accept all contracts, whether it is Rs 10 crores or Rs 1,000 crores."

RS sees uproar as Opposition demands debate on alleged lapse in electoral rolls, Trump remarks

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : The Rajya Sabha on Monday, the first day of the second leg of the Budget session, witnessed uproarious scenes with the Opposition members pressing for discussion on issues ranging from alleged lapse in electoral rolls to the US President Donald Trump's statement about funding for voter turnout in India. As many as 12 notices were received under rule 267 of the House which were rejected by the Deputy Chairman Harivansh.

The members of the Opposition parties led by Congress staged a walkout from the House as their demands were declined. Some of the members also wanted discussion on concerns around the upcoming delimitation exercise.

While Harivansh cited previous rulings of the Chairman to reject the members' demand for discussion on various issues under rule 267, he urged members to send notices under other relevant provisions.

"The notices under Rule 267 have not been permitted. If the members so desire they may submit notices under any other Parliamentary device for the consideration of the Chairman," Harivansh said.

Govt. cancels land allotment to Hayagreeva in Visakhapatnam

Amaravati, March 10 (IANS) : The government of has cancelled the allotment of 12.51 acres of land to Hayagreeva Farms and Developers in Visakhapatnam.

The government issued an order on Monday, cancelling the allotment made in 2008, for violation of rules. The land was allotted by the state government for building cottages for old-age people and orphans.

However, the investigations by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) revealed that it fraudulently alienated the land and sold it to various persons, generating over Rs. 150 crore.

The government through the GO issued on Monday directed Visakhapatnam District Collector to resume the land from Hayagreeva and to utilise it for public purposes.

Last month, the ED provisionally attached immovable properties worth Rs. 42.03 crores and six



movable properties worth Rs. 2.71 crore.

The Central agency attached the properties valued at Rs 44.75 crore under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) 2002.

The ED had initiated investigations on the basis of FIR registered by Arilova

Police Station, Visakhapatnam under various sections of the Indian Penal Code against Gadde Brahmaji, Gannamani Venkateswara Rao and YSR Congress Party leader and former MP MVV Satyanarayana for forging signatures, fabricating sale documents and coercion to grab 12.51 acres allotted by

the state government.

Last year, the ED raided the residence and properties of former MP and YSRCP leader MVV Satyanarayana.

According to the ED, its investigation revealed that the 12.51 acres of land allotted by the State government was registered in the name of Hayagreeva Farms and Developers in 2010 after a payment of nearly Rs. 5.63 crore. However, the market value of the property as on the date of the conveyance deed was around Rs. 30.25 crore as per the records of the Andhra Pradesh Registration & Stamps Department.

The Investigation revealed that after allegedly acquiring the ownership of the land fraudulently, the accused divided the land into small plots and started alienating it from 2021 onwards by registering agreements of sale and sale deeds to various individuals. This has generated proceeds of crime of more than Rs. 150 crore, the ED said.

All NDA candidates likely to be elected unopposed in Andhra Pradesh MLC polls

Amaravati, March 10 (IANS) All five candidates of the ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) are likely to be elected unopposed to the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Council. Only five nominations were received for the March 20 elections as the deadline for filing nominations ended on Monday. Three candidates of the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and one candidate of its ally Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) filed nominations on the last day.

Kavali Grishma, Beeda Ravichandra Yadav, and B.T. Naidu filed their papers as the candidates of the TDP.

BJP national executive committee member Somu Veerajulu filed his papers as the BJP candidate.

Elections to five MLC seats from the MLAs' quota are scheduled on March 20.

The TDP has left a seat each for the Jana Sena and the BJP. Deputy Chief Minister and Jana Sena President Pawan Kalyan's brother Naga Babu has already filed the nomination for the MLC polls. Chandrababu Naidu has already announced that Naga Babu will be inducted into the Cabinet. The TDP-led NDA, which has 164 MLAs in the 175-member Assembly, is set to sweep the polls. The TDP has 135 MLAs, the Jana Sena 21, and the BJP eight.

The YSR Congress Party has only 11 seats in the Assembly. The scrutiny of nominations will be taken up on March 11. The deadline for withdrawal of nominations is March 13. Meanwhile, B.T. Naidu, who has been nominated by the TDP for second consecutive term as MLC, said that for the first time someone from the backward classes has been re-nominated for second term.

He said the TDP has given MLC tickets to candidates from weaker sections. B.T. Naidu and Ravinchandra Yadav are BCs while Kavali Grishma is from the Scheduled Caste. She is the daughter of senior TDP leader and former Speaker Pratibha Bharati. Grishma thanked Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and TDP General Secretary Nara Lokesh for fielding her as the party candidate. She said she would raise people's issues in the Council.

Meanwhile, Lokesh said the TDP has once again proved its sincerity towards the welfare of weaker sections of society by fielding all three candidates from these sections.

He said that Garsihma had been given a ticket to promote young women. He said all those working hard for the party would get the posts. He said those who did not get MLC nominations should not lose heart.

Himachal budget session: Governor highlights govt's financial management

Shimla, Mar 10 (UNI) The budget Session of the Himachal Pradesh Assembly began on Monday with Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla addressing the house for an hour and a half, outlining the government's efforts in financial management, horticulture, agriculture, power and animal husbandry. He acknowledged the financial constraints faced by the state due to the discontinuation of GST compensation in 2022 and the steady decline of the Revenue Deficit Grant (RDG). The grant, which was Rs 11,431 crore in 2020-21, has been reduced to Rs 6,258 crore this financial year and will drop further to Rs 3,257 crore by the end of the 15th Finance Commission period. Despite these fiscal challenges, capital expenditure has been maintained at Rs 6,270 crore, ensuring that development projects remain on track. Urban expansion has also been a priority, with 14 new Nagar Panchayats established and several municipal bodies upgraded.

