Cyber Security Bureau bust fake call centre in Hyderabad

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) : The Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) has busted a fake call centre with the arrest of sixty-three individuals at Hitech city here. The centre operating under the banner of 'Exit Solutions', targeted NRIs and US citizens, police said here on Thursday. The individuals, posing as 'PayPal customer' care representatives, tricking them into fraudulent financial transactions.

The centre operated at night between 8 PM to 4 AM was busted by TGCSB in an operation carried out on the intervening night of Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and Thursday (March 6, 2025).

Investigation revealed that the centre has been operational since the beginning of January 2025. Each of the employees was asked to make at least 30 calls a day, totalling over 600 calls per day.

The centre employed a large number of telecallers, mostly from Northeastern states.

Cabinet approves SC classification draft bill, Future City, and major welfare initiatives

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) : The Telangana Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, held a crucial six-hour meeting, approving several key decisions, including the SC classification draft bill and the establishment of the Future City.

Announcing the decisions at the Secretariat on Thursday night, Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy stated that the government has planned to develop a "Future City" across 30,000 acres between the Outer Ring Road (ORR) and Regional Ring Road (RRR), covering seven mandals and 54 villages along the Nagarjuna Sagar-Srisailem Highway. A total of 90 posts have been sanctioned for the Future City project. The Hyderabad



Metropolitan Development Authority (HMMDA) area has also been expanded to 11 districts, 104 mandals, and 1,355 villages, with 332 new revenue villages to be created. In a major announcement for women's

empowerment, the government aims to make one crore women crorepatris (millionaires) by bringing all women's groups under a single umbrella. The age criteria for membership have been revised, lowering the

minimum age from 18 to 15 and extending the upper limit from 60 to 65.

The Cabinet also approved the recruitment of 10,954 village-level officer posts, providing employment opportunities

for the state's youth. Additionally, it sanctioned a new tourism policy, designating 27 locations as tourist destinations in the city. Further, Telangana will host the Miss World 2025 competition in May, with participation from 145 countries.

The Cabinet also decided to hold an all-party meeting on the reorganisation of constituencies, with an emphasis on increasing legislative seats in southern regions.

Backward Class Minister Ponnampalapati Prabhakar announced that the Cabinet has withdrawn the earlier decision of 37 per cent reservation for BCs and instead approved an increase to 42 per cent reservations for the community.

New policy for journalists' welfare

Soon: Minister Seethakka

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) : Telangana Women and Child Welfare, Panchayati Raj, and Rural Development Minister Dr Danasari Anasuya Seethakka announced plans to introduce a new policy for the welfare and development of journalists in the state.

Speaking at the International Women's Day celebrations organized by The Journalist Cooperative Housing Society Limited in Jubilee Hills on Thursday, Seethakka said she would discuss with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy issues concerning journalists, including welfare, medical benefits, salaries, and overall development, with the goal of formulating a comprehensive policy.

Attending as the chief guest, the minister honoured senior women journalists and praised their contributions to the field. Society President Brahmandabheri Goparaju briefed her on the society's history and ongoing efforts to support journalists. Seethakka emphasised that International Women's Day is a celebration of enthusiasm and empowerment, marked by various themes each year. She expressed hope that women journalists would not only excel in the profession but also become media entrepreneurs. Acknowledging the challenges they face, she pointed out issues such as workplace discrimination, unequal pay, and sexual harassment, even in the media industry.

Highlighting the media's crucial role in addressing public concerns, she urged for

more coverage of women achievers across various sectors. She also stressed the significant contribution of journalists to the Telangana movement and encouraged them to use their platform to bring positive change in society. Seethakka stated that the Congress government has historically supported journalists by providing housing and land. She emphasised that respect for women should begin at home, be reinforced in schools, and be integrated into educational curricula. She also called for awareness about the legal consequences of disrespecting women.

Mumbai, Mar 6 (UNI) : Senior Congress leader and MP, Rahul Gandhi, arrived here on Thursday in order to review the party's position in Maharashtra ahead of upcoming local bodies elections, said the party sources.

His visit is considered strategically important for the Congress ahead of elections to the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC).

Rahul Gandhi is likely to meet top Congress leaders during the day today, when he may discuss upcoming local bodies elections and organisational issues.

He will also take stock of Dharavi development project today and will stay overnight at Trident Hotel in Bandra-Kurla Complex in western suburb of Bandra, before proceeding to Ahmedabad on Friday (tomorrow), where he will hold a series of meetings with Gujarat Congress leaders and party members, said a Congress leader here.

Minister will release the Mahila Shakti Policy and flag off buses designated for Mahila Samaikhyas.

Police authorities have been instructed to implement foolproof security, bandobust, and traffic management measures to ensure hassle-free movement. Buses arriving from districts will be parked at Bison Polo Grounds, and proper lighting will be arranged in the parking areas.

Santhi Kumari also stressed the importance of sanitation, directing officials to set up mobile toilets in adequate numbers and ensure a sufficient supply of drinking water and

buttermilk for attendees. The Electricity Department has been asked to provide an uninterrupted power supply.

Meanwhile, Roads & Buildings (R&B) officials reported that preparations, including stage erection, barricading, lighting, parking, and seating arrangements, are already underway. CM and cabinet must take responsibility for loss of eight lives in SLBC tunnel disaster

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) : Accusing Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and several Ministers of prioritizing their commissions over workers' safety, leading to the tragic SLBC tunnel disaster, BRS working President K T Rama Rao (KTR) on Thursday alleged that despite having two reports warning about the dangers of the site, the government continued tunnel operations for its selfish gains, ultimately claiming eight lives.

In a statement, KTR condemned the negligence, stating that the state cabinet must take full responsibility for both the irreparable loss of lives and the wastage of thousands of crores of public money. He revealed that Jaiprakash Associates Limited had surveyed in collaboration with Amberg Tech AG in 2020 to assess the tunnel site. The Tunnel Seismic Prediction (TSP)

survey conducted by Amberg Tech AG in 2022 had already predicted and warned about the accident well in advance. The report explicitly identified a fault zone between 13.88 km and 13.91 km of the tunnel, highlighting the presence of weak rock formations and severe water leakages. KTR pointed out that the recent accident occurred precisely in the fault zone mentioned in the report. KTR also said that the state government was also in possession of another geological survey report conducted in 2022 by former Director General of the Geological Survey of India, Mandapalli Raju, and Jaiprakash Associates geologist Rituraj Deshmukh. This report indicated that the tunnel construction began without properly assessing the surface conditions, further proving the gross negligence of the government.

