CM to inaugurate Young India Police School on March 31

Hyderabad, Mar 1 (UNI) :Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy will inaugurate the " Young India Police School" in Manchirevula (RR Dist), on the outskirts of the city on March 31 to cater to the needs of children of police and uniformed personnel.

The CM released the brochure and launched the website of the school on Saturday.

In the school, 50 percent of the admissions are reserved for uniformed personnel and the remaining 50 percent will be opened for the public.

The fee structure will be different for the students depending upon the ranks of their parents from Home Guards to ASI , SI to Additional SP, and IPS officers and for the Open category.

NC asks GOI to honour democratic mandate of people

Govt to introduce Health Tourism Policy soon: CM

Hyderabad, Mar 1 (UNI) :Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has said the state government will introduce a Health tourism policy soon. Government is making efforts to promote Telangana as a health hub to serve not only the people of the state but also other countries, Reddy said on Friday evening while addressing a function organised to felicitate AIG Hospitals Chairman Dr D Nageshwar Reddy, who was recently awarded the Padma Vibhushan.

He said Dr Nageshwar Reddy is a distinguished doctor and got a big civilian award from the Telugu community. Received Padma Shri, Padma Bhushan, and Padma Vibhushan awards. He is also eligible for India's highest civilian award Bharat Ratna, the CM said.

The Government, the CM said, is also planning to create a health campus near the Airport on a thousand acres of land, he said that his government is seeking the support of Dr Nageshwar Reddy to promote the state into a health hub. For the first time in the country, former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Rajasekhara Reddy has taken the initiative of providing free corporate medical treatment to the poor through the Aarogyasri scheme, the CM recalled.

He said the state government had already increased the Aarogyasri limit to Rs 10 lakhs from Rs 5 lakhs and provided health care to the poor in the state.

Budget 2025-26 focuses on strengthening the agriculture sector: PM Modi

New Delhi, Mar 1 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi hailed the Union Budget 2025-26, saying it focuses on strengthening the agriculture sector and boosting the rural economy.

Addressing the post-budget webinar on agriculture and rural prosperity, Modi said, " We consider agriculture as the primary engine of development and our aim is to ensure that no farmer is left behind"

"We are working towards two major goals, first, the development of the agricultural sector and second is the prosperity of villages".

Sharing some data on the Agriculture sector, he said,

PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi was launched 6 years ago, and approximately Rs 3.75 lakh crore has been directly transferred to the bank accounts of 11 crore farmers.

"We have created a farmer-centric digital infrastructure so that the benefits of this scheme can reach farmers across the country" the PM added.

Modi said today, India's agricultural production is at a record level. "Agricultural production which was around 265 million tonnes 10-11 years ago, has now increased to more than 330 million tonnes" he said.

The Prime Minister informed that Horticulture production has exceeded 350 million tonnes and this

Govt will deal with illegal sand mining with an "iron hand" : CM

Hyderabad, Mar 1 : Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Saturday warned that the state government will deal with illegal sand mining and smuggling of sand and other minerals with an iron hand.

Reviewing the performance of the Mining Department Reddy asserted that stringent action against illegal mining is the only solution to generate more revenue.

The Mining Department officials briefed the Chief Minister about the measures taken to curb illegal mining and sand transport to generate more revenues.

Making several suggestions to the officials on sand mining, transport,

MIM Prez urges Maharashtra govt to lift ban on issuing birth certificates

Hyderabad, Mar 1 (UNI) AIMIM President and Hyderabad MP, Asaduddin Owaisi on Saturday urged Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis to lift the ban on issuing birth certificates or exempt birth certificate issuance for primary school admissions.

The Maharashtra government has prohibited issuing birth and death certificates indefinitely since January 21, causing significant hardship to thousands of children born during or post-COVID, Owaisi said on social media platform 'X'. "Many kids from poor families, especially in Malegaon, weren't registered due to lack of legal knowledge, illiteracy, or financial constraints. Consequently, they can't secure school admissions", he said. "@mieknathshinde @Dev_Fadnavis, please lift the ban or exempt birth certificate issuance for primary school admissions", he tweeted.

Lalu should tell how he will stop migration: Prashant

Patna, Mar 1 (UNI) : Founder of " Jan Suraj " Prashant Kishor on Saturday asked RJD Chief Lalu Prasad Yadav to explain in public how he will stop migration of youths from Bihar, if his party was voted to power, as promised by him recently.

Minister B Basu escapes unhurt after allegedly attacked by SFI activists

Kolkata, Mar 1 (UNI) : West Bengal Education Minister Bratya Basu escaped unhurt on Saturday after being attacked allegedly by SFI activists of Jadavpur University but his car was vandalized, official sources said. Basu was rescued by his security personnel and drove straight to the SSKM Hospital where he was given first aid.

"I am fine, I have no problem but my car in which I was sitting in front was vandalized the windscreen broke and the car tyres are deflated," Basu told reporters after coming out from the SSKM Hospital.

He said security men took him to the back seat to escape further attacks.

Basu went to the JU campus to address a meeting of the West Bengal Professors Association (WBCUPA). As soon as he began to speak, the ruckus broke out and the SFI activists attacked him. His security personnel immediately escorted him to his car, which was vandalized.

"I do not know why the TMC people are not allowed on the campus and why WBCUPA can not hold meetings in JU," asked Basu. The student protest

began when Basu began addressing the SFI activists demanding for holding a student union election.

During vandalization, some students were also injured after the convoy car dashed against a student, whose head was bleeding, the students alleged.

Some FIRs were also lodged with the Jadavpur Police station, sources added. Denouncing the incident, Trinamool Congress leader and the party's state General Secretary Kunal Ghosh said, "We are shocked. They planned and attacked Bratya Basu. We will not tolerate such hooliganism."

CM reviews implementation of liquor ban in Bihar

Patna, Mar 1 (UNI) : Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Saturday reviewed performance of Excise and Prohibition department to assess how effectively prohibition was being implemented in the state.

Kumar during review meeting, directed the officials to ensure that liquor ban could be implemented effectively in all parts of the state. Those found involved in violation of liquor ban should not be spared at all, he added. "Crime control should be on top of priority of the police administration and there should be strict vigil on those trying to create disturbance and violence in the society", the Chief Minister said, adding that there was need to be extra alert to maintain law and order during the festivals.