Horticulture continues to be a key sector, with an additional 1,255 hectares brought under fruit cultivation. The government has also diversified agricultural production by expanding the cultivation of vegetables, flowers, and spices, the governor said. To support orchardists, a Universal Carton Policy has been introduced for standardized apple packaging, ensuring better prices.

INS Imphal to participate in Mauritius National Day celebrations

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : The Indian Naval Ship (INS) Imphal made her maiden port call at Port Louis, Mauritius on Monday to participate in the 57th Mauritius National Day celebrations on March 12. INS Imphal's visit is in keeping with the tradition of Indian warships and aircraft participating in Mauritius National Day celebrations, an Indian Navy statement said.

The ship will field a marching contingent, naval band and helicopter for the flypast at the National Day Parade at Champs de Mars. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, will be the chief guest at the celebrations.

During her stay at Port Louis March 10-14, the ship plans to participate in several training and cultural exchanges,

New Zealand PM to discuss boosting trade, security ties during talks with PM

Wellington/New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon has said that trade will play a central role in his discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his upcoming India trip, including talks on securing a free trade deal.

PM Luxon had promised ahead of the 2023 election that he would secure a free-trade deal with India in his first term. He will be arriving in India on March 16 with one of the largest ever prime ministerial delegations in a concerted effort designed to boost trade and security ties with India.

The delegation will be made up of New Zealand business leaders; prominent Kiwi-Indians in the community; and representatives from across Parliament, the Prime Minister's Office said. Tourism and Hospitality Minister Louise Upston, Trade and Investment Minister Todd McClay, and Ethnic Communities Minister Mark Mitchell will also be in attendance.

Luxon said strengthening Aotearoa's (New Zealand) ties with India "is a key priority for my Government", according to local New Zealand dailies.

"We've already made incredible progress over the last year as we invest in building a broad-based, sustainable relationship with India—the world's fastest-growing major economy, and the place from which 6% of New Zealand's population claim their heritage. I hope my visit will further strengthen the close links between us."

The last formal negotiations on an FTA between the two sides were last held nearly a decade ago. Dairy was a key point of contention, described as a "sensitive area" by Luxon, given it was New Zealand's major export and part of India's strong agricultural sector.

Asked whether he stood by his promise, Luxon said the "real commitment" had been to deepen trade relationships.

"We're going to do everything we can to push trade really, really hard," Luxon said in a joint media interview on Sunday.

"What I'm looking for is just a much more comprehensive economic partnership and how we'd move that forward, so yeah, you'll have to wait and see."

"I am determined that we are going to change the trading relationships with India big time."

He cited the higher tariffs New Zealand wine and apple exporters faced in comparison to their Australian counterparts, while arguing concerns about dairy shouldn't discourage trade-deal efforts.

Luxon's comments about Indian trade were laced with criticism of the previous Labour-led governments, which he claimed had "given up" on securing a deal.

Luxon said the relationship had been broadly "non-existent" prior to the coalition taking power: "we have had to start from scratch". Referring to the roughly \$2 billion two-way trade he lamented how only 1.5% of New Zealand exports went to India.

BJP leader dies after being injected poisonous substance in Sambhal

Sambhal (UP), Mar 10 (UNI) A senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader died after being injected with some poisonous substance by unidentified persons in Junabai area of Sambhal district here in Uttar Pradesh on Monday, police sources said here.

Police said that BJP leader Gulfam Singh Yadav, a resident of village Dabthara Himachal, was sitting in the cattle shed in his village on Monday afternoon when three unidentified persons came on a bike and gave him a poisonous injection.

"As soon as the poisonous injection was given, Gulfam Singh Yadav started writhing in pain," they said.

Police said that Yadav was taken to the Community Health Centre, where his condition became critical and he was referred to Higher Center Aligarh.

"He died in Aligarh," they said.

Superintendent of Police (SP) Krishna Kumar Bishnoi said that the post-mortem of the deceased Yadav is being conducted by a panel of doctors.

"Nearby CCTV cameras are being scanned to investigate the incident. Police have also got some important clues," he said.

Yadav, who started his social life with RSS, contested the election from Gunnaur assembly seat against the then Chief Minister Mulayam Singh Yadav in the by-election of 2004.

Jammu, Mar 10 (UNI) Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday stated that the ceasefire along the Line of Control (LoC) and international border has led to a revival of tourism activities in frontier areas. Replying to a supplementary question raised by Member Sajad Shafi regarding his Uri constituency, the Chief Minister, who also holds the Tourism portfolio, informed the House that as the border areas are slowly opening after the ceasefire along the LoC and border, tourism is witnessing a positive trend due to the prevailing peace in the region.

"It is true that Uri has huge border tourism potential. Tourists have started visiting areas like Uri and are eager to explore places such as Aman Setu and other scenic locations. Our priority is to enhance tourism infrastructure in these regions," Abdullah said.

In response to a starred question from the member, he stated that the feasibility of establishing a Zipline or Cable

Car project from Lagama to Baba Farred Garkote in Uri Constituency would be assessed by the Tourism Department. However, he clarified that no such proposal is currently under consideration.