Stock market extends gains for 2nd day; Sensex rallied 610 points

Mumbai/New Delhi, Mar 6 (UNI) India's benchmark indices continued the positive momentum and ended on a strong note as the BSE Sensex on Thursday added another gain of about 610 points at 74,340.09 mainly due to cooling of crude and potential negotiations on US tariffs improved global sentiments and fueled this rebound. The National Stock Exchange (NSE) rose 207.40 points at 22,544.70.

The selling off by the Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) continued as they sold equities in the cash segment worth Rs 2895 crore while the Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) bought equities to the tune of Rs 3,370.6 crore in the trading session yesterday,

according to data available.

Though oscillation was seen during the day, the equity market remained strong for another day. The Sensex opened firm at 74,308.30, up 578 points. It rose 660 points during intraday to touch day's high of 74,390.80, before closing at 73,340.09, advancing 609.86 points from its previous close. The Nifty registered day's high at 22,556.45 and low at 22,245.85 points. The Mid-cap and small-cap indices rose by 0.65 per cent and 1.65 per cent respectively.

The stocks that climbed were Energy by 2.78 per cent, Metal by 2.64 per cent, Oil and Gas by 2.36 per cent, and Commodities by 1.65 per cent. In the 30-scrip BSE Sensex, shares of 25 shares advanced and

closed higher compared to their previous closing price, while shares of 5 companies declined and ended in red.

The gainers were Asian Paints by 4.70 per cent to Rs 2267.10, NTPC by 3.41 per cent to Rs 337.75, Reliance Industries by 2.96 per cent to Rs 1210.55 and Tata Steel by 2.87 per cent to Rs 150.35.

The losers during today's trade were Tech Mahindra by 2.31 per cent to Rs 1503.60, Kotak Bank by 0.90 per cent to Rs 1921.60, Zomato by 0.62 per cent to Rs 225.40 and Tata Motors by 0.19 per cent to Rs 639.75. Asian Market were seen as strong, as Strait Times was up by 0.48 per cent, Hang Seng by 3.18 per cent, Kospi by 0.70 per cent and Jakarta Composite by 1.41 per cent.

Who is stopping you from getting POJK back? : J&K CM

Jammu, Mar 6 (UNI) Reacting to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's statement that Pakistan vacating Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK) would resolve the Kashmir issue in its entirety, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Thursday said that Kargil was an opportunity to get back the part of POJK but who is stopping the government now from getting it back?

"Who is stopping the Government of India from taking back the Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (POJK)?" Abdullah questioned while speaking during the Motion of Thanks on Lieutenant Governor's address in the House in the ongoing Budget Session of the Legislative Assembly here. "Maharaja Hari Singh gave you a map of Jammu and Kashmir as inheritance and part of it is with Pakistan, Okay, fine and the Foreign Minister has said that we will get it back. Who has stopped you?"

Abdullah said. "We did not stop you. We always said bring it back if you want to," he said adding, "During the Kargil war, you had a chance to take POJK back, but you failed and if you could not make it at that time, you bring it now, who is stopping you? We are not objecting to it?" "But if you see the map of Jammu and Kashmir, one part is with Pakistan, but one part is also with China," said Abdullah while taking a dig at the Government of India. "Why doesn't the BJP government talk about taking back Jammu and Kashmir occupied by China? Why no mention is made anywhere on that part," he said, adding, "whenever you bring it back, do us a favour, bring back both the occupied parts." "Let's forget about the occupied parts, but you also divided the map of Maharaja Sahib into two parts. You separated Ladakh and claimed that the people of Ladakh wanted that. Did you ever ask them? People of Kargil

never supported this decision. Even those who celebrated August 5, 2019 and distributed sweets, at present realise that their conditions were much better in the erstwhile state," he asserted.

Maharaja in inheritance left State Subject Laws, where are those laws, he said adding, "What rights do you have on your lands and jobs. Himachal Pradesh is in much better condition with maximum percentage of local recruitment in factories, industries and hotels."

"We did not make any changes in Maharaja's laws in our tenure. Quote me a single example if we had changed the names of parks, roads, and other buildings," he said. However, targeting the BJP, Abdullah also said, "BJP members insulted the martyrs of July 13, 1931. 22 people sacrificed their lives for democracy. The Jammu and Kashmir Assembly was established due to their sacrifice but BJP insulted them just because they were Muslims."

Govt launches New Credit Assessment Model for MSMEs

New Delhi, Mar 6 (UNI) The government on Thursday launched the New Credit Assessment Model based on the scoring of digital footprints of MSMEs wherein the Public sector banks (PSBs) will build their in-house capability to assess MSMEs for credit, instead of relying on external assessment. Launching the model at Vishakhapatnam, the Union Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister, Nirmala Sitharaman and Minister of State, Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said PSBs will develop a new credit assessment model, as announced in the Budget, based on the scoring of digital footprints of MSMEs in the economy. This credit assessment model will leverage the digitally fetched and verifiable data available in the ecosystem and devise automated journeys for MSME Loan appraisal using objective decisioning for all loan applications and model-based limit assessment for both Existing to Bank (ETB) as well as New to Bank (NTB) MSME borrowers, Ministry of Finance said in a statement.

The digital footprints used by the model may include Name and Pan authentication using NSDL, Mobile and

email verification using OTP, API fetch of GST data through service providers, Bank Statement Analysis using account aggregator, ITR upload and verification, API enabled commercial and consumer bureau fetch and due diligence using CICs, fraud checks, Hunter checks through APIs, among others.

The benefits to MSMEs by use of this model includes submission of application from anywhere through online mode, reduced paperwork and Branch visit, instant in-principle sanction through digital mode, seamless processing of credit proposals, end to end straight through process (STP), reduced turnaround time (TAT), Credit decision based on objective data/ Transactional behaviour and credit history, no Physical collateral securities for loans covered under CGTMSE, among others.

The credit assessment model for MSMEs based on digital footprints is expected to be a significant improvement over the traditional assessment of credit eligibility based only on asset or turnover criteria. That will also cover MSMEs without a formal accounting system.