Liquor ban had greatly helped in checking crimes and also domestic violence causing much harassments to women, Nitish pointed out. "We noticed that there is a feeling of happiness among poor families whose income are now being saved due to liquor ban and it is now being utilised to arrange important needs like education of children and facilities of comforts." Kumar noted. People should be made aware about ill effects of liquor ban. It would help in successful implementation of liquor ban, he remarked.

J&K Govt tightens noose on illegal mining, initiates action against Joint Director

Jammu, Mar 1 (UNI) : In a decisive move aimed at tackling the menace of illegal mining in the Union Territory, the Jammu and Kashmir government has attached Joint Director, Geology and Mining, Jammu, H L Langeh, with the Administrative Department, ceasing all powers vested in him with immediate effect.

The order, issued by the Mining Department comes in the wake of directives received from the office of the Deputy Chief Minister, Surinder Choudhary, reinforcing the administration's commitment towards ensuring transparency and accountability in the mining sector, an official spokesman said on Saturday.

He said that the government has taken this step in response to rising concerns over unauthorized mining activities that have been causing severe environmental degradation and revenue loss to the state exchequer.

In light of this, the Director of Geology and Mining, J&K, has been directed to submit a comprehensive report addressing complaints related to illegal mining and the issuance of disposal permits, allowing authorities to initiate further scrutiny and take necessary corrective measures. The officials have been instructed to ensure strict compliance with mining regulations to prevent any further unlawful extraction of mineral resources, he added.

Surinder Choudhary, while addressing the matter, underscored the government's firm stance against illegal mining, stating that the administration would not tolerate any misconduct or negligence in the execution of duties.

He affirmed that illegal mining not only endangers the environment but also deprives the government of rightful revenue, impacting developmental initiatives. Stressing the need for stringent enforcement mechanisms, the Deputy Chief Minister assured that those found complicit in unauthorized mining activities,

irrespective of their position, would face strict legal consequences.

Choudhary also urged the public to actively participate in reporting any illegal mining operations, emphasizing that community vigilance plays a crucial role in safeguarding the region's natural resources.

Illegal mining has been a longstanding issue in Jammu and Kashmir, with unregulated extraction causing extensive damage to riverbeds, groundwater levels and local ecosystems.

The government has reiterated its commitment to sustainable and legal mining practices, ensuring that all mineral extraction activities are conducted within the ambit of law and environmental norms.

Efforts are being intensified to introduce advanced monitoring technologies, including satellite surveillance and digital tracking to curb unlawful mining operations, he said.

The action against the Joint Director of Geology and Mining serves as a strong message that the government will not hesitate to take stringent action against any official found to be negligent or complicit in illegal activities, said the spokesman.

The government has urged all stakeholders, including law enforcement agencies, regulatory bodies and local communities to work in unison to eliminate illegal mining, he added.

The spokesman said that with a clear emphasis on accountability and legal enforcement, this move signals a renewed effort to protect Jammu and Kashmir's natural wealth while fostering responsible economic growth. The citizens are encouraged to report any instances of illegal mining through designated helplines and online grievance portals, reinforcing the administration's objective of public participation in governance and environmental conservation.

Congress activists gherao CM's residence to protest rising atrocities against Women

Bhubaneswar, Mar 1 (UNI) : Activists from various front wings of the Odisha Congress staged a protest demonstration outside Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi's official residence on Saturday, condemning the rising atrocities against women in the state.

Led by newly elected party President Bhakta Charan Das, members of the District Congress, Mahila Congress, Youth Congress,

and Chhatra Congress marched from the party office to the Chief Minister's residence, carrying placards and posters. When Congress members attempted to breach the police barricade to reach the CM's house, security forces intervened, preventing the agitators from advancing and forcefully detaining some Congress leaders in a police van. Das alleged that as many as 54 rape cases

had been reported in Odisha during the past eight months of BJP rule, exposing the failure of the so-called "double-engine government" to curb crimes against women.

Hyderabad, Mar 1 (UNI) : The Anti corruption Bureau (ACB) on Saturday said that it has trapped/arrested 23 public servants, including two outsourcing employees, in 17 cases registered during the month of February in Telangana.

They were remanded to Judicial Custody. Of the total cases during last month, 15 are trap cases and two cases of Disproportionate assets, ACB said in a release here.

The Bureau got conviction in one trap case. G M Sudarshan, Panchayat Secretary of Kotagiri Village in Nizamabad District, who had been trapped in 2014 was convicted recently.

Around Rs 7.60 lakhs amount was seized in trap cases of BC Welfare, Energy, Home, Forest, Agriculture and Cooperation, Education, Social Welfare, Panchayat Raj and Rural Development, Revenue, MA and UD and Transport, R and B departments. In two disproportionate assets cases, assets worth about Rs 4.13 crore have been unearthed.

No fuel for vehicles older than 15 years in Delhi after Mar 31: Minister

New Delhi, Mar 1 (UNI) : To control pollution in the National Capital, the Delhi government took a big decision on Saturday that vehicles older than 15 years will not get fuel.

The announcement was made by Delhi Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa, after a meeting with senior officials of the government. He said the government's initial focus will be on heavy vehicles entering Delhi and teams will check whether the laid-down rules are being followed. Announcing several other anti-pollution measures, Sirsa said that the newly formed BJP government is taking stringent steps to curb vehicular emissions and pollution. Restrictions on older vehicles, mandatory anti-smog measures, and the transition to electric public transport were among the issues discussed. The Minister said, "We don't have information about vehicles coming from outside but we have decided to stop giving fuel to vehicles older than 15 years after March 31, 2025. A team will be set up to identify such vehicles".

"We are going to make it mandatory for all big hotels, office complexes, airports, commercial complexes and construction sites in Delhi to immediately install anti-smog guns to control pollution" he told reporters.

Sirsa also announced that nearly 90 per cent of the public CNG buses in Delhi will be phased out and replaced by electric buses by December 2025. He said that the BJP government will get permission from the Centre to implement cloud seeding and induce artificial rain whenever air pollution levels spike in the National Capital.

Industry needs to march along with changing times to meet challenges: Sridhar Babu

Hyderabad, Mar 1 (UNI) : IT and Industries Minister D Sridhar Babu on Saturday said digital innovation is moving at a rapid pace and the industry needs to march along with the changing times to meet challenges.

