Ensuring a Safe Train Journey for Women Travellers

Introduction:
International Women's Day (IWD) is celebrated on the 8th of March every year, aligning with its global observance. Its roots in India trace back to the freedom struggle and early feminist movements led by figures like Sarojini Naidu and Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay. Post-independence, the Constitution granted women equal rights, but societal challenges like gender discrimination, domestic violence, workplace challenges, unsafe travel, traditional biases and narrow outlook persisted. The adoption of IWD in India gained momentum after the UN recognized it in 1975, becoming a platform to address women's issues. Women's Day in India highlights the need for gender equality and women's empowerment. Despite progress, issues like gender-based violence, unequal pay, low workforce participation, and limited access to education and healthcare persist. The day celebrates women's achievements while advocating for their rights and addressing systemic barriers.

Significance:
Women's Day in India is a time to honor women trailblazers who broke barriers in their fields. It also raises awareness about challenges faced by marginalized women, including rural, dalit, and tribal communities. The day encourages education, economic independence, and legal reforms, while challenging patriarchal norms. Campaigns, seminars, and social media trends like #BreakTheBias amplify the call for equality. **Women across the world, including in India, face numerous forms of inequity and challenges outside their homes. These issues are rooted in gender discrimination, patriarchal norms, and systemic barriers. Below are examples of inequities and problems faced by women in public spaces, workplaces, and society:**

Gender Pay Gap: Women often earn less than men for the same work. In India, the gender pay gap is around 20-30%, with women in informal sectors facing even greater disparities.

Limited Access to Education: Many girls, especially in rural areas, are denied education due to poverty, early marriage, or societal norms. This limits their opportunities for personal and professional growth.

Under-Representation in Leadership: Women are significantly underrepresented in leadership roles in politics,

corporate boards, and other decision-making positions. For example, only about 14% of Indian MPs are women.

Unequal Access to Healthcare: Women often face barriers to accessing healthcare, including lack of awareness, financial constraints, and societal stigma, especially regarding reproductive health.

Digital Divide: Women, particularly in rural areas, have less access to technology and the internet, limiting their opportunities for education, employment, and entrepreneurship.

Problems Faced by Women Outside their Homes

Harassment and Violence in Public Spaces: Women often face eve-teasing, cat-calling, stalking, and physical assault in public spaces like streets, public transport, and markets. Incidents of sexual harassment and rape remain a significant concern, with many cases going unreported due to fear or stigma.

Safety Concerns in Public Transport: Women face safety issues while using buses, trains, and auto-rickshaws, especially during late hours. Lack of adequate lighting and security exacerbates these problems.

Workplace Discrimination: Women often face gender bias, sexual harassment, and lack of opportunities for promotion in workplaces. The glass ceiling prevents many from reaching top positions. Maternity leave and childcare facilities are often inadequate, forcing many women to leave their jobs.

Lack of Access to Sanitation: Many women in rural and urban areas struggle with inadequate access to clean and safe public toilets, which affects their health and dignity.

Cultural and Social Restrictions: Societal norms often restrict women's mobility, clothing choices, and participation in public life. For example, women may be discouraged from traveling alone or working late hours.

Economic Exploitation: Women in informal sectors, such as domestic work, agriculture, and construction, often face low wages, long hours, and lack of legal protections.

Cyber Harassment: With the rise of technology, women increasingly face online harassment, including cyberbullying, doxing, and revenge porn.

Discrimination in Education and Sports: Girls are often discouraged from pursuing higher education or participating in sports, limiting their opportunities for growth and empowerment.

Train Travel for Women – Challenges & Issues
Traveling by train in India can be a challenging experience for women due to a combination of safety concerns, infrastructure issues, and societal attitudes. Below are some of the key problems faced by women while traveling

in trains in India:



1. **Safety and Security Concerns**

Harassment and Eve-Teasing: Women often face verbal harassment, catcalling, and unwanted attention from male passengers, especially in general compartments.

Physical Assault: Incidents of groping, touching, and even sexual assault are reported, particularly in crowded trains. Also, they are susceptible to injuries due to snatching of jewelries, valuables, handbags & purses etc.