India protests heckling of EAM by Khalistanis during London visit

New Delhi, Mar 6 (UNI) : India today condemned the breach of security during External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's London visit when a group of Khalistani separatists heckled him and tried to block his car. On Wednesday evening, EAM Jaishankar was heckled by a group of

Khalistani supporters who were shouting anti-India slogans when the minister was going for a programme in London. As the External Affairs Minister left the venue, one among the pro-Khalistani elements dashed in front of his car and tore the national flag of India, according to visuals on social

media. The pro-Khalistani elements were shouting slogans using mikes as the EAM arrived for his talk at Chatham House and remained at the venue when he left, with the local police standing by quietly. In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said: "We have seen the footage of a

breach of security during the visit of EAM to the UK. "We condemn the provocative activities of this small group of separatists and extremists. "We deplore the misuse of democratic freedoms by such elements. "We expect the host government in such cases to fully live upto their diplomatic

obligations." In the past too, the London police have been quiet bystanders when Khalistani activists clambered on to the balcony of the Indian High Commission and attempted to replace the Indian national flag with the Khalistani flag. India had strongly protested the action.

Odisha Governor welcomes Indian Navy's car rally expedition

Bhubaneswar, Mar 6 (UNI) Odisha Governor Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati on Thursday welcomed the Indian Navy's Motor Car Rally Expedition at Raj Bhavan here.

The rally was flagged off from INS Netaji Subhas, Kolkata, on March 3.

Covering approximately 3,800 km, the expedition will travel from Kolkata to Chennai, proceed to Kanyakumari, and return to Chennai by March 21.

The initiative aims to enhance maritime awareness, engage with youth and civil society, and promote career opportunities in the Indian Navy, including the Agnipath Scheme.

As part of the journey, the rally team will visit schools and colleges to inspire young men and women to join the Indian Navy.

Additionally, it will promote the Centre's Naari Shakti initiative for women's empowerment.

The team will also interact with naval veterans and Veer Naris to update them on the latest welfare policies of the government and the Navy.

HP marks 120 years since devastating Kangra earthquake

Shimla, Mar 6 (UNI) As Himachal Pradesh marks 120 years since the catastrophic Kangra earthquake of 1905, the shockwaves of the tragedy still resonate across the region. The earthquake, one of the deadliest in Indian history, measured between 7.8 and 7.9 in magnitude and left over 20,000 people dead, 53,000 domestic animals lost, and nearly 100,000 buildings reduced to rubble. The destruction of critical infrastructure, including the aqueduct network, led to prolonged suffering and massive economic losses.

"To honor the victims and reinforce disaster preparedness, the Himachal Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (HPSDMA) is organizing a large-scale Disaster Awareness Campaign across the state. This campaign aims to educate communities, particularly the youth, about earthquake preparedness and resilience-building measures.", a letter written by the additional Secretary Revenue and Disaster management Balwan Chand to all Head of Department said. The key events scheduled for the occasion include evacuation drills across government and

private institutions, a Citizen Solidarity March in all district headquarters, and awareness workshops in schools, universities, and healthcare institutions.

The highlight of the initiative is the ShakeOut Drill, which will see thousands participating in "Drop, Cover & Hold" exercises to simulate real-time earthquake response.

Additionally, Gram Sabha meetings throughout April will focus on earthquake-resistant construction practices, ensuring that local communities understand and adopt safer building techniques. The campaign also includes the dissemination of earthquake safety guidelines and hands-on training for students, teachers, and officials on emergency protocols.

In light of past disasters and growing seismic risks, the government has intensified its commitment to minimizing future losses. The State Emergency Response Plan has been revised to include strengthening infrastructure with mandatory earthquake-resistant building codes for new constructions, particularly in high-risk zones. Special training

programs for engineers, masons, and local builders are being conducted to promote disaster-resistant housing. The deployment of seismic monitoring stations across Himachal Pradesh will provide real-time alerts, while disaster preparedness will be integrated into school curricula with routine community drills. Additionally, following the 2023 monsoon-triggered landslides and flash floods that damaged over 13,000 homes, the government is focusing on climate-adaptive construction and stricter zoning laws to prevent unsafe development in landslide-prone areas.

While such workshops and drills are crucial, their real impact lies in execution during emergencies. Experts argue that sustained follow-up action is needed beyond annual events. For meaningful change, local authorities must enforce building regulations, ensure regular evacuation drills, and make emergency kits accessible to residents. With the painful memories of the 1905 disaster still etched in the region's history, the state's ongoing preparedness efforts aim to ensure that a future earthquake does not bring the same level of devastation.

Minister Venkat Reddy inaugurates state guest house at Praja Bhavan

Malkajgiri railway station undergoing Rs 27.61 cr redevelopment under ABSS

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) The Malkajgiri Railway Station is undergoing a major redevelopment with an estimated cost of Rs. 27.61 crore under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme (ABSS). The project, aimed at upgrading passenger facilities, is progressing rapidly, with 60 per cent of the work already completed and full completion targeted within this financial year. As part of the broader ABSS initiative, 40 railway stations across Telangana are being redeveloped at a cost of Rs. 2,737 crore to provide modern amenities and transform them into regional growth centres.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for these redevelopment projects in August 2023 and February 2024.

Malkajgiri Railway Station, a key suburban hub just 3 km from Secunderabad, sees a daily footfall of 2,500 passengers and generates annual earnings of Rs. 5.48 crore. The redevelopment includes a new station building façade, a 12-meter-wide foot overbridge with three lifts and escalators, improved platform surfaces, additional covered areas, upgraded waiting halls and restrooms, and dedicated facilities for Divyangjan passengers. Enhanced passenger amenities such as a spacious concourse, food stalls, and modern signage are also part of the project. Landscaping, traffic flow improvements, and artistic depictions of local culture will further enhance the station's aesthetics.

With 27 pairs of trains halting at Malkajgiri, the redevelopment aims to significantly boost commuter convenience and connectivity in the twin cities.