Inaugurating the GROWTH X 2025 Summit organized by the ICT Committee of the Federation of Telangana Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FTCCI) with the theme "Go Digital Grow Business", Sridhar Babu said We need to transform our industries with a special focus on how to leverage Technology for GROWTH in the disruptive era of AI

The traditional approaches will not work. At the same time, there are challenges in this journey,

especially for MSMEs and SMEs. The MSMEs and SMEs have many limitations, shortage of capital, fear of change, and lack of awareness. He said until and unless MSMEs and SMEs harness new technologies, they will lose out on their competitiveness. They can't sustain in the long run.

The state Government's ambition is to make Telangana a one trillion US \$ economy. We will work with the FTCCI and ICT committee for the common good of the industry and the state, the Minister said.

He said the state is progressing well at the same speed as national growth or even more. The state's software exports growth registered at 17.98

percent against the national average growth of 8 percent. AI (Artificial Intelligence) is taking control across industries and individuals from all walks of life. If 'we don't harness and integrate AI into our industries, and businesses, we will lose efficiency, growth trajectory, and profitability,' the Minister said.

"Our Chief Minister Mr. Revanth Reddy has a very clear vision to keep pace with the changing technology", he said that the CM feels very strongly that all stakeholders of the state must also keep pace with emerging technologies.

The Government of Telangana sees AI as the first and foremost technology to be embedded in its growth trajectory. It is top of mind

of the state leadership. The recently held Global AI summit was a step towards that direction, the Minister added. On the occasion, the Minister unveiled the "Thought Capital Report" brought out by EY, the knowledge partner of GrowthX2025.

Speaking on the occasion, FTCCI President Dr Suresh Kumar Singhal, said MSMEs make a significant contribution to the Indian economy, yet they are hesitant to adapt technology. They must embrace technology to stay competitive. More than 450 participants comprising decision makers/CXOs, FTCCI Members, IT, Policy Makers, Investors, and Startups participated in the summit. An Expo Zone was also organised along with the summit.

Complete land acquisition for ongoing development projects by Mar 15: UP CM

Lucknow, Mar 1 (UNI) : Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday directed the officials that the process of land acquisition and distribution of compensation for the ongoing development projects of central and state governments in various districts be completed by March 15.

During a review meeting to assess development projects under the central and state governments, the CM emphasised that adherence to timelines is crucial for development projects of public importance, as they not only enhance the lives of common citizens but also contribute to employment generation.

He said that project delays often necessitate cost revisions, which adversely impact revenue. He directed the district administration to conduct regular reviews of land acquisition and compensation distribution for development projects, ensuring consistent communication with affected farmers and families.

Yogi directed the District Magistrates to conduct a weekly review, while the Commissioner should review progress every 15 days and submit a report to senior officials in the CM's Office, Chief Secretary's Office and the relevant departments.

The Chief Minister said that common citizens aspire for development and should be made aware of its positive outcomes. "They should also be informed in advance about the circle rate for compensation," he said. He emphasised that nodal officers must be deployed for all initiated projects, ensuring strict

adherence to quality standards and timely execution. Yogi directed that the construction of a 350-bed hospital by ESIC in Greater Noida and a 100-bed hospital in Gorakhpur should progress within a set time frame.

The CM said, "Any arising challenges should be promptly resolved. The Greater Noida hospital is expected to generate around 1,000 direct and 2,000 to 3,000 indirect jobs."

Yogi directed the officials to identify those obstructing development projects and take strict action against them. He reviewed various development projects in Varanasi and directed their timely completion. The Chief Minister reiterated that development and employment generation remain top priorities, urging officials to work with a zero pendency approach.

Pre-judging event held on eve of 58th Statesman Vintage & Classic Rally on Sunday

New Delhi, Mar 1 (UNI) : A day before classic cars from bygone era take over the streets of Delhi as part of the 58th Statesman Vintage and Classic Rally, a pre-judging event took place on Saturday in the capital's Modern School at Barakhamba Road.

Over 100 vintage and classic cars have been meticulously assessed over the past two days, celebrating the rich heritage and craftsmanship of automotive history.

The grand rally will kick off on Sunday (March 2) from Statesman House, Connaught Place. Undertaking a 44-kilometre journey and driving past some of the city's key landmarks along the route,

the participants in the rally will reach the National Stadium where the rally will conclude. A prize distribution ceremony will be held at the destination.

Among this year's most striking entry in the rally is Daman Thakore's 1950 MG YT convertible, affectionately known as "Lal Pari" within his family.

Thakore, a businessman from Gujarat, recounted his incredible 73-day journey from Ahmedabad to London in 2023. Covering 12,000 kilometres across 12 countries—including Croatia, Italy, and Turkey—his car even made a historic visit to Abingdon, Oxfordshire, the birthplace of MG cars. "This car is a rare gem," Thakore

remarked. "Only 900 were manufactured, and today, only around 150-200 remain globally," he added.

Another entry adding to the rally's grandeur this time is Gurpreet Singh's 1928 Rolls Royce Phantom 1 Open Tourer, originally owned by the Maharaja of Bhavnagar.

"This is more than just a car; it's a piece of India's rich automotive heritage," he said, expressing his satisfaction at preserving the car's original registration with the Gujarat Commissionerate of Transport.

While many people remain enthusiastic about vintage automobiles, it is increasingly becoming a challenge to keep the

classic car legacy rolling.

Judge Gyan Sharma stressed the need for governmental support to sustain the vintage car culture.

"With increasing driving restrictions and rising maintenance costs, fewer young enthusiasts are joining the movement. It was once a thriving hobby, but now only a dedicated few continue to pursue it. The Statesman deserves credit for keeping this tradition alive," he noted. Discussing the evaluation process, judge Pramod Bhasin elaborated that vehicles were assessed based on originality, upkeep, paint quality, upholstery, and authenticity of parts.

BJP slams Omar Abdullah for 'peace is not organic' remark

Srinagar, Mar 1 (UNI) : Senior BJP leader Altaf Thakur on Saturday launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister Omar Abdullah for his remarks that "peace is not organic" in Kashmir and said that he lacks sufficient powers to govern effectively.

Thakur, who is also party's Jammu and Kashmir spokesperson, dismissed Omar's claims, asserting that the BJP-led central government, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has made peace a "permanent feature" in Kashmir since the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019.

He said people are reaping the dividends of stability, and the region has witnessed unprecedented development over the past five years.