The Chief Minister further said that the development of locations such as Rustom and Nambla Waterfalls, with their inclusion under the Border Tourism Programme, would be considered in the future, subject to feasibility and availability of resources.

Highlighting the potential of adventure tourism, he noted that Bijham and Limber Waterfall/Limber Wildlife Sanctuary are well known for attracting adventure enthusiasts.

The Tourism Department has undertaken several initiatives for the holistic development of these areas, he said. The Chief Minister said that while the department does not directly operate paragliding activities, it facilitates them through private adventure tourism operators.

The program brings together leading international experts from the USA and Italy, along with top national professionals from academia and industry.

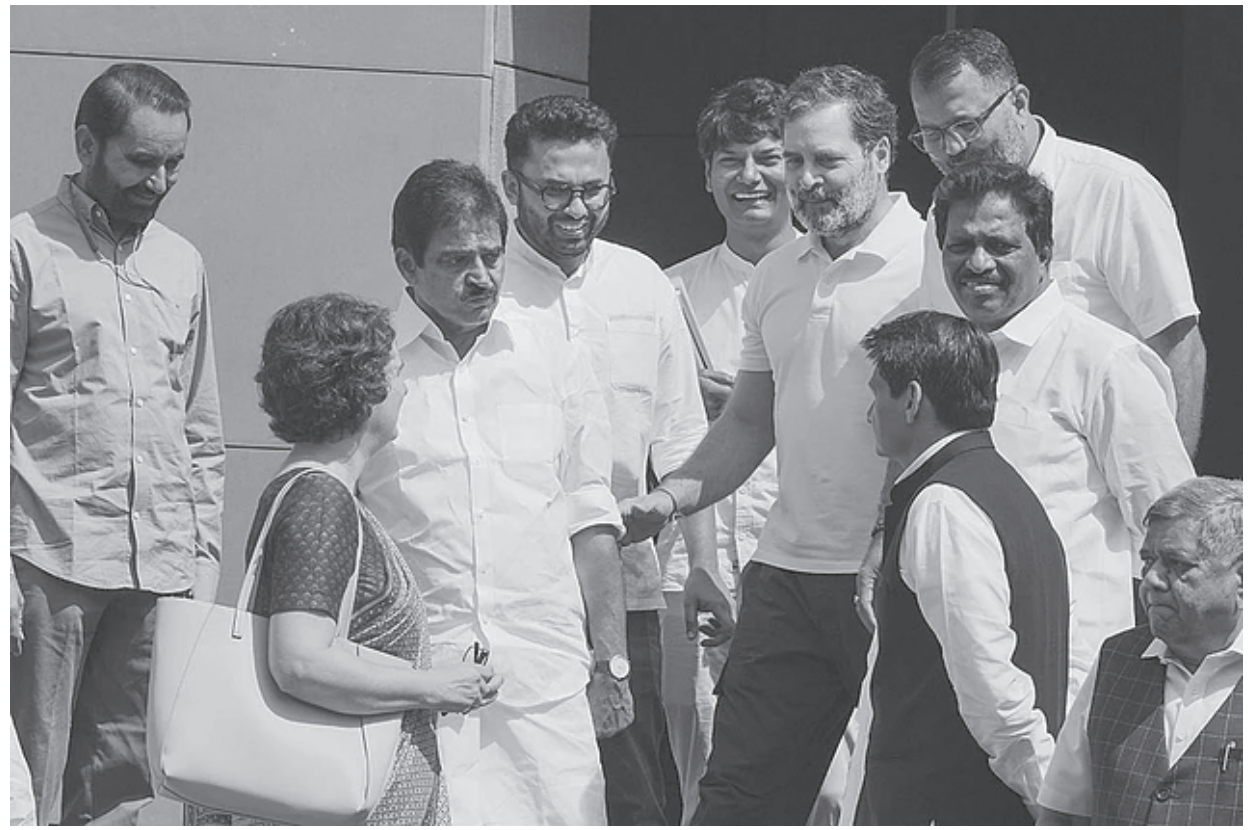

Govt committed to protecting harvested crops: Minister

Hyderabad, Mar 10 (UNI)::Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister Capt N Uttam Kumar Reddy reaffirmed the state government's commitment to safeguarding harvested crops and addressing concerns over irrigation water.

He directed Irrigation Department officials to visit the field and provide factual explanations to counter misinformation being spread on the issue.

On Monday evening, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, along with Associate Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao, Chief Secretary Shanthikumari, State Agriculture Secretary Raghunandan Rao, and TSSPDCL CMD Musharraf, held a video conference from the Dr B R Ambedkar Secretariat.

The meeting included district collectors, SPs, and officials from the

Agriculture and Electricity Departments. The minister emphasised that with the Rabi season crop set for harvest in the next 15 days, district officials must coordinate efforts at the ground level to support farmers. He instructed the Irrigation Department to ensure water availability for the Yasangi crop as a last resort and urged officials to work closely with the power department to maintain an uninterrupted water supply through canals.

Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao condemned misleading claims about crop loss, stating that certain groups were politically exploiting fears of boreholes drying up and motor failures. He urged officials to intervene promptly and take preventive measures.

Hundreds of Indians rescued from cyber fraud cafés in Thailand

Hyderabad, Mar 10 (UNI) : Hundreds of young Indians who were lured abroad with fake job offers but ended up trapped in cyber fraud cafés in Thailand have been rescued.