SDPI workers booked in Mumbra for protesting without police nod

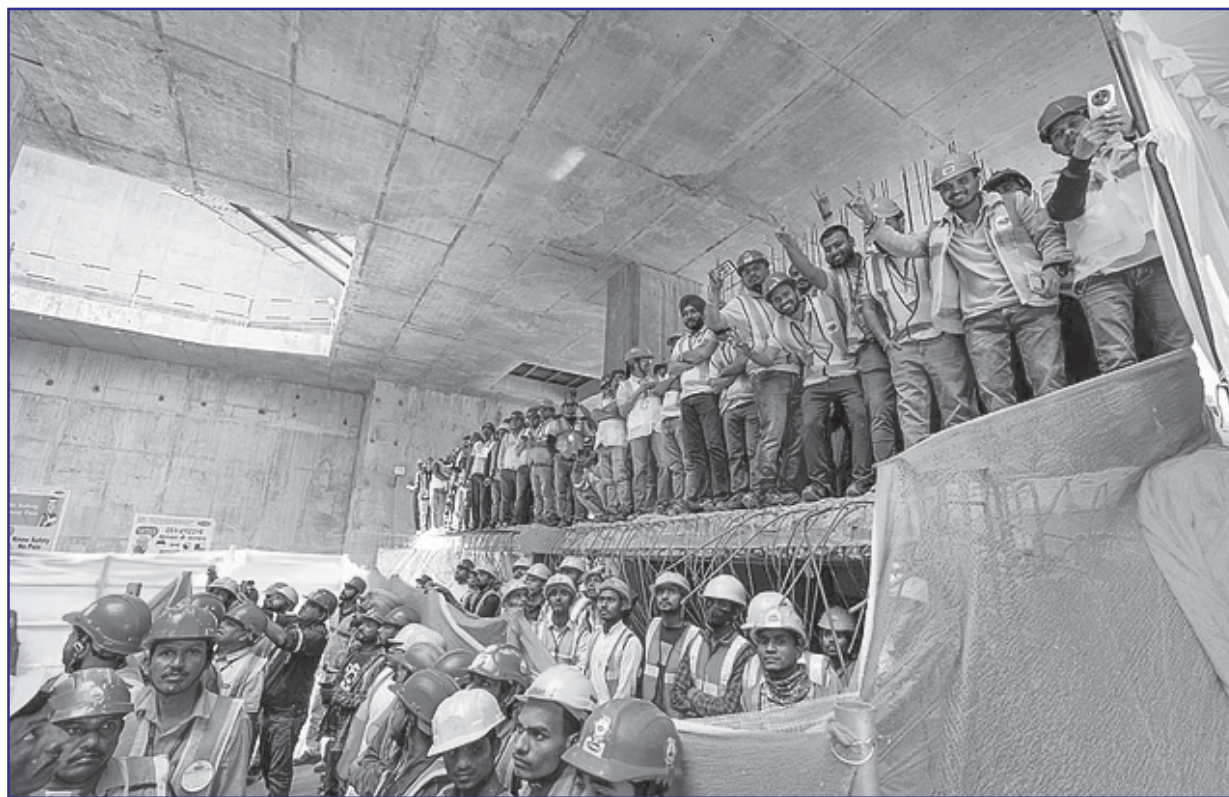
CM directs quick resolution of workers' claims; New EPFO Zonal office inaugurated

Police crackdown on Cyber Fraud Racket; 63 held at fake Call Center

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) The Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) has busted a major cyber fraud operation running a fake call center in Patrika Nagar, Hi-Tech City, and arrested 63 individuals.

All the individuals, working at the fake call center were primarily from North Eastern states of India, said TGCSB Director Shikha Goel, in a press conference here on Thursday.

They were targeting NRIs and US Citizens, she said.

Police identified the mastermind behind the racket as Kaivan Patel

Rupesh Kumar alias Jaddhu alias Jadu Bhai, a resident of Gujarat, who was operating the racket along with his elder brother, Vickey, who resides in Dubai, and Ajad, she said.

The operation, conducted by TGCSB, led to the arrest of 63 key suspects, with investigations ongoing to identify further links, she said the accused, working at 'Exito Solutions, a fake call center, impersonated customer care representatives of 'PayPal to deceive victims.

Using advanced software like EYEBEAM and X-LITE, they placed

fraudulent calls and sent phishing emails, specifically targeting PayPal customers based in the United States, falsely claiming that unauthorized transactions had been made on the victim's account, she said.

Victims were tricked into calling a fake "fraud prevention team" listed in the emails, where scammers pressured them into sharing sensitive banking details under the pretense of securing a refund or stopping fraudulent activity, she revealed.

In some cases, victims were convinced to transfer money to "safe accounts"

to prevent further unauthorized transactions, only to realize later that they had been scammed, she said.

These individuals were responsible for providing stolen customer data from PayPal and arranging mule bank accounts in the USA, which were used to receive fraudulently obtained money.

They have converted illicit funds into cryptocurrency, making the money untraceable.

The investigation has revealed that the entire network was controlled by Jadu Bhai alias La Bhai, and Rahul alias Pratik under the

These individuals were recruited using social media platforms like LinkedIn, Instagram, and Facebook, with promises of ₹30,000 salaries for working in a "call center." However, once recruited, they were trained in deceptive tactics to commit cyber fraud.

During the raid, 52

mobile phones 63 Laptops, 27 ID Cards of Exito Solutions used in fraudulent activities, were seized, she informed.

Further investigation is underway to identify additional suspects, including Justin, a key recruiter, and Jadu Bhai, who managed the operations, she added.

TGCSB urged citizens to remain vigilant and avoid falling prey to such sophisticated cyber scams. Report suspicious activity immediately to the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) by calling 1930 or filing a complaint on www.cybercrime.gov.in.

Women shaping future of India's mining sector: Kishan Reddy

Hyderabad, Mar 6 (UNI) Union Minister for Coal and Mines and Telangana BJP President G. Kishan Reddy emphasised the crucial role of women in shaping India's mining sector, stating that their growing participation is driving the nation's progress. Speaking at the "Women in Mining India" program organised by the Ministry of Coal and Mines, Government of India, in Begumpet on Thursday ahead of International Women's Day, he praised women's contributions across various fields, from security forces to scientific

research. Reddy highlighted government initiatives such as Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Ujjwala Yojana, and Mudra Yojana, which have empowered women economically and socially.

He noted efforts to increase women's representation in mining, including permitting underground work and night shifts, expanding leadership programs, and enhancing workforce participation in Coal India and Singareni. Announcing new welfare measures, Reddy stated that women in the mining sector would

She highlighted that women's participation in the mining sector globally stands at 8-10 per cent and called for greater encouragement for women in the industry.