"Had there been no peace, Kashmir would not have seen the massive development that has taken place post-2019. The fact is that Kashmir

has never been this peaceful in the past seven decades," Thakur said in a statement.

Two days ago, Chief Minister Omar Abdullah while addressing a event in New Delhi had described the current situation in Jammu and Kashmir as "not normal," stating that "normalcy has been forced in Kashmir, it's not organic."

He cited the authorities' decision to disallow the funeral of Hurriyat leader Mirwaiz Umar Farooq's father-in-law at Srinagar's Jamia Masjid as evidence of the abnormality.

"If everything is normal, why wasn't the funeral allowed today?" the CM questioned

Taking a dig at Omar, the Senior BJP leader Thakur questioned why the CM contested elections if he believed he would have limited powers.

"Was he not aware of the governance structure before the polls? The

reality is that he is failing to deliver on the ground and is now looking for an escape route," Thakur said.

He further accused the National Conference leader of trying to create a false narrative to cover up his administration's inefficiency.

"Instead of acknowledging the positive changes in J&K, Omar is resorting to rhetoric to mislead the people. T

he BJP's vision has transformed the region, and no amount of political blame game can deny that," the Senior BJP leader added.

Thakur also highlighted that unlike in the past, when separatist activities and terror incidents disrupted daily life, today's Kashmir is witnessing record-breaking tourism, infrastructure growth, and improved law and order. He challenged Omar to focus on governance instead of playing victim.

With all formalities, and hoisting a flag meeting, BSF is scheduled to hand over the body to the deceased's family on Saturday, police said.

According to police, a group of Bangladeshi smugglers attacked BSF patrol party at Sonamura border, which left a jawan injured when BSF tried to prevent the smuggling attempt.

At around 7.30 pm, BSF jawans posted at Putia village noticed a smuggling attempt by a group of 20 to 25 Bangladeshi smugglers and they intruded into the Indian side. When alerted by a BSF patrol party, they attacked the party, in which one BSF jawan got seriously injured.

Subsequently, again the party was attacked and miscreants tried to snatch BSF personnel's weapons and in order to protect his own life, a BSF jawan fired one round of PAG (non lethal) for self defense, resulting the death of Alamin. Allegedly, after the incident, all Bangladeshi miscreants escaped to their country in presence of Border Guard of Bangladesh (BGB). The incident sparked tension along the border and BSF made extra deployment to maintain peace.

Delhi court allows withdrawal of sedition case against JNU student leader Shehla Rashid

New Delhi, Mar 1 (UNI) : A court here has allowed the withdrawal of a sedition case filed against former Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) student leader Shehla Rashid.

It is alleged that in August 2019, Rashid in his tweets had alleged misconduct by the Indian Army in Jammu and Kashmir. It is alleged that Rashid in his tweets had claimed that the Indian Army violated the human rights of locals by entering houses at night and torturing residents of Kashmir. Advocate Alakh Alok Srivastava made a complaint against Rashid and subsequently an FIR (first

information report) was registered against him under Section 153A of the Indian Penal Code. Assistant Public Prosecutor moved an application under section 321 of Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) before court for granting permission to withdrawal of the case against Rashid by submitting that the Lieutenant Governor of Delhi had revoked the sanction to prosecute Rashid. Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Anuj Kumar Singh, after hearing the application on behalf of Prosecution, allowed the prayer of the Assistant Public Prosecutor for withdrawal of the sedition case against Rashid.

Where's Kejriwal as Atishi struggles on Delhi roads

Sometimes, it is useful to stay home and reflect on situations to find solutions to issues. Perhaps this is what AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal appears to be doing.

It's been days since he was last seen or heard. He has largely remained absent from public view after his party's crushing defeat in the Delhi Assembly elections. Kejriwal, who lost to BJP's Parvesh Verma in the New Delhi Assembly seat, was last seen on February 23 at AAP's legislative party meeting, where Atishi was named the Leader of Opposition in the House. He has also not posted much politically significant on his social media handles, including the X. Interestingly, he has neither reacted nor posted on the happenings of the Delhi Assembly, where his lieutenant Atishi, the former Delhi CM, seems to be waging a lone leader's fight. He has not said a word over the suspension of 21 AAP MLAs from the Delhi Assembly.

The only significant post made by Kejriwal was on the photo controversy, which Atishi tried to rake and make into a big issue. Reposting Atishi's post on X on February 24, Kejriwal wrote in Hindi (loosely translated): "The new BJP government of Delhi removed Baba Saheb's photo and put up the photo of Prime Minister Modi. This is not right. This has hurt millions of followers of Babasaheb...I have a request for the BJP. You can put the photo of the Prime Minister but do not remove the photo of Baba Saheb. Let his photo remain there."

AAP's efforts to make it a big issue have come to a cropper as the photo matter has not created any support for AAP. Atishi has been trying badly to hit the road on the issue, but, except for her 20 co-MLAs, not a single extra AAP worker or leader can be seen joining her protest in the streets. She has even written a letter to the Speaker, objecting to the suspension of 21 MLAs and has tried to make the Assembly ruckus as AAP's fight for Ambedkar. "On 25 February 2025, during the address of the Lieutenant Governor, MLAs of the ruling party raised slogans of 'Modi-Modi,' while the opposition MLAs raised slogans of 'Jai Bheem,' respecting the views of Baba Saheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar. It is very unfortunate that no action was taken against any MLA of the ruling party, but 21 MLAs of the opposition were suspended from the House for three days for raising the slogan 'Jai Bheem,'" she wrote.

While Atishi has been trying to keep AAP 'activism' active in Delhi, Kejriwal has gone silent. It is not that Kejriwal has no involvement in whatever Atishi is doing, but the AAP chief seems to prefer to stay low and do jobs from the backroom.

Currently, in the national capital, only Atishi and Gopal Rai seem to be handling the Delhi affairs and the rest all seem to have just vanished after massive electoral defeats. Most of the rest of the AAP leaders seem to be busy with varied activities.

Former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia has also not been visible in the capital or on social media. Rajya Sabha member Sanjay Singh has been busy with the Haryana municipal polls. Former Minister Saurabh Bhardwaj is active mostly on X.