Held captive and forced into cyber crimes, they are now being brought back to India following the intervention of Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay Kumar.

Authorities have identified a total of 540 victims, including 42 from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Two special flights, each carrying 270 individuals, have been arranged for their safe return. The first flight took off on Monday, while the second is scheduled for Tuesday, according to an official statement here on Monday.

These victims had travelled abroad in search of jobs but fell prey to cybercriminals operating from Thailand. Fraudsters, using local agents, deceived them with false job offers.

Why India and Japan should deepen ties amid volatile geographical landscape

Looking ahead, both nations must leverage their respective strengths -- India's strategic geography and expanding global influence, combined with Japan's technological prowess and diplomatic reach -- to secure the Indo-Pacific's stability.

Indo-Pacific is fast becoming the epicentre of global security, and for India and Japan, the urgency of deepening strategic cooperation has never been more pressing.

In an era where authoritarian expansionism threatens sovereignty and disrupts regional stability, both nations must take decisive steps to reinforce a rules-based order that ensures peace and prosperity.

This was at the heart of discussions at a New Delhi-based think tank, the Centre for Integrated and Holistic Studies (CIHS), which hosted an event at the India International Centre in New Delhi on February 18, 2025.

Titled "Indo-Japan Relations", the event featured Minister Noriaki Abe, Minister for Political Affairs at the Embassy of Japan, as the chief speaker, alongside a distinguished gathering of scholars, academicians, policymakers, and security experts.

Their discussions highlighted the necessity of fortifying India-Japan ties in an increasingly volatile geopolitical landscape. Minister Abe provided critical insights into the evolving regional dynamics, emphasizing the need for deeper Indo-Japanese engagement. The discussions spanned economic collaboration, security partnerships, and technological cooperation—key pillars in ensuring regional resilience. A focal point was the increasingly assertive posture of the Communist Party of China (CPC) in the Indo-Pacific. From aggressive military manoeuvres in the South China Sea to economic coercion and territorial incursions, CPC's expansionist strategies continue to challenge the sovereignty of nations across the region. Its militarisation of artificial islands, debt-trap diplomacy, and grey-zone tactics have further escalated tensions, making a robust India-Japan partnership indispensable.

As two of the region's leading democratic powers, India and Japan must intensify their security and economic cooperation to counter these challenges.

The informal Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (QUAD) grouping—which also includes the United States and Australia—has demonstrated its effectiveness in bolstering military interoperability, intelligence-sharing, and securing vital maritime corridors. However, a crucial area demanding greater attention is the security of the Malacca and Sunda Straits—chokepoints critical to global trade yet increasingly vulnerable to CPC's geopolitical manoeuvring. CPC's growing influence in the region, particularly through its strategic presence in Myanmar and Cambodia, poses a direct challenge to freedom of navigation. A coordinated Indo-Japanese approach—incorporating joint patrols, intelligence-sharing, and strategic infrastructure investments—is essential to maintaining stability. Japan's advancements in maritime technology, coupled with India's naval capabilities and strategic location, create a formidable alliance for safeguarding sea lanes. Both nations have also heavily invested in maritime domain awareness (MDA), an essential component of deterring territorial encroachments and securing vital trade routes.

Beyond military security, economic resilience is equally critical. China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) has sought to entrench economic dependencies, eroding national sovereignty through unsustainable debt-driven projects.

In response, India and Japan have championed the Asia-Africa Growth Corridor (AAGC), a transparent and sustainable alternative that prioritises local economic empowerment over exploitative financing.

Strengthening this initiative is vital—not just to counter CPC's economic coercion but to foster long-term regional stability.

The success of the AAGC hinges on increased investment in sustainable infrastructure, digital connectivity, and capacity-building in partner nations.

By promoting economic independence rather than dependency, India and Japan can help developing nations build resilience against external economic pressures. This initiative also unlocks new avenues for trade and investment, benefiting not just the Indo-Pacific but also Africa's economic landscape.

The digital domain is another battleground where India and Japan must strengthen collaboration. China's dominance in 5G networks, artificial intelligence, and digital infrastructure presents a clear security threat.

Beijing's state-controlled tech firms have been instrumental in cyber espionage and geopolitical manoeuvring, necessitating a coordinated response.

By jointly investing in secure digital corridors, semiconductor supply chains, and advanced cybersecurity frameworks, India and Japan can safeguard critical technologies and infrastructure.

As the world moves toward an increasingly digital future, cyber threats loom large. Both nations must develop robust cyber resilience frameworks to counter state-sponsored hacking, misinformation campaigns, and intellectual property theft.

Rajya Sabha Passes Historic Bill for Railway Reforms: Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw Highlights Key Achievements

Railways (Amendment) Bill 2025 Passed: Govt Assures More Efficiency, Safety, and Empowerment

Today, the Rajya Sabha passed a landmark bill aimed at streamlining and modernizing railway operations in India. Addressing the House, Minister of Railways, Communications, and Electronics & IT, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, emphasized the bill's role in empowering field offices, enhancing efficiency, and reinforcing cooperative federalism.

The Minister expressed gratitude to the 25 Members of Parliament who participated in the discussion, acknowledging the valuable suggestions and debates. He categorically stated that the bill is designed to simplify existing laws and does not diminish the powers of state governments. Instead, it promotes decentralization by granting full authority to general managers in railway zones to approve

projects up to ₹ 1,000 crore.