Stressing the importance of equal pay for equal work, she asserted that women can excel not only in space but also underground if given the opportunity.

However, she pointed out that social constraints often hinder women's progress, urging families, society, and government officials to support them. She also called on the

Centre to allocate a larger budget for women's welfare and empowerment.

Earlier, in her welcome address, Farida M Naik, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Mines, Government of India, welcomed attendees to the Ministry's first Women's Day event celebrating women in mining. She addressed concerns about whether the contributions of men were being overlooked, clarifying that the event honours both longstanding traditions and hard-won achievements. Sharing her experience, she recalled that when she joined the Ministry in 2017-18, she was surprised to learn that women were legally barred from entering mines—a restriction that persisted even 70 years after independence. However, this changed in 2019 when the law was amended to allow women in mining, marking a significant milestone in the government's reform efforts. She emphasised that while ensuring women's safety is crucial, restricting their opportunities is not. The Prime Minister has advocated for making workplaces safer for women rather than excluding them.

While women have traditionally held HR, data, and CSR roles in the mining sector, their direct participation in operations remained limited. Since 2019, notable progress has been made, including Tata's all-women mining shift and Vedanta's all-women rescue team competing internationally. While challenges remain, she stressed the importance of celebrating these achievements. She noted that the Union Minister Kishan Reddy, a strong advocate for women in high-risk sectors, believes Women's Day is both a time to reflect on progress and discuss future steps.

Union Minister of State for Coal and Mines Satish Chandra Dubey, Principal Secretary of Industries and Mines Department, Government of Gujarat, Manta Warma, and Joint Secretary and Financial Advisor, Ministry of Coal and Mines, Nirupama Kotru, also addressed the gathering. Several women employees shared their experiences and the challenges they faced in the mining industry. 90 pc of rural women entrepreneurs in India save a portion of their monthly income

A whopping 90 per cent of rural women entrepreneurs in India save a portion of their monthly income, according to a new report on Thursday, ahead of International Women's Day.

The report by DBS Bank India, in collaboration with Haqdarshak, is based on a survey of 411 women entrepreneurs across rural districts in Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Rajasthan, with 402 being members of Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

Of the 90 per cent, 57 per cent save less than 20 per cent of their monthly income, while 33 per cent save between 20 per cent and 50 per cent, said the report. About 5 per cent save more than 50 per cent of their income, while the remaining respondents are unsure about the portion of their income saved, suggesting a need for improved financial literacy and planning.

The report noted that 56 per cent of rural women entrepreneurs opt for bank deposits, 39 per cent participate in SHG savings programmes, and 18 per cent set aside cash without investing it in any instruments.

Fixed Deposits (FDs) and Recurring Deposits (RDs), as well as investments in gold, were found to be less common, with only 11 per cent and 5 per cent opting for these methods, respectively. Approximately 64 per cent reinvested their business profits into their enterprises, reflecting a strong orientation towards business expansion and growth.

"Our report offers valuable insights to inform programmes aimed at accelerating women's entrepreneurship and addressing growth barriers," said Azmat Habibulla, Managing Director and Head of Group Strategic Marketing and Communications at DBS Bank India.

"We aim to drive meaningful dialogue and build actionable solutions that bridge knowledge gaps, ensuring these women have improved access to social protection and financial services, ultimately fostering a more equitable economy," added Aniket Doegar, Co-Founder and CEO of Haqdarshak.

Noting a shift towards greater financial autonomy, the report stated that 18 per cent of rural women entrepreneurs make financial decisions independently, while 47 per cent make financial decisions jointly with their husbands.

About 24 per cent stated that their husbands make all financial decisions, and the remaining 11 per cent consult their immediate or extended family members.

This distribution highlights both progress and persistent traditional norms.

Mizoram: An Emerging National Security Threat in India's Northeast

Imphal, March 6, (Waari Singbul Network) : The northeastern states of India have long been a complex tapestry of ethnic diversity, historical grievances, and geopolitical significance. Among them, Manipur and Mizoram—two states sharing borders with Myanmar—have recently drawn attention for their roles in the evolving security landscape of the region. While Manipur has been embroiled in ethnic violence since May 2023, grappling with internal strife between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities, Mizoram has quietly emerged as a more insidious national security concern.

Manipur: A Visible Crisis Contained Within Borders

Manipur's challenges are stark and immediate. The ethnic violence that erupted in May 2023 has claimed over 258 lives and displaced more than 60,000 people, according to official figures as of November 2024. The conflict, rooted in tensions over land rights, affirmative action, and illegal immigration from Myanmar, has exposed deep ethnic fault lines between the valley-dwelling Meiteis and the hill-based Kuki-Zo tribes. The state's proximity to the Golden Triangle—a notorious drug-producing region spanning Myanmar, Laos, and Thailand—has also fueled a narco-economy, with poppy cultivation and drug trafficking exacerbating local instability. The Manipur government's "War on Drugs" has made strides in curbing this menace, reportedly reducing drug transit through the state to near negligible levels by late 2024, thanks to aggressive enforcement and central government support.

Yet, Manipur's crisis, while severe, remains largely an internal affair. The violence has not overtly spilled beyond its borders, and the central government's imposition of President's Rule in



February 2025 reflects a decisive effort to contain and address the situation. The state's security challenges, tied to ethnic rivalries and narcotics, are being met with a combination of military presence, administrative oversight, and diplomatic measures like border fencing along the Indo-Myanmar frontier. Mizoram's threats, though significant, are visible, localized, and—at least for now—manageable within India's federal framework. Mizoram: A Quiet but Growing Menace

In contrast, Mizoram presents a subtler but potentially more dangerous threat to India's national security. Historically a conduit for cross-border trade and migration due to its 510-kilometer porous border with Myanmar, Mizoram has recently seen a dramatic spike in narcotics and explosives trafficking. The unrest in Manipur since 2023 has diverted drug routes from the Moreh-Sugnu axis in Manipur to the Zokhawthar-Kolasib axis in Mizoram, turning the latter into a preferred transit hub for heroin, methamphetamine, and cannabis originating from Myanmar. Data from 2023 indicates that Mizoram's security forces seized contraband worth over ₹78 crore in just over a month,

a sharp increase attributed to the shifting dynamics of the regional drug trade. Meanwhile, the state's Governor, in February 2025, highlighted the arrest of 600 drug traffickers and the seizure of 429 kilograms of narcotics in the current financial year alone—a testament to the scale of the problem.