Kejriwal is said to be busy keeping his flock together in Punjab, where internal rifts are being reported. It is also said that he is seeking entry to Parliament through the Rajya Sabha route in order to keep his political scales up despite crushing defeat in Delhi. While he may or may not gain entry to the Upper House, his deeds of previous years are getting exposed in the Delhi Assembly.

It was quite expected for the ruling BJP to go aggressive with the 14 CAG reports that the previous AAP government in Delhi had hidden for fear of exposure. Some of them were presented to the L-G four years ago, but the then-Kejriwal government kept them under the carpet. The reports are now being tabled one by one, exposing the AAP underbelly. It was known that things were not right on the ground under the Kejriwal-led government, but the extent is now being exposed.

As per the CAG reports, everything seems to be wrong with the AAP dispensation in Delhi. These reports, including performance audits on several issues such as the cost of renovating former CM Arvind Kejriwal's residence, liquor supply in Delhi, prevention and mitigation of air pollution, functioning of the Delhi Transport Corporation, healthcare and Mohalla Clinics, gravely reflect the then Kejriwal government's working.

The coming days may not be good for Kejriwal and his party as action may ensue on the CAG reports.

He was in jail for five months last year for his alleged role in the excise policy. After the CAG expose, his legal troubles may mount. Equally distressing for him could be his political troubles.

Air defenses destroy 48 Ukrainian drones over Russian regions : Defense Ministry

Moscow, Mar 1 (UNI) : This night, air defenses intercepted and destroyed 48 Ukrainian drones over Russian regions, the Russian Defense Ministry said in a statement.

"This past night, air defense systems on duty intercepted and destroyed 48 Ukrainian unmanned aerial vehicles," the ministry said. It said 21 drones were shot down over the territory of the Tver Region, 11 over Crimea, five over the Bryansk Region, three over the territories of the Belgorod and Rostov regions each, two over the Smolensk and Lipetsk regions each, and one over the Kursk Region.

US approves 3 bln USD arms sales to Israel

Washington, Mar 1 (UNI) : The U.S. State Department has approved potential arms sales to Israel totaling about 3 billion U.S. dollars, the Pentagon said Friday.

The packages, notified to Congress under emergency procedures, bypass standard legislative review processes.

The U.S. State Department said it had authorized a 2.04-billion-dollar arms deal with Israel, including 35,529 general-purpose bomb bodies for 2,000-pound bombs and 4,000 bunker-busting 2,000-pound warheads.

Deliveries are estimated to begin in 2026. But there is a possibility that a portion of this procurement may come from U.S. stock, potentially allowing for immediate delivery of some munitions, according to a Pentagon statement.

The second deal on 1,000-pound bombs and guidance kits, valued at 675.7 million dollars, is scheduled to be delivered in 2028. The third one is a 295-million-dollar deal on Caterpillar D9 Bulldozers, which is scheduled to be delivered in 2027.

This marked the second emergency arms approval to Israel this month without congressional review.

U.S. arms sales followed a fragile ceasefire last month that paused 15 months of hostilities between Israel and Hamas.

An Israeli delegation proposed in Cairo extending the first stage of the Gaza ceasefire agreement for an additional 42 days, an informed Egyptian security source told Xinhua on Friday. The talks have yet to address the second stage of the deal, which seeks to end the war in Gaza, and secure the complete Israeli withdrawal from the Gaza Strip, the source said on condition of anonymity. Earlier on Friday, Hamas called on the international community to pressure Israel to enter the second phase of the Gaza peace deal immediately, with the 42-day initial phase of the three-stage agreement set to expire on Saturday.

Canada will not leave Ukraine without support : Minister

Washington, Mar 1 (UNI) : Canadian Foreign Minister Melanie Joly held a conversation with Ukrainian Foreign Minister Andrii Sybiha, during which she confirmed Canada's readiness to continue to provide assistance to Ukraine.

"Just spoke with Ukrainian Foreign Minister @andrii_sybiha to reaffirm Canada's unwavering support for Ukraine. Canada remains committed to providing the necessary assistance to ensure Ukraine's security, sovereignty, and resilience," she said on X.

Following a spat in the Oval Office between US President Donald Trump and Ukraine's Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Friday, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau expressed support to Ukraine on X.

Talks between Zelenskyy and Trump regarding the peace settlement in Ukraine failed on Friday after a spat in the Oval Office. Trump's senior officials asked the Ukrainian delegation to leave the White House and canceled a joint press conference.

IMF completes 3rd review under 48-month Extended Fund Facility with Sri Lanka

Colombo, Mar 1 (UNI) The International Monetary Fund (IMF) Executive Board completed the third review under the 48-month Extended Fund Facility (EFF) with Sri Lanka, providing the country with immediate access to Special Drawing Right (SDR) 254 million (about 334 million U.S. dollars) to support its economic policies and reforms, the IMF said in a press release on Friday.

The International Monetary Fund said Sri Lanka's performance under the program has been strong and that all quantitative targets for end-December 2024 were met, except the indicative target on social spending.

The IMF said reform efforts are bearing fruit, and the recovery is gaining momentum. As the economy is still vulnerable, sustaining the reform agenda is critical to put the economy on a path toward lasting recovery and debt sustainability.

The International Monetary Fund said economic growth averaged 4.3 percent since growth resumed in the third quarter of 2023. By end-2024, Sri Lanka's real GDP is estimated to have recovered 40 percent of its losses incurred between 2018 and 2023. The recovery is expected to continue in 2025, the International Monetary Fund said.

The program supports Sri Lanka's efforts to restore and maintain macroeconomic stability and debt sustainability while protecting the poor and vulnerable, rebuilding external buffers, and enhancing growth-oriented structural reforms, including strengthening governance, the IMF said.

Zelenskyy says his ire with Trump began after negative comments

Washington, March 1 (UNI) : In the aftermath of an explosive Oval Office press conference with President Donald Trump, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said his frustration with the administration began after it issued a series of controversial comments in the five weeks after Trump's inauguration.

"It's not about [being] mad," Zelenskyy told Fox News' on "Special Report."

"[When you hear] president, vice president or somebody or senators — doesn't matter, big politicians — when they, for example, say that Ukraine is almost destroyed, that our soldiers run away, that they are not a heroes, that Ukraine lost millions of civilians, that his president is dictator.

"The reaction is that, where is our friendship between Ukraine and United States?"

Zelenskyy said it was important that Ukraine, the



US and Europe maintain their great partnership in the face of Russian President Vladimir Putin's aggression.