Lack of Police Presence: Insufficient security personnel, especially female officers, makes it difficult to address safety concerns promptly.

Insufficient Lighting: Sometimes, dimly-lit coaches and stations, especially at night, increase the risk of harassment and theft.

2. **Inadequate Facilities for Women**

Lack of Clean Toilets: Dirty and poorly maintained toilets in trains are a major issue, particularly for women who need hygienic facilities.

Limited Women Coaches: While some trains have reserved coaches for women, these are often overcrowded, and not all trains provide this facility.

No Separate Queues: At stations, women often face difficulties due to the absence of separate queues or counters for ticket booking and boarding.

3. **Overcrowding and Lack of Privacy**

General Compartments: Women traveling in general compartments often face overcrowding, making it uncomfortable and unsafe.

Lack of Privacy: In sleeper and unreserved coaches, women may feel exposed due to the lack of privacy and the presence of male passengers.

4. **Long-Distance Travel Challenges**

Night Travel: Women traveling overnight often feel unsafe, especially in sleeper coaches where co-passengers may be strangers.

Luggage Safety: Managing luggage while traveling alone can be stressful, with the risk of theft or tampering.

Food and Water: Limited access to clean drinking water and hygienic food options can be a problem, especially for

the infants & small children, during long journeys.

5. **Delay in Emergency Support**

Delayed Response: In case of emergencies, such as harassment or medical issues, the response is often slow and not in real-time.

No Panic



Buttons: Most trains lack panic buttons or emergency alarms in women's coaches, making it difficult to seek immediate help.

6. **Cultural and Societal Issues**

Judgmental Attitudes: Women traveling alone or at night are often subjected to judgmental stares and unsolicited comments from fellow passengers.

Lack of Awareness: Many women are unaware of their rights or the mechanisms available to report harassment or seek help.

7. **Insecurity While Traveling Alone:**

Social Conditioning for Solo Travel: In countries like India, women are often advised not to travel alone, and this mentality makes them feel uncomfortable about traveling. Many women prefer to travel with family instead of traveling alone because it is considered "safer" in society.

Hesitation to Ask for Help: When women travel alone and face difficulties (such as getting lost or getting stuck in an emergency), they may hesitate to ask for help because they often feel insecure or are suspicious of the intentions of the person offering assistance.

8. **Physical Problems During Travel: Menstrual-related Issues:** While traveling, women may face discomfort during menstruation, especially if the journey is

long or if there are no clean facilities available along the way.

Health Problems: During travel, especially on long journeys, women may face exhaustion, dehydration, or other physical issues, and the lack of appropriate medical assistance can be an additional challenge in

such situations.

9. **Limited Access to Locations and Resources: Lack of Women-friendly Travel Options:** In many places, women face a lack of safe and women-friendly travel options. For example, there may be a lack of special vehicles or spaces for female travellers or a shortage of transportation that prioritizes their safety.

Social and Cultural Barriers: During travel, women may face social and cultural restrictions. For instance, women may be restricted from entering certain religious sites or may be required to wear specific types of clothing at certain locations during their travels.

Initiatives by RPF for a Safe Journey for Women Travellers on Trains (Figures – Year 2024)

The **Railway Protection Force (RPF)** conducts several operations and initiatives to ensure the safety and security of women passengers traveling by train in India. Some of the key operations specifically aimed at protecting women include:

1. **Meri Saheli Initiative**
Started in 2020 to provide safety to lone or vulnerable women travellers.

RPF personnel interact with female passengers, give safety tips, and keep a close watch throughout their journey.

Women traveling alone are identified at the

station and checked on periodically during the journey.

2. **Shakti, Durga & Devi Squads**

Special women-led teams patrolling railway premises to prevent crimes against women.

These squads handle cases of harassment, stalking, and eve-teasing.

3. **Operation Nanhe Farishte**

Though primarily aimed at rescuing missing and trafficked children, it also protects young girls from trafficking networks operating in trains and stations.

Helps rescue runaway or abandoned girls who are at risk of exploitation.

4. **Nirbhaya Fund Projects**

The **Nirbhaya Fund** (by the Indian government) is used for installing CCTV cameras, panic buttons, and improving helpline services in trains and railway stations.