More alarmingly, Mizoram has emerged as a smuggling hub for explosives. In 2024, Assam Rifles intercepted over 2,000 kilograms of explosives, 60,000 detonators, and 13,000 gelatine sticks, with seizures continuing into 2025 at an accelerated pace. These materials, often destined for anti-junta forces in Myanmar or insurgent groups in Bangladesh, underscore Mizoram's role as a logistical lifeline for regional instability. The porous border, combined with lax oversight of licensed explosives dealers, raises the specter of these weapons being redirected to Indian insurgent groups—a scenario Assam Rifles officers have repeatedly flagged as a "larger danger."

Zo State Advocacy: A Separatist Undercurrent Compounding these material threats is Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma's vocal advocacy for a unified Zo state, an

aspiration that transcends India's national boundaries. The Zo people—encompassing the Mizo, Kuki, Zomi, and Chin communities across India, Myanmar, and Bangladesh—share ethnic and cultural ties that Lalduhoma has leveraged to push a narrative of reunification. In September 2024, speaking to the Kuki-Zo diaspora in the United States, he declared that the Zo people "do not accept boundaries between countries" and envisioned a future where they rise "under one leadership to achieve our destiny of nationhood." This rhetoric, echoed by his predecessor Zoramthanga during the Manipur crisis, directly challenges India's territorial integrity and has drawn sharp rebukes from Manipur's Chief Minister N. Biren Singh, who warned against interference in his state's affairs.

Lalduhoma's stance is not mere political posturing. It aligns with a broader, decades-long agenda speculated by some observers to carve out a "Kuki-Chin nation" from contiguous areas of Myanmar, India, and Bangladesh. This vision involves illegal immigration, land acquisition, and the establishment of autonomous zones—steps that could culminate in

separatism. Mizoram's hosting of over 12,500 displaced Kuki-Zo individuals from Manipur and 40,000 refugees from Myanmar and Bangladesh further fuels this narrative, creating a demographic and political base for Zo unification efforts.

The Pact of Pro-Democratic Outfits: A Tipping Point?

The recent signing of a pact by pro-democratic outfits in Mizoram, reported in February 27, 2025, marks a critical escalation. While details remain sparse, this agreement—purportedly involving armed rebel groups advocating for democratic reforms and fighting government forces in Myanmar—signals Mizoram's growing entanglement with anti-junta forces across the border.

Such alliances could legitimize Mizoram as a staging ground for transnational militancy, drawing parallels to the state's historical role during the Mizo insurgency of the 1960s and 1970s.

Unlike Manipur, where militant groups like the Kuki National Army operate within a domestic context, Mizoram's pact risks internationalizing its security challenges, potentially inviting foreign actors—such as China, which views India's Act East policy with

suspicion—into the fray. "Why Mizoram Outweighs Manipur as a Threat"

Manipur's crisis, while devastating, is a fire that burns brightly but within a confined space. Its ethnic violence and narco-issues are being addressed through direct intervention, and its leadership has reaffirmed its commitment to India's unity. Mizoram, however, is a slow-burning fuse with far-reaching implications. Its transformation into a narcotics and explosives hub not only undermines India's internal security but also strengthens destabilizing forces in a volatile region. The state's leadership, by championing Zo reunification, flirts with separatism at a time when India is fortifying its northeastern borders against external threats.

The central government's reimposition of the Protected Area Regime in December 2024, requiring foreigners to obtain permits to enter Mizoram, Manipur, and Nagaland, is a belated acknowledgment of these risks. Yet, it may not suffice. Mizoram's trajectory demands a more robust response: stricter border controls, enhanced intelligence operations, and a clear disavowal of separatist rhetoric from its leaders. Failure to act decisively could see Mizoram eclipse Manipur as the epicenter of India's northeastern security woes, threatening not just the region but the nation as a whole.

In conclusion, while Manipur wrestles with its demons, Mizoram's quiet metamorphosis into a narcotics-explosives hub and a potential separatist stronghold poses a deeper, more insidious challenge.

The stakes are high, and the time to confront this emerging threat is now—before the fuse burns down to its inevitable, explosive end.

Super Cup 2025 set for Bhubaneswar from April 21

Bhubaneswar, Mar 6 (UNI) The All India Football Federation (AIFF) has announced that the Super Cup 2025 will be played in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, commencing from April 21.

The tournament, featuring a knock-out format, will see 16 teams vying for the coveted title. The competition will include 13 clubs from the Indian Super League (ISL) and three from the I-League. A major highlight of the tournament is that the winners will secure a berth in the 2025-26 AFC Champions League 2 (ACL2) Playoffs, adding further significance to the competition.

The Super Cup, which was first held in 2018, has been dominated by ISL teams. Bengaluru FC clinched the inaugural title in 2018, followed by FC Goa in 2019, who defeated Chennaiyin FC in the final.

The tournament was not held between 2020 and 2022 due to the Covid-19 pandemic but returned in 2023 with Odisha FC emerging victorious over Bengaluru FC. In 2024, East Bengal FC lifted the trophy.

With all past four editions being won by ISL clubs, the 2025 edition promises to be an intense battle as teams vie for both the championship and the ACL2 qualification.

Bilateral cricket between India-Pakistan depends on Indian Govt: Rajeev Shukla



Lahore, Mar 6 (UNI) Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) Vice President Rajeev Shukla has reaffirmed that any decision regarding bilateral cricket between India and Pakistan remains in the hands of Indian government.

"When it comes to cricket between the two countries, it's very straightforward and clear that the decision rests with the Indian government. Our actions will align with the Indian government's decision," Shukla told reporters on the sidelines of the second semifinal of the ICC Champions Trophy here on Wednesday.

Acknowledging Pakistan's efforts in hosting

an international tournament after a long gap, he added, "Pakistan is hosting an international tournament after quite a while, and it's great to see how well they've organized it."

Commenting on the highly anticipated India-Pakistan contests, Shukla noted that while fans from both nations eagerly await such matches, both the BCCI and the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) maintain that these encounters should take place on home soil rather than a neutral venue.