But when asked if he feels he should apologize for the heated discussions that erupted in the Oval Office, which began after Vance accused Zelenskyy of being "disrespectful," the Ukrainian leader said "no." "I respect the president, and I respect the American people," he said. "I'm not sure that we did

something bad."

Zelenskyy noted again that security guarantees, which caused the blowup in the Oval Office Friday, are not an issue he can disregard because the threat of another Russian invasion is too great.

Zelenskyy also reiterated he would be willing to step down as president so long as Ukraine was given NATO membership.

"We want just and lasting peace. It's true. We

want security guarantees," he said. "If [the] United States will support NATO ... I think that is enough for Ukraine."

Trump, after speaking with Putin earlier this month, began pushing the idea that Ukraine should hold elections, claiming Zelenskyy has little support among the Ukrainian public.

But under Ukraine's constitution, it cannot hold elections when Martial Law is in effect during a time of war.

British PM Starmer meets Zelenskyy, tells him he has full backing of UK, a day after Oval Office clash

London, March 1 (UNI) : UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer embraced Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Saturday and told him he has "full backing across the United Kingdom" as the two met in Downing Street, a day after the blowout at the White House with US President Donald Trump.

Zelenskyy arrived to shouts of support from people who had gathered outside 10 Downing Street.

"And as you heard from the cheers on the street outside, you have full backing across the United Kingdom," Starmer told Zelenskyy. "We stand with you, with Ukraine, for as long as it may take." The

UK Prime Minister he was happy his country had "such friends", in the wake of the disastrous White House meeting with US President Donald Trump.

The two leaders embraced outside No 10 before heading inside to discuss efforts to bring the Russia-Ukraine war to an end. Starmer will host a summit of European leaders on Sunday on the matter - as well as wider European defence - while Zelenskyy will meet King Charles III at the request of the UK government. Those meetings are set to be overshadowed by events in Washington and concerns about a hardening of

relations with the US, the BBC reported.

In recent weeks, the UK PM has sought to cast himself as a bridge between the US and Europe as it adapts to the Trump administration's desire to be less involved in European defence, after having a cordial meeting with Trump a day before Zelenskyy's.

During the Thursday meeting at the Oval Office, Starmer hand-delivered a letter from the King inviting Trump - who is fond of the Royal Family - to an unprecedented second state visit, which the Scottish National Party MPs have called on the PM to withdraw following the

Oval Office spat.

Following the acrimonious White House meeting, Zelenskyy has attempted to paper over the cracks.

In a statement, he said of Trump: "Despite the tough dialogue, we remain strategic partners. But we need to be honest and direct with each other to truly understand our shared goals." "The Ukrainian leader wrote in a string of social media posts: "It's crucial for us to have President Trump's support. He wants to end the war, but no one wants peace more than we do." "We are the ones living this war in Ukraine. It's a fight for our freedom, for our very survival."

Landslide kills 6 in southern Afghanistan's Uruzgan

Tirin Kot, Afghanistan, Mar 1 (UNI) : A landslide killed at least six people, including women and children, in southern Afghanistan's Uruzgan province, a local official reported. The disaster occurred late on Friday after heavy rain and snowfall in the Sarmory area of the province's Gizab district, said Zamir Ahmad, provincial director of culture and information. Earlier, four people lost their lives and three others were wounded after the roof of their house collapsed in Urozgan's neighboring Kandahar province on Tuesday.

At least 36 people have died and 40 others were injured in rain-related incidents throughout Afghanistan, Spokesman for the national disaster authority Mullah Janan Saeq said Wednesday.

In the last couple of days, heavy rains, snow and flash floods have impacted most parts of the poverty-stricken country.

European leaders set to meet in London

London/Washington, March 1 (UNI) : European leaders are set to meet on Sunday for an emergency summit on Ukraine, amid the fallout from the bust-up between US President Donald Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy at the Oval Office. France's President Emmanuel Macron, Poland's PM Donald Tusk, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, UK PM Keir Starmer and EU chief Ursula von der Leyen immediately threw their support behind the Ukrainian president after the White House shocker.

They are meeting on Sunday, March 2, in London for a summit on Ukraine organized by Starmer. Meanwhile, Zelenskyy is meeting with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer Saturday, a day after the tense verbal exchange between the US President, his Vice President JD Vance and Zelenskyy, which left the world gasping.

Britain's Starmer and President Emmanuel Macron of France have led efforts to convince Trump to continue supporting

Ukraine. The spat in the Oval Office in front of the media has called into question whether that support will continue, and if the United States will proceed with a dramatic rapprochement with Russia's Vladimir Putin. Most European countries came out in support of Ukraine, breaking with Washington as differences in the trans-Atlantic alliance built over the past 80 years burst into public view. "Today it became clear that the free world needs a new leader. It's up to us, Europeans, to take this challenge," European Union foreign minister Kaja Kallas said, NBC News reported.

Friday's meeting at the White House was meant to jump-start talks on a deal over Ukraine's critical minerals, but degenerated into confrontation. Zelenskyy's "dignity honors the bravery of the Ukrainian people," European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen posted on X. "Be strong, be brave, be fearless. You are never alone, dear President Zelenskyy. We will continue working with you for a just and lasting peace."

European leaders defend Zelensky after fiery White House meeting

Brussels, Mar 1 (UNI) The open clash between U.S. President Donald Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy at the White House on Friday prompted an outpouring of support from European leaders for Zelenskyy and his country.

"Your dignity honors the bravery of the Ukrainian people. Be strong, be brave, be fearless. You are never alone," European Parliament President Roberta Metsola said on social media platform X, adding, "We will continue working with you for a just and lasting peace."

"Nobody wants peace more than the Ukrainians do. Therefore we are working on a common path to a lasting and just peace," German Chancellor Olaf Scholz posted on X. "Ukraine can rely on Germany -- and on Europe."

"We were all right to help Ukraine and sanction Russia three years ago, and to continue to do so," French President Emmanuel Macron said, calling for respect for those who have been fighting since the beginning.

Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk said: "Dear Ukrainian friends, you are not alone."

Slovenian President Nataša Pirc Musar said her country "upholds the principles and respect of international law and international relations," noting "what we witnessed in the Oval Office today undermines these values and the foundations of diplomacy."