9. **Operation Jeevan Raksha**

The **Railway Protection Force (RPF)** has initiated **Operation Jeevan Raksha** to enhance passenger safety across India's railway network. This operation focuses on preventing accidents during boarding and deboarding, particularly those involving passengers slipping between the platform and train. RPF personnel are trained to respond swiftly to such incidents, often risking their own lives to save others. For instance, in January 2025, RPF staff saved a passenger who lost balance while boarding a moving train. In January 2024 alone, RPF's vigilant actions under this operation saved the lives of 3384 passengers. These efforts underscore RPF's commitment to ensuring passenger safety and preventing tragic accidents on railway premises.

10. **Operation Mahila Suraksha**

Mission Mahila Suraksha is an initiative launched by the **Railway Protection Force (RPF)** of Indian Railways to ensure the safety and security of women passengers during their train journeys. The **Railway Protection Force (RPF)** in India has launched specific operations to curb unauthorized entry into reserved coaches for women passengers. These operations are aimed at ensuring the safety and comfort of women traveling by train, especially in reserved compartments such as the **Ladies Coaches** and **Reserved Women Coaches**.

11. **Operation Dignity**
The **Railway Protection Force (RPF)** has initiated **Operation Dignity** to assist individuals in distress within railway premises, focusing on the elderly, destitute, and those requiring care and protection. RPF personnel identify such individuals and collaborate with NGOs and rehabilitation centers to provide necessary support and shelter. For instance, in 2024, the RPF

ensured the implementation of these safety measures.

5. **Anti-Human Trafficking Units (AHTUs)**

RPF conducts surprise checks in trains to identify trafficking victims, especially women and children. Works with NGOs and local police to rescue victims and arrest traffickers.

Rainfall occurred at one or two places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, and dry weather prevailed in Rayalaseema during the last 24 hours. 10 missing Indian construction workers rescued in Israel

Tel Aviv/New Delhi, Mar 7 (UNI) Ten missing Indian construction workers were rescued after being trapped in the Palestinian Authority of al-Zaayem for a month.

Israel's Population and Immigration Authority announced that the 10 Indian workers were rescued on Wednesday night.

The workers had been lured to the al-Zaayem town with promises of work.

However, upon their arrival, their passports were stolen. The thieves sought to use the stolen passports to enter Israel. And without their passports, the workers could not return to Israel, an Israeli website reported.

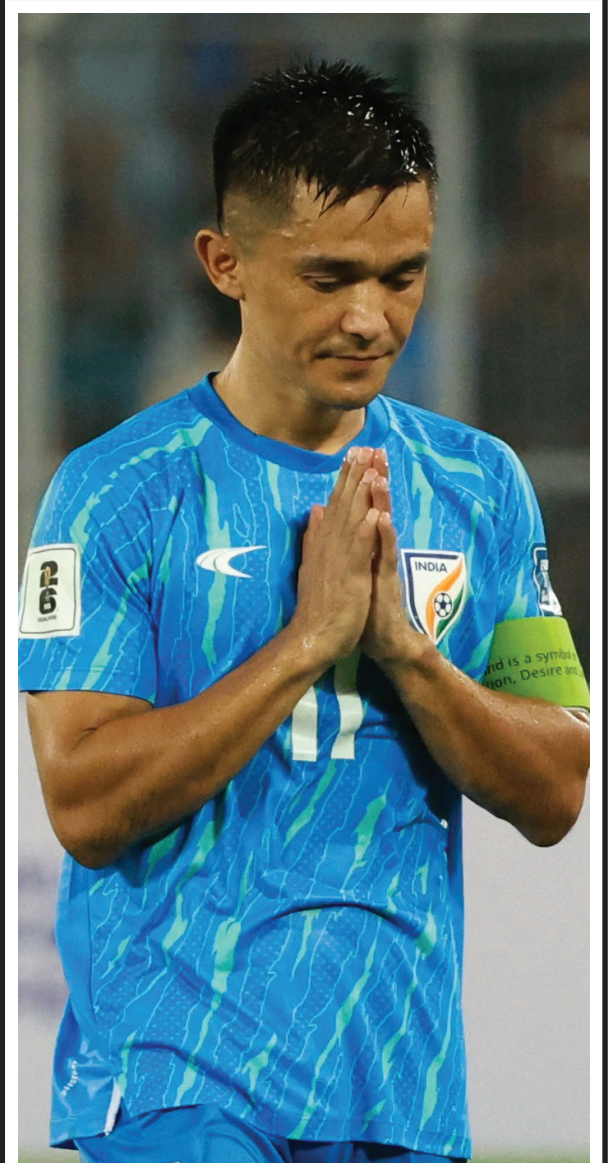
The workers were trapped for about a month before their rescue. The IDF had previously identified the fraudulent use of the stolen passports and returned them to their rightful owners.