"This has always been the BCCI's stance. There's also an ICC regulation that involves government approval, which is a crucial

factor. Countries would obviously want to host an India-Pakistan match, but the decision rests with the government."

He further elaborated, "We present our perspective to the government, but the final call is made after considering various factors. It's ultimately their decision."

Addressing concerns over India playing all its matches at a single venue, Shukla dismissed suggestions of an unfair advantage. "The ICC's decision clearly stated that India's matches would be held in Dubai, while the rest would take place in Pakistan. So, the issue of fairness doesn't come into

play here. The Indian doesn't rely on pitch conditions and even in Dubai, the tracks are different. The players rely on their strengths, not the pitch conditions."

On the venue for the final, he remarked, "If Australia had won yesterday, then yes. But since they lost, the final has to be in Dubai."

Regarding the scheduling of the Asia Cup, Shukla assured that everything would proceed as planned.

"As per the current arrangement, things will proceed as expected. I had attended the Asia Cup as well, and both Roger Binny and Jay Shah have been fully supportive throughout."

N Thangaraja pulls ahead into imposing five-shot lead in round three

Ahmedabad, Mar 6 (UNI) Sri Lanka's N Thangaraja found his way back to the top of the leaderboard and made his good putting form count as he pulled ahead into an imposing five-shot lead in round three in the Ahmedabad Open being played at the Kensville Golf & Country Club near here on Thursday.

The 43-year-old Thangaraja (65-73-69), the round one leader who had slipped to second place, one behind the lead on day two, struck a solid three-under 69 to regain his lead and move his total to nine-under 207 thus opening up a huge gap over the rest of the field. Thangaraja, now the hot favourite, will be searching for his fifth PGTI title and his first win since 2023 come Friday.

Thandigarh's Harendra Gupta (70-67-75), the halfway leader, carded a 75 in the penultimate round to drop down to tied second place at four-under 212.

Mysuru's Yashas Chandra (72-70-70), the only player to have not returned an over-par score in the tournament so far, came up with a second straight 70 to gain one spot and join Gupta in tied second position.

Ahmedabad's Varun Parikh (69) was in tied fifth place at one-under 215.

Former PGTI Order of Merit winner Manu Gandas of Gurugram carded the day's best score of 67 to be placed tied 10th at two-over 218.

N Thangaraja, who had a poor day with the putter in round two, produced a contrasting third round having turned around his putting form.

Thanga made four birdies all of which came as a result of conversions from six feet. He dropped a lone bogey.

Yashas Chandra made three birdies and a bogey during his round of 70 while Harendra Gupta conceded three bogeys during his 75.

West Ham get success to draw with Man City

London, Mar 6 (UNI) : Manchester City's hopes of playing Champions League football next season were dealt a blow by a late West Ham equaliser.

Khadija Shaw thought she had sealed victory with a close-range finish after coming off the bench, but West Ham substitute Manuela Pavi clinched a well-deserved point for the hosts in the first minute of added time.

The draw meant City remain fourth in the Women's Super League table, but third-placed Arsenal have a point advantage and game in hand, the BBC reported.

Gareth Taylor made six changes to his side, but they struggled to get going as West Ham stifled their opponent's build-up play and created the better chances in the first half.

The visitors struggled to cope with West Ham's pressing and only a brilliant Ayaka Yamashita save denied Seraina Piubel, after Jill Roord was dispossessed in midfield, before she denied the home side's Swiss striker twice more following City turnovers.

West Ham began the second half much as they ended the first, but the introduction of striker Shaw on the hour mark sparked City into life.

The WSL's leading goalscorer this season forced Kinga Szemik into a smart save with her first touch, before attempting an audacious overhead kick moments later.

City debutant Laura Wienroither crashed a close-range effort against the crossbar after Shaw proved a nuisance at a set-piece, before the Jamaican striker gave City an 80th-minute lead after Mary Fowler's deep cross was flicked on by fellow substitute Vivianne Miedema. But ninth-placed West Ham's spirited performance was rewarded in the final moments when Pavi gathered the ball on the left of the box and curled a strike into the bottom far corner.

City now turn their attention to a FA Women's Cup quarter-final meeting with Aston Villa on Sunday, while West Ham are not in action until they host Tottenham on 23 March.

Women's Boxing Nationals from March 21

New Delhi, Mar 6 (UNI) The 8th Elite Women's National Boxing Championship, set to be held at Gautam Buddha University in Greater Noida from March 21 to 27, will serve as a key event in India's Olympic preparation cycle, providing a crucial platform for identifying and grooming future champions.

Organised in association with the Uttar Pradesh Boxing Association, the championship will be conducted under the competition guidelines of World Boxing and the Boxing Federation of India (BFI). The event will feature around 300 top women boxers from across the country.

The competition is open to boxers born between January 1, 1984, and December 31, 2005. Each state unit can field a maximum of 10 boxers. The deadline for entry by numbers is March 10, while final name confirmation must be completed by March 15.

The championship will officially begin with the arrival of participants on March 20, followed by the draw and technical meeting. The opening rounds will take place from March 21 to 24, leading up to the quarter-finals on March 25, semi-finals on March 26, and the grand finale on March 27. As the first

national-level event in the new Olympic preparation cycle, the championship will play a pivotal role in shaping India's future boxing stars. It will provide a competitive platform for elite boxers and contribute to the selection and development of athletes for international competitions over the next three years.

The matches will follow a three-round format, with each round lasting three minutes and a one-minute rest interval. The ten-point must-scoring system will be used in accordance with the World Boxing Technical & Competition Rules. Additionally, daily weigh-ins will be conducted for the boxers.

More than 100 coaches and support staff will be present at the event, alongside 60 technical officials who will oversee the smooth conduct of the competition.

The Railway Sports Promotion Board (RSPB) enters the tournament as the defending champion, having secured five gold medals, one silver, and two bronze medals in the previous edition. Haryana, which finished second last time, bagged seven medals, including three golds, three silvers, and one bronze. With the stakes high and India's top boxing talents in action, the championship promises to be a thrilling contest, paving the way for future champions.

Angad Bir Singh shines on senior team debut

Bhubaneswar, Mar 6 (UNI) : Angad Bir Singh became an overnight sensation after scoring a stunning 'double jalebi' goal during a shootout for the Vedanta Kalinga Lancers against Tamil Nadu Dragons in the recently concluded Hero Hockey India League.