"We stand firmly in support of Ukraine's sovereignty," she continued. "It is time for Europe to take the lead on

the path to peace in Ukraine. With respect for international law, UN Charter, fairness and above all ... decency."

Czech Prime Minister Petr Fiala said: "We stand with Ukraine more than ever. Time for Europe to step up its efforts."

Croatian Prime Minister Andrej Plenkovic said: "Croatia knows from its own experience that only a just peace can last. The Croatian government stands firm in its belief that Ukraine needs such a peace -- a peace that means sovereignty, territorial integrity, and a secure Europe."

Other European leaders rallied to defend Ukraine in similar messages, including European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, European Council President Antonio Costa, Irish Taoiseach Micheal Martin, Lithuanian President Gitanas Nausėda, Moldovan President Maia Sandu, Norwegian Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Store and Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez.

Zelenskyy in response quoted these posts with "Thank you for your support." But not all European leaders backed Ukraine. Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban praised Trump on X, saying the U.S. president "stood bravely for peace. Even if it was difficult for many to digest."

Earlier in the day, a press conference at the White House where Trump and Zelenskyy were scheduled to sign the U.S.-Ukraine minerals deal was canceled, following the stunning clash between the two inside the Oval Office which ended with Zelenskyy leaving the meeting.

SL Navy drives infrastructure devt for annual Kachchativu fete

infrastructure in Kachchativu, including setting up sanitation and drinking water facilities, temporary shelters, roads, jetties and ensuring electricity supply for the upcoming festival.

Apart from that, Sri Lanka Navy is set to deploy lifesaving teams and medical teams with a temporary Sick Bay for the safety and security of the devotees attending the festival, besides undertaking colour washing and repairs of the shrine, built by the Lankan Navy, and cleaning of surrounding area and roads leading to the premises.

The Navy also made all arrangements to ferry priests, officials, devotees as well as equipment needed for the festival, from Kankasanthurai and Kurikadduwan to the Kachchativu islet, it added.

Scores of Indian pilgrims, mostly fishermen participate in the St. Antony's church festival though the 275-acre uninhabited Islet was ceded to Sri Lanka by India in 1974 as a goodwill gesture. As per Indo-Sri Lanka agreement, fishermen of both countries were allowed to fish near the Islet, dry their fishing nets and offer prayers at the church.

3 policemen injured in police station attack in Karachi

Islamabad, Mar 1 (UNI) : Three policemen were injured in an attack on a police station in Pakistan's southern port city of Karachi on Saturday, officials said.

Some unidentified assailants hurled a cracker explosive at the police station, and fled the scene, sources from Karachi police told Xinhua.

The device landed inside the premises, causing injuries to the cops, and

damaging several parked vehicles.

The injured personnel have been shifted to a nearby hospital for medical treatment. Authorities have summoned the bomb disposal squad to assess the situation, while security forces have cordoned off the area and launched an investigation to trace the perpetrators.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack yet.

The 25-year-old's match-winning 112 against Bangladesh underlined his ability to thrive in ICC tournaments, marking his fourth century in such events. His form will be crucial for the Kiwis as they look to challenge the Indian attack.

Both teams possess formidable bowling arsenals. While Bracewell and William O'Rourke have led New Zealand's charge, India has relied on the pace duo of Shami and Harshit Rana. The upcoming encounter will serve as a key test for both sides.

India's vice-captain Shubman Gill has been one of the tournament's standout batsmen. The 25-year-old began his campaign with a century against Bangladesh and followed it up with a crucial 46 against Pakistan. Having delivered notable performances against New Zealand in the past, including an unbeaten 80 in the 2023 World Cup semifinal, Gill remains a key player for India.

New Zealand has historically troubled India in ICC events, but the Men in Blue ended that streak with their semifinal triumph in 2023. With both teams through to the semifinals, the upcoming contest will determine the group leader. India, with its current form, holds the advantage and will aim to maintain an unbeaten run.

The match is scheduled for 2:30 pm IST on Sunday.

Markram leaves field due to hamstring discomfort

Karachi, Mar 1 (UNI) ; Stand-in South Africa captain Aiden Markram left the field due to discomfort in his hamstring during the ongoing match against England in the Champions Trophy, with Heinrich Klaasen taking over leadership duties in his absence here on Saturday. Markram was leading the side in place of regular skipper Temba Bavuma, who missed the match due to illness. The information regarding Markram's injury was relayed through the broadcast feed.

The extent of Markram's injury remains unclear, but team management confirmed that while he will not return to the field, he will bat in the second innings if required.

Dussen, Klaasen power SA past England in Champions Trophy



Karachi, Mar 1 (UNI) : Rassie van der Dussen's composed 72* and Heinrich Klaasen's scintillating 64 off 56 balls powered South Africa to a commanding seven-wicket victory over England in the ICC Champions Trophy at the National Stadium here on Saturday.

With this win, the Proteas finished as table-toppers of Group B, while England bowed out of the tournament with their third defeat, capping off a disappointing campaign.

Klaasen's knock saw him register his fifth consecutive fifty-plus score in ODIs, joining an elite list of South African batsmen, including Jonty Rhodes and Quinton de Kock.

His fluent stroke play, coupled with van der Dussen's solid anchoring, ensured South Africa chased down England's modest target of 180 with

125 balls to spare. Opting to bat first, England's innings never gained momentum as they faltered against South Africa's disciplined bowling attack. Marco Jansen struck early, dismissing Philip Salt (8) and Jamie Smith (0) within the first three overs. A brief resistance from Joe Root (37) and Harry Brook (19) was short-lived as Keshav Maharaj and Wiaan Mulder dismantled the middle order.

Captain Jos Buttler endured a frustrating stay at the crease, struggling for fluency before falling for 21 off 43 balls. Jofra Archer's valiant 25 off 31 deliveries provided some late runs, but England were bundled out for 179 in 38.2 overs.

Jansen led the bowling effort with 3/29 in seven overs, while Mulder (3/25) and Maharaj (2/35) ensured England never recovered. Lungi Ngidi (1/33) and Kagiso Rabada (1/42) complemented the attack

with disciplined spells.

In reply, South Africa's chase began shakily as Archer removed Tristan Stubbs for a duck and later dismissed Ryan Rickelton (27). However, Klaasen and van der Dussen steadied the innings, dominating the England bowlers with clinical stroke play.