Following the rescue, the workers were moved to a safe location. The Indian Embassy said on X that the matter is under investigation. "Israeli authorities traced 10 missing Indian construction workers to West Bank & have brought them back to Israel.

"While the matter is still under investigation, the Embassy is in touch with the Israeli authorities & have requested to ensure their safety & well-being."

Earlier this month, a 47-year-old man from Kerala was shot dead at the Israel-Jordan border while attempting to enter Israel illegally on February 10. He had come to Jordan on a three-month tourist visa.

The Indian national, identified as Ani Thomas Gabriel, was from Thiruvananthapuram's Thumba. He died of a bullet wound to the head, according to reports.



Sunil Chhetri returns to international football

In a major boost for Indian football, Sunil Chhetri has announced his return to international football, less than a year after bidding farewell to the national team. The decision comes at a crucial time as India prepares for key international fixtures, including the AFC Asian Cup 2027 qualifiers. Chhetri, 40, had initially retired from international football on June 6, 2024, following a goalless draw against Kuwait in a FIFA World Cup qualifier at Kolkata's Salt Lake Stadium.

Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences, Kolkata, an autonomous institute under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), have found an efficient, less energy-intensive, and environmentally friendly way to synthesise hydrogen peroxide -- a chemical that is crucial to the industry for disinfection, paper bleaching.

Hydrogen peroxide (H₂O₂) is a versatile oxidising agent that is widely used in environmental disinfection, chemical synthesis, paper bleaching, and fuel cells.

The team designed and prepared a series of covalent organic frameworks (COFs) having good water affinity through careful control of the hydrazone linkage density and studied their effect on the photocatalytic performance for H₂O₂ generation. COFs are a new class of porous and ordered polymers with modifiable catalytic sites and light-harvesting properties in the visible range. It has emerged as a promising photocatalysts.

Currently, the growth in the H₂O₂ market is driven by the increasing awareness of disinfection, the rise in the number of surgeries, and the prevalence of hospital-acquired infections. More than 95 per cent of H₂O₂ is produced industrially using the anthraquinone oxidation process -- which is very energy intensive, expensive, and produces many hazardous chemicals as by-products.

Scientists have therefore been looking for an environmentally friendly and economical strategy to produce H₂O₂ from renewable resources with minimal environmental impact.

The study observed that the hydrazone-linked COFs provide abundant docking sites for water and oxygen, thereby promoting water oxidation reaction (WOR) and oxygen reduction reaction (ORR) - two main pathways for photocatalytic H₂O₂ generation.

As a result, the hydrazone-linked COF exhibited exceptional photocatalytic H₂O₂ production without external sacrificial electron donors when irradiated with a 40 W blue LED.

Interestingly, "a significant amount of H₂O₂ was also produced under sunlight irradiation, which outperforms most organic photocatalysts under similar conditions, thus demonstrating a clean and sustainable pathway," said the team.

They showed that as-synthesized hydrazone-linked COFs can generate a significant amount of H₂O₂ using an aqueous benzyl alcohol solution (water: benzyl alcohol = 90:10).

The method also prevented the degradation of H₂O₂. The "strategy of using a mixture of water-benzyl alcohol solution will be helpful in developing a continuous flow reactor for the sustainable production of H₂O₂ and will reveal a laboratory-to-industry technology transfer for the benefit of mankind," noted the researchers.

CID arrests another accused in Rs 95 cr GBR Crypto fraud case

Hyderabad, Mar 7 (UNI) : The Telangana Crime Investigation Department (CID) has arrested another accused in connection with the Rs 95 crore GBR cryptocurrency fraud case.