Highlighting the government's commitment to state-wise railway development, Shri Vaishnaw cited substantial budget allocations in states where the ruling party is not in power. Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, and West Bengal have all received significantly higher allocations compared to previous administrations.

Major Achievements and Reforms in Railways: Infrastructure Development

Over the past 11 years, 34,000 kilometers of new railway tracks have been laid, surpassing Germany's total rail network.

Electrification of 45,000 kilometers has been completed, significantly reducing dependence on fossil fuels.

50,000 kilometers of old tracks have been replaced with new, high-

quality rails.

Safety Enhancements Investment in railway safety has surged from ₹ 8,000 crore under previous administrations to ₹ 1.14 lakh crore under Prime Minister Modi's leadership.

Rail fractures have reduced by 91%, with incidents decreasing from 2,548 in 2013-14 to just a fraction today.

The introduction of the Kavach safety system, with SIL 4 certification, ensures high-level security in railway operations.

Employment and Capacity Building More than 5,02,000 jobs have been provided under the NDA government, compared to 4,11,000 during the UPA era.

Large-scale recruitment exams have been conducted transparently, with millions of candidates participating.

CDS stresses need for holistic counter-UAS system

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) Gen Anil Chauhan on Monday emphasised on the need for developing holistic counter-Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) System for the Armed Forces.

While emphasising the transformative impact of UAS in modern warfare, Gen Chauhan highlighted the key trends - celerity, robotics advancements, and AI-driven intelligence - that are exploited by UAS, making them highly disruptive, a Defence Ministry statement said.

The CDS was delivering the keynote address at a seminar on "UAS Warfare with Special Focus on Counter-UAS" here, which was hosted by the Centre for Joint Warfare Studies (CENJOWS).

Referring to the present day conflicts, Gen Chauhan underscored how drones are reshaping warfare economics with low-cost, high-impact solutions.

The CDS postulated the imperative to establish a common vocabulary and grammar on UAS / drones / uncrewed systems by the Indian Armed Forces.

Stressing the doctrinal clarity in UAS classification, he outlined four generations of UAS and the need for developing holistic Counter-UAS systems.

He also called for synergy between users, designers, and manufacturers, ensuring India's self-reliant defence future. Meanwhile, the seminar underscored India's progress in drone warfare, with a focus on indigenous development and self-reliance under the 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' initiative. The discussions focused on the increasing manifestation of drone threats along India's northern and western borders, as well as in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), highlighting the need for advanced detection and neutralization systems. Leading defence industry representatives, including JSW UAV Ltd, Mahindra Defence, Adani Defence Systems, Kepler Aerospace, and Shyam VNL Pvt Ltd, presented cutting-edge solutions for counter-UAS warfare.

The seminar brought together distinguished experts from the Indian Armed Forces, strategic policymakers, industry leaders, and domain specialists to deliberate on the latest advancements in Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) and evolving counter-UAS strategies.

It reinforced the importance of integrating indigenous technologies with strategic policy frameworks to strengthen national security. It included all the stake holders such as BSF, ITBP, Coast Guard and Police.

UP assembly establishing itself as excellent legislature in country: Mahana

Lucknow, Mar 10 (UNI) Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly Speaker Satish Mahana on Monday said that the state's Legislative Assembly is establishing itself as an excellent legislature in the entire country.

Talking to reporters in Vidhan Bhawan, the Speaker said that dialogue programmes have been organised by forming groups of MLAs in the past. "Now in the coming time, a special 'Samvad Program' will be organised, in which the MLAs will share what they did for the development of their assembly in the past years and how their positive image was created. This will increase the confidence of the MLAs," he said.

Delhi court dismisses J&K MP Engineer Rashid's plea to attend parliament session

New Delhi, Mar 10(UNI) : A Delhi court on Monday dismissed the application of Jammu and Kashmir MP Engineer Rashid seeking custody parole to attend parliament session.

Additional Sessions Judge (ASJ) Chander Jit Singh after hearing arguments on behalf of the prosecution and defence dismissed the application of the custody parole.

The counsel for Rashid moved an application on February 27 seeking custody parole on the grounds that he needed to attend parliament as an MP and to fulfil his public duty.

Engineer Rashid defeated Chief Minister Omar Abdullah in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls in Baramulla constituency.

He was arrested by the NIA under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in a 2017 terror funding case and lodged in Tihar Jail.

The NIA after investigation filed a chargesheet against several persons, including Kashmiri Separatist Leader Yasin Malik, Lashkar-e-Taiba founder Hafiz Saeed and Hizbul Mujahideen Chief Syed Salahuddin in the court.

SAD alleges Punjab officials tried to "inflare passions", demands judicial probe

Chandigarh, Mar 10 (UNI) : The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) on Monday asked the Punjab Chief Secretary (CS) to recommend a judicial probe against Information and Public Relations officers of three districts who tried to "inflare passions and force clashes" among different sections of the Sikh community.

In a statement here, senior SAD leader Dr Daljit Singh Cheema said "it seems officers of the Public Relations department were given orders to spread videos to inflame passions by Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) functionaries.

"These functionaries should be identified and action should be taken against them as per law. Officers circulating inflammatory matter should also face legal as well as disciplinary action," said Cheema

Asking the AAP government not to interfere in the internal affairs of the Khalsa Panth, Cheema said "We have nothing against the Panthic organisations who had certain objections to the installation of Giani Kuldeep Singh Gadgaj as the new Jathedar of Sri Kesgarh Sahib. In fact they are much respected".