Klaasen's aggression saw him reach his fifty in quick time, taking on the spinners and pacers alike. Van der Dussen, playing the anchor role, accelerated as the target approached, ensuring there were no hiccups in the chase.

Despite a late consolation wicket for England, Klaasen's form and South Africa's commanding performance sealed their spot atop Group B, making their way into the semifinals. England, on the other hand, endured a disappointing campaign, exiting the tournament on a low note.

Dhruv-Tanisha storm into German Open SFs

Mulheim an der Ruhr (Germany), Mar 1 (UNI) : India's Dhruv Kapila and Tanisha Crasto stormed into the semifinals of the German Open 2025 badminton tournament after defeating the People's Republic of China's Gao Jia Xuan and Wu Meng Ying in straight games at the Westenergie Sporthalle on Friday.

Paris 2024 Olympian Tanisha Crasto and her

mixed doubles partner Dhruv Kapila displayed a commanding performance to oust the Chinese duo 21-14, 21-17 in just 30 minutes.

Kapila and Crasto made a blistering start, surging to an 11-2 lead in the opening game. Although Gao and Wu staged a brief comeback to reduce the deficit to 13-10, the Indian pair swiftly reasserted their dominance to close out the first game. The second

game proved to be a tighter contest, with the Chinese pair putting up a spirited resistance.

However, Kapila and Crasto held their nerve to seal the victory and secure a semi-final berth.

Meanwhile, in men's singles, India's Tharun Manjappalli, ranked 59th in the world, bowed out of the tournament following a hard-fought 16-21, 21-17, 21-8 loss to France's third-

seeded Toma Junior Popov.

In the women's singles category, world No. 64 Unnati Hooda suffered a heartbreaking exit after a marathon battle against Japan's 41st-ranked Riko Gunji. Hooda claimed the first game 21-15 but squandered match points in the next two, ultimately falling 15-21, 25-23, 24-22.

India's Rakshitha Ramraj and Tasnim Mir also crashed out in the women's

singles section. Ramraj went down 12-21, 12-21 against fourth-seeded Mia Blichfeldt of Denmark, while Mir retired against Nguyen Thuy Linh of Vietnam. Mir was trailing 19-21, 21-12, 0-7 before conceding the match.

With Kapila and Crasto keeping India's hopes alive in the tournament, all eyes will be on their semi-final clash as they aim for a spot in the final.

In the second, a stunning forehand winner by Chandrasekar in the fifth game proved decisive, as the duo maintained their composure to close out the match in just over an hour.

Track Slab Manufacturing Factory at Anand for Bullet Train Project T-3 Package

(Standard Post Bureau)

Mumbai, March 1 : A state-of-the-art track slab manufacturing factory has been established to support the ambitious project of India's first Bullet Train, marking a significant milestone in the country's high-speed rail infrastructure. The factory is designed to produce ballastless track slabs (J-slab) of different sizes, as required. **Till date nearly 35000 track slabs have been cast (from two factories), which are equivalent to nearly 175 track km.**

Location: The factory is strategically located near the alignment at 436 km (will be serving for km 393 to 508). This proximity to the project site ensures efficient logistics and timely delivery of track slabs for the bullet train construction.

Production Capacity: The pre-cast reinforced concrete track slabs are generally 2220 mm wide, 4900 mm long and 190mm thick and each slab weighs about 4 tonnes.

The track slab manufacturing factory is designed to produce 60 slabs per day, ensuring high efficiency and a steady supply of critical components for India's first Bullet Train project. The production scope of this factory is the manufacturing of nearly 46000 J-slabs.

This facility will produce track slabs for 115 route km of high speed rail track for MAHSR corridor in Gujarat & DNH (352 km)

Stacking Capacity: To support the large production volume, the factory is equipped with an extensive **stacking capacity of 24000 track slabs.** This allows for the organized storage of produced slabs, ensuring they are ready for transportation to the construction site as needed.

Over 4,100 Firearms Surrendered in Manipur Amid Peace Efforts

Imphal, March 1 (Waari Singbul Network) : In a significant development towards restoring peace and ensuring public safety, over 4,100 firearms looted from police armouries in Manipur have been voluntarily surrendered to authorities. The initiative began on May 31, 2023, when then-Chief Minister N. Biren Singh made an appeal to the public to return firearms looted from security forces and police stations. Stressing the importance of law and order, he had warned of strict legal action against those found in illegal possession of arms and ammunition. Additionally, he urged citizens to lift road blockades to facilitate the movement of security personnel and relief materials, ensuring essential supplies reached affected areas.

Responding to Biren Singh's call, thousands of people in Manipur demonstrated their commitment to peace. Before his resignation as Chief Minister on February

9, 2025, "3,422 firearms" had already been voluntarily handed over to police stations. This milestone, reflecting the collective efforts of the state government, security forces, and the public, played a crucial role in curbing violence. "Further strengthening the initiative, Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla reiterated the appeal on February 20, 2025, urging people to surrender any illegally held firearms. His appeal yielded around 700 additional firearms, including 246 weapons surrendered by the Arambai Tenggol on February 27, marking a significant moment in the ongoing disarmament drive. "Authorities estimate that 6,020 firearms were looted from police stations and armouries during the peak of the ethnic violence.

With over 4,100 firearms now returned, this initiative underscores the power of collective action and the importance of community involvement in public safety efforts.

Manipur has been grappling with ethnic tensions since May 2023, when violence erupted between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities over long-standing issues of land, identity, and political representation. What began as protests quickly escalated into large-scale clashes, leading to hundreds of deaths, mass displacement, and the looting of police armouries. The violence fractured the state's social fabric, deepening communal divides and causing a prolonged security crisis.

The conflict drew national and international attention as security forces struggled to restore normalcy. Despite multiple rounds of peace talks and military interventions, sporadic violence and the proliferation of illicit arms continued to fuel tensions. The surrender of looted firearms marks a critical turning point, signaling a step toward de-escalation and efforts to rebuild trust among Manipur's diverse communities.

4 People who beat up a Mahavitaran team have been arrested

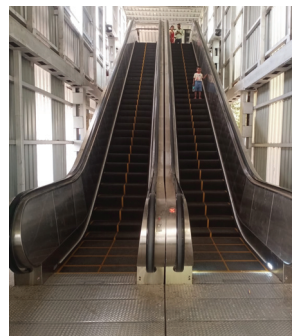