The accused, identified as Yeruva Sleeva Ravi Kumar Reddy, a resident of Chennai, Tamil Nadu, was taken into custody on March 6 and has been sent to judicial remand.

The case revolves around Kurrimela Ramesh Goud, the prime accused, who—along with his associates—allegedly created a fake website under the name GBR and lured innocent investors through a WhatsApp group, promising high returns on cryptocurrency investments.

A total of 44 victims, including complainant Arra Manoj Kumar from Karimnagar, transferred approximately Rs 95 crore to the accused and his family members.

However, the investors were never repaid, leading to a case being registered under sections 420, 120-B IPC, the Telangana Protection of Depositors and Financial Establishment Act-1999, and the Prize Chits and Money Circulation Scheme (Banning) Act-1978.

The prime accused, Kurrimela Ramesh Goud, was arrested earlier, and the investigation continues to gather further evidence and apprehend other suspects.

The probe is being conducted by DSP A. Sudhakar (EOW, Telangana CID) and his team under the direction of Shikha Goel, IPS, Director General of Police, CID, Telangana, according to a statement here on Friday.

employees. The move places an additional Rs. 3.6 crore burden on RTC every month.

In addition to the DA hike, the government also decided to clear long-pending DA arrears. The decision comes after RTC employees recently issued strike notices, demanding better pay and working conditions. Among the 22 demands submitted by the

workers, the DA hike was a key concern. With the latest announcement, the government hopes to address their grievances.

Minister Prabhakar directed RTC management to ensure immediate disbursement of the increased DA. Employee unions have long been pushing for this demand, citing financial difficulties faced by RTC workers due to stagnant

salaries. The decision has been welcomed by employees, who expressed relief and satisfaction at the government's response.

In another key initiative, the Telangana government is set to launch Indira Mahila Shakti buses on March 8, marking International Women's Day. In the first phase, 150 buses will be introduced on a rental

basis through Mandal Mahila Samaiya Sanghas. An agreement has been reached to expand the fleet to 600 buses in subsequent phases. Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy will formally launch the initiative on Saturday. The project aims to empower women and enhance safe public transport options across the state.

BJP condemns Govt over salary cuts for sanitation workers

Hyderabad, Mar 7 (UNI) : Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, on Friday strongly criticised the Telangana government's approach towards outsourcing sanitation workers in municipalities, calling it highly unjust.

In a statement issued here on Friday, Sanjay emphasised the crucial role sanitation workers play in maintaining urban cleanliness. He praised their dedicated service, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic, and expressed disappointment that despite repeated appeals for wage hikes, their demands have been ignored.

Instead of increasing wages, the government has issued orders reducing the salaries of municipal drivers and work inspectors, a move that Sanjay condemned as deeply unfair. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has strongly opposed this decision. Given the rising cost of essential commodities and living expenses, salary hikes are a standard practice. However, instead of ensuring better pay, the state government has imposed drastic salary cuts,

which Sanjay described as highly unjustifiable.

Until now, sanitary inspectors were receiving a monthly salary of Rs 22,000, which has now been reduced to Rs 16,600. Similarly, municipal drivers have also faced salary reductions. Sanjay questioned the rationale behind these pay cuts, calling them unfair and detrimental to workers' well-being.

Across the state, 30,955 outsourcing staff are currently working in municipalities. On June 11, 2021, an order was issued to increase the salaries of all contract and outsourcing employees by 30 per cent.

However, in the past four years, there has been no further increase. Instead, the Congress government has imposed salary cuts of over 25 per cent on nearly 3,000 sanitary inspectors and drivers, a move Sanjay described as irrational. He pointed out that the Congress party had promised to increase the salaries of outsourcing and contract employees upon coming to power but is now acting contrary to its commitment.

Additionally, Sanjay

noted that five pending Dearness Allowances (DAs) for state government employees and teachers have not been disbursed. He also accused the government of preventing employees from withdrawing their savings from the General Provident Fund (GPF) and delaying the disbursement of retirement benefits, causing undue hardship to retired employees.