Asserting that the AAP government worked overtime to force a clash amongst Sikh groups, he said "this was the reason why the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee took a decision to install the new Jathedar in the early hours today at Sri Kesgarh Sahib".

Budget Session: Gulmarg fashion show private event, no Govt involvement: CM

Jammu, Mar 10 (UNI) Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday stated that the controversial fashion show at the famous skiing resort of Gulmarg was organized by a private party at a private hotel, with no involvement of the government at any stage.

The Chief Minister, who is also the Leader of the House, made this statement in response to concerns raised by various members regarding the controversial event held during the holy month of Ramadan.

Informing the House about the matter, he said, "An inquiry into the matter was promptly initiated, and

some preliminary findings have come to light."

Providing further details, the Chief Minister stated that a fashion show was organized by a private entity on March 7 as part of a four-day event.

He noted that the actions during the event hurt public sentiments, a concern that he acknowledged as both understandable and justified.

Abdullah emphasized that the organizers failed to exercise sound judgment, disregarding the sensitivities of the people, the significance of the location, and the timing of their event. "There have been concerns that such an

event should not have taken place during Ramadan. I completely agree. However, I would go a step further and say that such an event should not have been held at any time of the year in a place, given the cultural and social ethos of our region," the Chief Minister said.

He further clarified, "Moreover, I must categorically state that the government had no involvement in this event whatsoever."

Providing further information, the Chief Minister stated that the event was privately organized in a private hotel.

"The government was neither approached for

permission nor did it provide any financial or logistical support. No government infrastructure was utilized and no government officials were present at the event," he said. "Despite this, the administration has been instructed to examine whether any legal violations occurred. If any provisions of the law have been breached, the authorities will take appropriate action," he added. The Chief Minister reiterated, "There was no government involvement in this event.

Had the matter been brought to our notice beforehand, we would not have permitted it."

EAM brings up issue of safety, security of Indian missions, diplomats in UK

London/New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, who was the target of heckling by Khalistani activists during his London visit, brought up the issue of the safety and security of Indian Missions and diplomats during his talks with UK Home Secretary Yvette Cooper.

During the talks, EAM also reiterated the need to expeditiously bring to justice, the perpetrators of attacks on the premises of HCI London, which took place two years ago when Khalistani activists clambered up the balcony of the Indian High Commission and attempted to remove the Indian national flag and replace it with a Khalistani flag. India had then raised the issue very strongly with the UK side.

EAM also emphasized the need to address the growing concerns over the increasing anti-India activities of pro-Khalistani Extremism elements, a statement said.

During his meeting with the UK Secretary of State for Business and Trade Jonathan Reynolds, the two sides focussed the progress of India-UK FTA negotiations. Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to enhancing trade and investment opportunities, emphasizing the need to reduce trade barriers and expand market access.

In his meeting with Prime Minister Keir Starmer, EAM conveyed the warm greetings of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Both sides

noted the positive momentum in India-UK relations, particularly with the resumption of Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations. They also recognised the strengthening of technology cooperation and deepening of people-to-people ties, and discussed key global issues, including the Ukraine conflict.

EAM was welcomed at Chevening House by Foreign Secretary David Lammy. EAM and Foreign Secretary Lammy held extensive discussions covering the full spectrum of India-UK relations, including India's strategic coordination, political cooperation, trade negotiations, education, technology, mobility, and people-to-people exchanges.

They reviewed progress on the new Roadmap 2.0 being discussed by the two sides that will impart fresh energy and new momentum to the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. They also exchanged views on regional and global developments, including the Ukraine conflict, West Asia, Bangladesh, and the Commonwealth.

Both leaders interacted with Chevening Scholars from India, recognizing the crucial role that education and youth play, in fostering stronger bilateral ties.

EAM Jaishankar participated in a conversation at Chatham House with its Director and Chief Executive Bronwen

Maddox, where he spoke on shifting geopolitics, geoeconomics, India-UK relations, and India's perspective on global affairs.

EAM inaugurated the Consulate General of India in Belfast, Northern Ireland, in the presence of several distinguished local dignitaries, including the Speaker of the Northern Ireland Assembly Edwin Poots; Minister Fleur Anderson; Lord Mayor of Belfast, Councillor Micky Murray; and India's Honorary Consul, Lord Diljit Rana. The opening of the Consulate marks a significant step in strengthening India's presence in Northern Ireland, facilitating enhanced trade, business, technology, and educational linkages.

He also met with Deputy First Minister of Northern Ireland Emma Little-Pengelly and Junior Minister Aisling Reilly at Stormont Castle. They explored opportunities for deeper collaboration in key areas such as skills development, cybersecurity, technology, creative industries, and manufacturing.

EAM visited Queen's University in Belfast, where he underscored the importance of their upcoming campus in GIFT City, Gujarat, as a testament to the growing India-UK partnership in the higher education sector. He also interacted with Indian students currently studying at Queen's

University, discussing their experiences and aspirations.

EAM inaugurated the Consulate General of India in Manchester, the fourth Indian Consulate in the UK, fulfilling a long-standing demand of the Indian diaspora and strengthening India's diplomatic outreach in Northern England.

EAM Jaishankar holds bilateral talks with visiting Armenian FM

Justice Bagchi appointed as SC judge

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : The Union government on Monday appointed justice Joymalya Bagchi as a judge of the Supreme Court.