His extraordinary feat came against one of the world's best goalkeepers, David Harte, earning him widespread acclaim and a call-up to the Indian Senior Men's Team for the FIH Pro League 2024/25.

Making his Senior Team debut against Ireland in Bhubaneswar, the 22-year-old forward reflected on the momentous occasion. "I

was absolutely thrilled before the match. It felt like the culmination of everything I had worked for," Angad said. He recalled the pre-match announcement by Chief Coach Craig Fulton, which heightened his anticipation. "When the coach announced my debut in front of the team, it felt like something special was about to happen. That moment filled me with excitement." The young forward, who previously secured Gold at the 2022 Sultan of Johor Cup, Bronze at the 2023 edition, and another Gold at the Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023, admitted to initial nerves but quickly settled into his rhythm. "For the

first minute or so, I was a bit cautious, trying not to make any mistakes. But then I told myself, 'This is just another game. Play your game, be confident.' And after that, I was fully in the flow." Angad expressed gratitude for the support from senior players, including Manpreet Singh, Hardik Singh, and Sanjay. "They were incredible, always encouraging me to play without pressure. Manpreet and Hardik were by my side throughout the match, and Sanjay, who plays right half, helped me stay grounded," he said.

Praising Fulton's approach, he highlighted how the coach's calm and

supportive demeanour eased his transition. "Before the match, Fulton told me, 'Just play your game and enjoy this moment. Don't worry about mistakes, I've got your back.' That really stuck with me." On the difference between junior and senior hockey, Angad remarked, "There's a huge difference. At the junior level, it's more about the basics. But in senior hockey, everything is tactical. The game is faster and much more strategic, so I'm constantly learning and adapting."

Looking ahead, he is determined to improve with every game and has set his sights on the biggest prize in world hockey. "The

ultimate dream is to win Gold at the Olympics. Watching our team win Bronze medals in Tokyo and Paris was incredible, but now I want to be part of the squad that goes all the way and brings home the Gold medal." Angad's debut was also a proud moment for his family. "It was a dream come true for my father to see me play in the Indian team. My entire family and relatives gathered to watch my debut match together, and their pride and joy made the moment even more special for me." As Angad Bir Singh embarks on his journey with the Senior Team, his meteoric rise signals a promising future for Indian hockey.

AIMJ President Maulana Razvi's remarks on Shami sparks row

AIMJ President Maulana Razvi's remarks on Shami sparks row

Lucknow, Mar 6 (UNI) : All India Muslim Jamaat (AIMJ) President Maulana Shahabuddin Razvi Bareilvi on Thursday sparked controversy by criticising India cricketer Mohammed Shami for drinking water during a match while fasting in the holy month of Ramadan.

Maulana Shahabuddin stated, "Roza is compulsory. A healthy person not observing it is a big crime. Shami drank water during a match, sending a wrong message. He will have to answer to God."

Maulana Khalid Rashid Farangi Mahli countered, "The Quran allows travellers and the unwell to skip Roza. Shami is travelling, so it is his choice. No one should question him." Maulana Khalid also stated that fasting is a personal matter between an individual and God, and no religious leader has the authority to interfere. He added that Shami was fulfilling his national duty, which Islam permits, and accused Maulana Razvi of creating unnecessary controversy.

Shami's cousin, Dr Mumtaz from Amroha, said it was unfair to target the cricketer when many Pakistani players also choose not to fast while playing. He urged Shami to ignore the controversy and prepare for the March 9 final match. His childhood coach, Badaruddin Siddiqui, defended Shami, asserting that representing the nation takes precedence over personal matters. He appealed to the public to stand by the India team and not let such debates distract from the game.

Proteas captain vows to learn from semi-final heartbreak

Lahore, Mar 6 (UNI) Disappointed South Africa captain Temba Bavuma didn't shy away from revealing how his side will learn from their semi-final's mistakes at the ICC Champions Trophy 2025.

South Africa's ICC silverware drought won't be ending just yet, after another promising tournament ends with the team falling agonisingly short of glory.

It's a trend the Proteas are bravely trying to confront head on, demonstrated by their captain Temba Bavuma's willingness to reveal exactly what they need to work on for when they're next in a position to strike.

It comes as New Zealand claimed their Champions Trophy semi-final match-up with South Africa by 50 runs in Lahore. It was the Proteas' only defeat of the tournament, according to an ICC media release. "It's just those

moments," Bavuma explained post-game.

"Just being a little bit more decisive in those moments (was what went wrong), not giving the opposition a chance to get back into the game. Be ruthless and really go for the game."

"So, I think for me, personally, we'll obviously have a chat as a team and see what the other guys think. But just taking care of those key moments in the game."

Bavuma also took personal accountability, after he was unable to turn a solid innings into a big one – a problem a couple of the Kiwi top-order batters didn't have, after both Rachin Ravindra and Kane Williamson scored centuries at better than a run-a-ball. "From a batting point of view, we just weren't able to (build) those partnerships," he continued. "There were one or two partnerships there,

but I think (we) probably needed either myself or Rassie van der Dussen to go on and emulate what (New Zealand's) top four batters did. A little bit of a soft dismissal from my (perspective)."

"Ideally, (we) would've wanted both of us to keep going, at least to the 30th over, we know how destructive our middle order can be. (But) unfortunately we weren't able to set that foundation for them. That just left a little too much for our middle order to do in the end." (New Zealand's total of 362/6) was always going to require someone to play well, and we had David (Miller) that did that, but we probably needed someone else as well."

South Africa coach Rob Walter agreed with Bavuma's assessment, pointing to how the middle overs of each team's batting innings proved to be the difference in the

contest. "We just lost a few key wickets in the middle," Walter told the media post-game. "If we managed to maintain a strong partnership there, I think it would have been a pretty tight finish. Yes, we could bemoan our execution a little bit, certainly you'll never question the effort of the guys, and we sort of threw whatever we could at them but unfortunately, we couldn't break that partnership, which really set them up to push towards the end."

Walter also agreed with the Kiwis' decision to bat first on the Lahore deck, which proved to be a strong batting wicket. South Africa also had every intention to set the total, as New Zealand opted to. Asked directly, Walter said, "yeah, we would have batted first."

The toss proved pivotal, allowing the Black Caps to mount serious scoreboard pressure on the Proteas.