Despite the clear message from the recent MLC elections, the Congress government has not altered its stance. The drastic salary cuts for outsourcing sanitary inspectors and municipal drivers, Sanjay argued, reflect the Congress party's disregard for employees, contract workers, and outsourcing staff. He warned that the people of Telangana are taking note of these actions.

The BJP has demanded that the state government immediately rectify this decision, restore the salaries of municipal drivers and sanitation work inspectors, and implement wage hikes for all outsourcing and contract employees working in municipalities across the state.

Women investors surge 20 pc YoY in Indian crypto market

Hyderabad, Mar 7 (UNI) : Women investors have entered the Indian crypto market at an unprecedented pace, and participation surged 20 per cent year-on-year (January 2024 to January 2025), according to a report released by Giottus, a leading crypto exchange in the country.

Women now contribute to 15 per cent of the total trading volume, according to Giottus' latest analysis.

Women investors are seen to be favouring long-term investments and stable assets such as Bitcoin and Ethereum.

This signifies more than just increased representation—it is also indicative of a balanced, cautious investment approach in a traditionally volatile market, the report revealed.

This surge is driven by increased financial literacy, digital awareness, and the perception of crypto as a viable investment avenue.

Contrary to the perception of crypto as primarily youth-driven, the analysis notes the dominant role of those in the 36-50 age group. This segment contributes 32 per cent of total traders.

This demographic, characterised by higher disposable incomes and mature investment outlooks, complements the cautious trading style often adopted by women investors.

Women from smaller cities are also contributing to India's shifting crypto dynamics.

Women from tier-2 and tier-3 cities account for a major chunk of trading volumes, the report added.

Giottus anticipates the trend of rising female participation to continue.

DRI arrests two foreigners for gold smuggling at Mumbai airport

Mumbai, Mar 7 (UNI) : The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) Mumbai has arrested two foreigners for allegedly trying to smuggle foreign-origin gold worth nearly Rs 19 crore into India, officials said here on Friday.

New Zealand pacer Matt Henry faces a race against time to be fit for Champions Trophy final

Dubai, Mar 7 (UNI) : New Zealand's front-line pacer, Matt Henry, faces a challenge to be fit for the Champions Trophy final due to a shoulder injury sustained during the semi-final against South Africa in Lahore. Henry, who is currently the tournament's leading wicket-taker, injured his shoulder while taking a catch to dismiss Heinrich Klaasen at the boundary.

Despite the injury, he returned to bowl two overs later in the match after treatment and was also seen diving in the field after his comeback, sparking optimism on the extent of the injury. However, concerns over his fitness have emerged as the final approaches. While skipper Mitchell Santner remained

confident about Henry's availability immediately following the match on Wednesday, New Zealand head coach Gary Stead provided a more cautious update, revealing that Henry's fitness was still uncertain with less than 48 hours remaining before the final, an ICC report said.

"The positive is that he (Henry) managed to get back out there and bowl," Stead said.

"We've had some scans done, and we'll give him every chance to play in the final. However, at this stage, it's still a bit unclear," he said.

"He's obviously quite sore from landing on the point of his shoulder. Hopefully, he will be okay," Stead said. With 10 wickets

at an average of 16.70 across 4 innings in the tournament, Henry has embraced his role as a front-line pacer for New Zealand, including a five-wicket haul in the group-stage match against India in Dubai.

Should Henry be ruled out of the final, New Zealand have a ready replacement in right-arm seamer Jacob Duffy, who is part of the squad. Though Duffy has not featured in any of New Zealand's four matches so far in the tournament, he did play in the pre-tournament tri-series against Pakistan, where he claimed 1/48 in his seven overs. New Zealand will face India in the Champions Trophy final in Dubai on March 9, their first CT final since 2009.

Two Ugandan female players qualify for ITTF World Table Tennis Championship

Kampala, Mar 7 (UNI) The Uganda Table Tennis Association (UTTA) has announced that two female players have qualified to play in the ITTF World Table Tennis Championship 2025 slated for May 17-25 in Doha, Qatar. Robert Jjagwe, President of the Association said on Friday that Jemimah Nakawala and Parvin Judith Nangonzi will be among the few African players featuring in the world event in Doha.

He made it clear that Nakawala qualified through the world ranking basis in doubles and Nangozi the women's singles.