The announcement was made by Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal on social media platform X.

The Supreme Court collegium, led by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna, Justice Bhushan R Gavai, Justice Surya Kant, Justice Abhay S Oka, and Justice Vikram Nath, recommended his appointment on March 6.

The selection process considered his judicial acumen, integrity, and experience, along with factors such as seniority and regional representation.

Justice Bagchi, who began his tenure as a judge of the Calcutta High Court in June 2011, has had an extensive judicial career. He was transferred to the Andhra Pradesh High Court in January 2021 and later returned to the Calcutta High Court in November 2021.

His appointment to the Supreme Court fills one of the two existing vacancies in the apex court, which has a sanctioned strength of 34 judges. With his elevation, Justice Bagchi is set to assume the Chief Justice of India (CJI) role in May 2031, holding the position for a brief tenure until his retirement on October 2, 2031. Throughout his judicial career spanning over 13 years, Justice Bagchi has gained extensive expertise across various domains of law, making significant contributions to the judiciary.

LS passes Bills of Lading Bill 2024

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) The Lok Sabha on Monday passed the Bills of Lading Bill 2024 by a voice vote, which seeks to replace the Indian Bills of Lading Act, 1856 and provides a legal framework for issuance of bills of lading. The Bill was introduced in Lok Sabha on August nine, 2024.

Replying to the debate, Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal said the changes have been brought in keeping with the principle 'reform, perform and transform'. He noted that the law being replaced is a 168-year-old law.

"We have created this Bill after extensive consultation with stakeholders and legal experts," he said.

The Minister asserted that it would empower stakeholders to deal with issues in the future.

Addressing the criticism of the members pertaining to the Bill, he said that the Bill deals with the specific rights and liabilities emanating from a transfer of bill of lading to a consignee, noting that it is not a contract but the

evidence of a contract, thus it is a legal document.

Sonowal said that the Bill is in keeping with Narendra Modi's transformative vision.

He concluded his speech expressing confidence that India would become self-sufficient by 2047 and become one of the top developed nations in the world. Earlier, speaking on the bill, NCP (SP) MP Supriya Sule said that not all Opposition members are objecting to the Bills of Lading Bill, as they understand that it is not a policy change. She asked as to how to the Bill would make the shipping process more transparent.

She said that drug inflow should be stopped and asked what this Bill is doing for that.

She requested the government to take their feedback and strengthen the Bill. "I hope no Indian gets compromised in the future in the international game," she added and hoped that the Centre would take ownership and lead from the front for Indian fishermen who are helping maritime commerce.

Seed bombing is the new way to reclaim green spaces

The non-violent way to reclaim the green spaces in your city with plants of your choice is fast gaining ground

Want to reclaim the city space, beautify your area and be an architect of your own surroundings? Then you're welcome to be a seed bomber - a technique that has people throwing live seeds, packed in a specially made, compressed bundle of soil. These little bombs germinate and catch soil easily during the monsoons so you don't have to spend a lot of time gardening and make your ambitious patch of green in places that are hard to reach.

Bombing the city green

In Mumbai seed bombing is fast gaining traction with plant lovers and gardening enthusiasts coming together to organise workshops during monsoon where they meet and share the various techniques to make these seed bombs.

Aditi Punj, who organises these workshops at her flyover farm in Mohammed Ali Road, says that while usual gardening enthusiasts show interest, it is the kids who take to the activity in a big way. "The concept is guerrilla gardening and it is a fun way for people to be involved in making the city green. It's easy to do, and a great and tactile way for the kids to be involved."

Taking to the highways

Another seed bombing enthusiast, Shaan Lalwani who owns a nursery in the suburbs organised a similar seed bombing run along the Mumbai Pune Expressway where him along with a bunch of other enthusiasts, "I had recently read in papers that around 3 to 5 lakh trees were destroyed while making the express way. The



landslides that occur during monsoons are because of this indiscriminate chopping of trees." To tackle this problem and find a remedy for the long run, Lalwani along with other enthusiasts took off in two cars with 500 bombs each and pelted the sides along the highway with these colourful bombs with sling shots. "We used seeds of plants as well as trees. The bombs were made of seeds including Neem, Peepal, Gulmohar, Badam, Umber and Bhindi. We used these as they are strong species, native to the area and ideal to be grown along the highway." DIY Making a seed bomb is a rather easy process, which involves very little

in terms of materials. It is cheap. You can then go on to graduate to making the complex, fancier seed bombs.

Classic Clay Seed Ball

- Compost, made up of dried leaves
- Water

- Mix 5 parts of clay with 1 part of compost and 1 part of seeds
- Mix a few drops of water and knead into a mix.

- Separate the clay and make tiny, clay balls. Each ball can have more than a few seeds.

Places where one can bombard with seed grenades

- 1) Plots of soft land
- 2) Dividers between roads
- 3) Building gardens
- 4) Soft paths along highways

Important

Always use seeds of native plants, as species that are not native to the environment can hurt the ecosystem of the place

ICC announces Champions Trophy 2025 Team of Tournament

Dubai, Mar 10 (UNI) : The ninth edition of the Champions Trophy 2025 saw India being crowned as the winners on March 9 after they overcame New Zealand in the final.

Several exceptional performers lit up the tournament with the bat and ball.

The best of them made it to the Team of the Tournament.