"Due to the good support we gave our players to participate in several events last year, we have been able to qualify again for the prestigious World Table Tennis Championship," Jjagwe said. The UTTA president said the qualification of the two players further cements Uganda's steady rise back into International Table Tennis stardom and participation. "We last played in the World Table Tennis Championship 12 years ago," added Jjagwe.

Uganda's duo will rub shoulders with some of the top world players like China's Wang Yidi and Sun Yingsha, Satsuki Odo (Japan), Ayhika Mukherjee (India) and Orawang Paranang (India) among others. The ITTF World Table Tennis Championship will take place at the Lusail Sports Arena which will have the men and women's singles and doubles, and the mixed doubles.

Raducanu stalking incident not a security failure

London, Mar 7 (UNI) : Emma Raducanu's experience of a stalker in Dubai should not be considered a security failure, says the chief executive of the Women's Tennis Association.

The Briton was left in tears after seeing a man who had followed her to four successive tournaments in the stands during her match against Karolina Muchova in February, the BBC reported. The man, who was removed from the stands and later given a restraining order by Dubai police, had given Raducanu a letter and asked for a photo in a coffee shop the previous day.

The 22-year-old told BBC Sport she believes the incident could have been dealt with better, although her anxiety about the

individual was not relayed to the WTA until the following day.

Portia Archer, who became the new WTA chief executive in June, described it as a "very unfortunate series of events". "The WTA has invested a great deal of resources into the safety and wellbeing of our players and it's a priority for the organisation," Archer told BBC Sport.

"I wouldn't call it a security failure at all. As soon as we became aware of the threat, we acted immediately. But we will look at ways to improve."

A number of players have spoken about the abuse they receive online, with Sloane Stephens saying she received more than 2,000 abusive messages after her US

Open loss in 2021. Stephanie Hilborne, the chief executive of the Women in Sport charity, spoke last month of the "need to stop inadvertently overexposing elite female athletes." Archer believes athletes should be free to share whatever they like on social media and not feel restricted by the risk of a "bad actor taking advantage of that".

"I think we delve into the wrong territory by somehow blaming it on an athlete for sharing information about themselves," Archer said.

"Players can use their judgement and decide how - and how much of themselves - they want to express. Doing so shouldn't be the reason that any sort of bad actor decides to take advantage of that."

Yuva All Stars Championship: Yuva Mumbai, Jaipur Pink Cubs & Yuva Yoddhas secure big wins

Haridwar (Uttarakhand), Mar 7 (UNI) : The Yuva All Stars Championship continued at the Vandana Kataria Indoor Stadium on Friday with high-scoring one-sided affairs. Sunil Chhetri returns to international football

New Delhi, Mar 7 (UNI) In a major boost for Indian football, Sunil Chhetri has announced his return to international football, less than a year after bidding farewell to the national team.

The decision comes at a crucial time as India prepares for key international fixtures, including the AFC Asian Cup 2027 qualifiers.

Chhetri, 40, had initially retired from international football on June 6, 2024, following a goalless draw against Kuwait in a FIFA World Cup qualifier at Kolkata's Salt Lake Stadium. His departure marked the end of an illustrious international career, during which he became India's all-time leading goal scorer and most-capped player, with 94 goals in 151 appearances.

Despite stepping away from international duty, Chhetri remained in peak form with Bengaluru FC in the Indian Super League (ISL), where he scored 12 goals and provided two assists in the ongoing season. His stellar performances caught the attention of national team head coach Manolo Marquez, who persuaded him to reconsider his retirement in light of the challenges ahead.

"The qualification for the Asian Cup is very crucial for us. Given the importance of the tournament and the matches ahead, I discussed with Sunil Chhetri about making a comeback to strengthen the national team. He agreed, and so we have included him in the squad," Marquez stated.

The All India Football Federation (AIFF) confirmed Chhetri's return on March 6, announcing his inclusion in the 26-member squad for the upcoming FIFA International Window. India is set to face the Maldives in a friendly match on March 19, followed by a crucial AFC Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2027 Qualifiers Final Round match against Bangladesh on March 25 at Shillong's Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium. Chhetri's return is expected to provide a significant morale boost to the squad, with fans and teammates welcoming the comeback of the 'captain, leader, legend.' As India pushes for a spot in the AFC Asian Cup 2027, his experience and leadership could prove invaluable on the international stage.