1. Rachin Ravindra (New Zealand) 251 runs, 62.75 average, two hundreds

Ravindra went big in two of New Zealand's Champions Trophy games while also finding ways to contribute as a spin bowler. He won the Player of the Tournament award for his all-round excellence,

2. Ibrahim Zadran (Afghanistan) 216 runs, 72 average, one hundred

The opener proved how crucial he is to Afghanistan's competitiveness, steering his team to a famous win over England by scoring a mega 177 in the first innings, which is now the highest-ever individual score in the competition's history.

3. Virat Kohli (India) 218 runs, 54.5 average, one hundred

India's top-order star Kohli produced two impressive knocks, including an 84 in the semi-final against Australia, confirming that even at 36, he's still at the peak of his powers in the format. During the Champions Trophy, Kohli also crossed the landmark of 14,000 ODI runs, becoming just the third player after Sachin Tendulkar and Kumar Sangakkara to do so.

4. Shreyas Iyer (India) 243 runs, 48.6 average, two fifties

Solid as a rock in India's middle order. From India's last four tournament matches, Shreyas' lowest batting return was 45 runs, proving to be a pillar of consistency in trying batting conditions in Dubai.

5. KL Rahul (wk) (India) 140 runs, 140 average, 42 highest score*

India's keeper was reliable behind the stumps and a clutch performer in his role as India's finisher with the bat. From four innings, he finished unbeaten on three occasions. He was particularly crucial during India's chases in the all-important knockout games, scoring unbeaten 42 not out and 34 not out against Australia and New Zealand respectively.

6. Glenn Phillips (New Zealand) 177 runs, 59 average, two wickets, five catches

New Zealand all-rounder Phillips not only showed glimpses of why he's one of the most dangerous batters in the world but displayed exceptional fielding prowess for the Kiwis, taking three absolute stunners during the tournament, including a mindboggling catch against Virat Kohli in the final group game against India.

7. Azmatullah Omarzai (Afghanistan) 126 runs, 42 average, seven wickets, one five-wicket haul

The middle-order batting production was there for all to see, while his bowling was also effective. Omarzai's 5/58 against England proved match-winning as the ICC Men's ODI Cricketer of the Year for 2024 lived up to his billing.

8. Mitchell Santner (c) (New Zealand) Nine wickets, 26.6 average, 4.80 economy

Santner's captaincy and bowling were equal parts world-class, right way through New Zealand's impressive campaign that saw them finish as runner-ups.

Mohammedan SC finish debut ISL campaign without a home win

Rohit Sharma uncertain about 2027 World Cup

New Delhi, Mar 10 (UNI) : India captain Rohit Sharma has left the door open regarding his playing future but remained non-committal on featuring in the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2027.

The 38-year-old opener played a captain's knock in the Champions Trophy final, securing India's triumph and earning the Player of the Match award. His leadership was instrumental in India reclaiming an ICC trophy, silencing critics who questioned the team's ability in knockout tournaments.

Dismissing rumours of an imminent retirement, Rohit made it clear that as long as he enjoys the game and contributes to the team, he will continue. "There's so much pride in playing for India, and the way this team is playing, I don't want to leave," he remarked. Rohit emphasised that the camaraderie in the squad plays a key role in his motivation. "There's so much joy and fun playing with this team. As long as I feel that passion, I'll be here." While Rohit's long-term future remains undecided, his current form and commitment to Indian cricket remain unquestionable. With another ICC trophy under his belt, the veteran leader continues to inspire, leaving fans wondering just how much longer he will grace the international stage.

Flick did speak to the press and said he believed the team was "managing" the death of Dr Minarro "well," and that the players wanted to dedicate a win to him on Tuesday. "It is a great loss, he was a great person and an excellent doctor, who was incredible for the team and the club and a key piece in our team.

We will miss him," said Flick. "We want to play for him to tomorrow and we want to win this important match for him. We are prepared for that," added the coach.

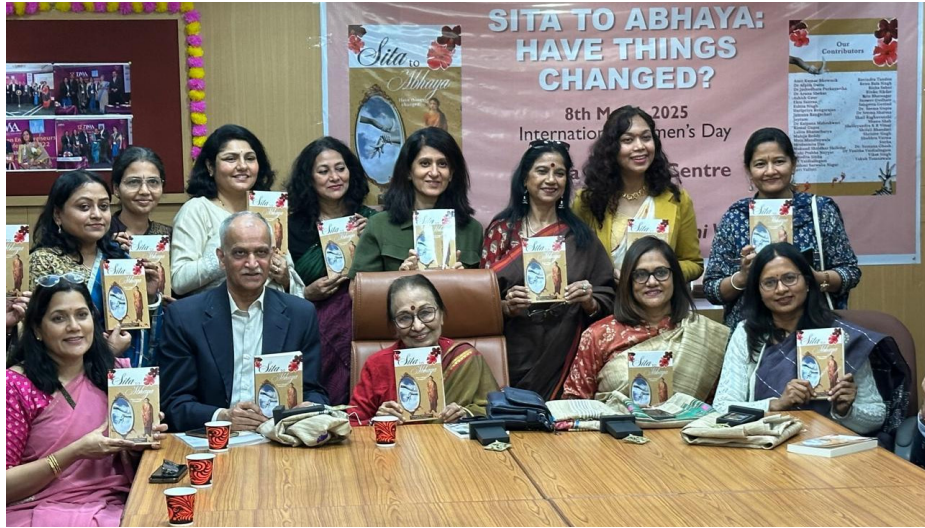