MBSG have kept five consecutive clean sheets at home and a sixth

consecutive one will see them become the first team to scale that peak in a single season. The Gaurs are on a five-game-long winning streak, marking it to be a game of two incredibly in-form teams.

Mohun Bagan Super Giant have scored three or more goals in nine of their 23 league games this season. If they score at least three goals in this fixture, they will join FC Goa (2019-20) and Mumbai City FC (2022-23) as the only teams to achieve this milestone 10 times in a single season.

MBSG have made 137 shots on target in ISL 2024-25, the highest among all teams, and 22 more than FC Goa (115). Liston Colaco (31), Jamie Maclaren (19), and Manvir Singh (16) have

taken the most on-target attempts amongst the Mohun Bagan Super Giant squad this season.

FC Goa have conceded six goals via spot-kicks this season, the most by any team. Only Odisha FC (2019-20) and FC Goa (2022-23) have conceded more penalties in a single ISL season (seven each).

The Gaurs have kept the third-most clean sheets (8) in the competition, including three on the bounce coming into this encounter.

The two teams have played nine matches against each other, with FC Goa winning thrice and Mohun Bagan Super Giant emerging victorious five times. Only one match has produced a draw.

High level meeting was held headed by Minister of railways Ashwini Vaisnaw



(Standard Post Bureau) New Delhi, March 7 : Today a high level meeting was held headed by Minister of railways Shri Ashwini Vaisnaw on crowd control at stations. Following decision has been taken.

1. Permanent outside waiting areas at 60 stations:

During the festival season of 2024, waiting areas were created outside stations. These waiting areas were able to hold large crowds at Surat Udhna, Patna and New Delhi. Passengers were allowed only when the train came to the platform.

Similar arrangements were made during Mahakumbh at nine stations of Prayag area.

Based on the experience of these stations, we have decided to create permanent waiting areas outside stations at 60 stations across the country which periodically face heavy crowds.

Pilot projects have started at New Delhi, Anand Vihar, Varanasi, Ayodhya, and Patna stations.

With this concept, the

sudden crowd will be contained within the waiting area. Passengers will be allowed to go to platforms only when the trains arrive at the platform. This will decongest the stations.

2. Access control:

Complete access control will be initiated at the 60 stations.

Passengers with confirmed reserve tickets will be given direct access to the platforms.

Passengers without a ticket or with a waiting list ticket will wait in the outside waiting area.

All unauthorised entry points will be sealed.

3. Wider foot-over-bridges (FOB):

Two new designs of 12 metre wide (40 feet) and 6 metre wide (20 feet) standard FOB have been developed. These wide FOBs with ramps were very effective in crowd management during Mahakumbh. These new standard wide FOBs will be installed in all the stations.

4. Cameras:

Cameras helped crowd management in a big way

during Mahakumbh. A large number of cameras will be installed in all stations and adjoining areas for close monitoring.

5. War rooms:

War rooms at large stations will be developed. Officers of all departments will work in the war room during crowd situations.

6. New generation communication equipment:

Latest design digital communication equipment like walkie-talkies, announcement systems, calling systems will be installed on all heavy crowd stations.

7. New design ID card:

All staff and service persons will be given a new design ID card so that only authorised persons can enter the station.

8. New design uniform for staff:

All staff members will be given new design uniforms so that they can be easily identified during a crisis situation.

9. Upgradation of station director post:

All major stations will have a senior officer as station director. All other departments will report to the station director.

Station director will get financial empowerment so that he can take on-the-spot decisions for improving the station.

10. Sale of tickets as per capacity:

Station Director will be empowered to control the sale of tickets as per capacity of the station and the available trains.

Local for CSMT (N-16) scheduled to leave Kasara at 11.10 hrs on 08.03.2025(Saturday) & 09.3.2025(Sunday) will short originate from Asangaon. "Local for CSMT (N-26) scheduled to leave Kasara at 16.16 hrs on 09.3.2025(Sunday) will short originate from Kalyan.
